BUDGET PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES City Council of the City of Bath, Maine Wednesday, May 22, 2000 5:30 PM Dike-Newell School

Present: Councilors Banks, James, Blake, Wyman, Hayden, Tibbetts, Rogers, Reed and Chairman Hall

Chairman Hall called the meeting to order at 5:30PM.

I. <u>PUBLIC HEARING - City of Bath 2001-2002 Combined Budget</u>

Thomas MacDonald, Chairman of the Board of Education began the Hearing by giving an overview of the School Budget. Mr. MacDonald stated that the school budget would be up 5.9%, which is equivalent to \$825,000. He listed the following reasons for this increase:

- Middle School Interest
- Salaries/Benefits Increase
- New programs such as All Day Kindergarten and broadening of the Foreign Language Offerings

The following people spoke in favor of the School Budget: Ann London, parent; Nancy Smith, PTA President, parent and school secretary; Joanna Bragdon, School Board Member; William Torrey, III, School Board Member.

John Bubier, City Manager, then presented an overview of the City Budget. He stated that the budget was increased by 1.8% this year. Mr. Bubier cited the following reasons for the increase:

- County Tax
- Increase in Health Insurance
- Improvements for reuse of the Old YMCA
- Mandatory Landfill Testing

He said the tax rate would increase to \$22.30/\$1,000, which would result in a \$130.00 increase per average household in taxes.

The following people spoke regarding the budget:

Marie Hammond asked for clarification of public input on the budget and of the status of financing of the landfill testing and closing.

William Torrey, III stated that he felt a \$130.00 increase per average household over the past 5 years was within reason and he supported the budget.

Chairman Hall closed the Public Hearing at 6:30PM.
