## Item F5 - ORDINANCE: Electric Service Contract with AES NewEnergy, Inc. (first passage) #327

#### **ORDINANCE**

WHEREAS, the City of Bath has the opportunity to renew its Energy Service Agreement with AES NewEnergy, Inc. for electrical power for City needs for a period of nineteen (19) months, and WHEREAS, the City has an opportunity to enter into a Similar Agreement for the Customs House property for a twenty-one (21) month period, and

WHEREAS, the proposed Agreements are Contracts that exceed one (1) year in duration and involve the expenditure of funds, and

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Bath requires that each such Agreement be approved by Ordinance by this Council pursuant to Section 1102 of the Charter, and

WHEREAS, the ability to determine on a certain basis for this period of time, the actual costs for

generation of electrical power to be utilized by the City, is of benefit to the City,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Bath that the proposed Agreements by and between the City and AES NewEnergy, Inc. be and hereby are approved and the City Manager is authorized to execute the Contracts on behalf of the City of Bath.

Motion by Councilor Reed, second by Councilor James to put this Ordinance on the floor for discussion.

Greg L'Heureux, Finance Director, gave an overview for the reasons this agreement would be financially advantageous to the City at this time.
