BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BATH, MAINE, that the County Budget Component for the fiscal year commencing on July 1, 2004 and terminating on June 30, 2005 be and hereby is adopted with a total expenditure of **\$1,188,332.00**, balanced with an equal amount of estimated revenue.

II. Order: Induce Future MCHE Debt/Declaration of Official Intent #0236 Councilor Mitchell made a motion to put this Order on the floor for discussion, which was seconded by Councilor Wyman.

INDUCEMENT ORDER OF THE CITY OF BATH, MAINE DECLARING ITS OFFICIAL INTENT WITH RESPECT TO THE RENOV A TIONS AND IMPROVEMENT TO THE MIDCOAST CENTER FOR HIGHER LEARNING PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the City of Bath, is the owner of property designated as the Midcoast Center for Higher Learning Property, and consists of all of the premises conveyed to the City of Bath by Mid Coast Hospital: and

WHEREAS, the Midcoast Center for Higher Learning is a Maine non-profit corporation, duly organized and existing under the provisions of Title 13- B of the Maine Revised Statutes and is the entity designated by the City of Bath to operate the property and facility; and

WHEREAS, there is ongoing need to continue renovations to the property and make improvements to the property: and

WHEREAS, the City of Bath intends to fmance some or all of the costs of the renovations and improvements, together with all ancillary costs including, but not limited to, engineering, architectural, design, legal, and permitting costs; and

WHEREAS, certain of these costs and expenses may be paid by the City of Bath prior to the issuance of bond fmancing as authorized under Title 30-A of the Maine Revised Statutes and in the Bath City Charter, Chapter VITI; and

WHEREAS, the City desires, in the event that prior costs are incurred and the Bonds are, in fact, issued, that a portion of the Bond proceeds will be applied to reimburse the City for such prior costs; and

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulation § 1.150-2 requires that the Issuer of the Bonds, the City of Bath, adopt a Declaration of Official Intent to reimburse expenditures with proceeds of the Bonds:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BATH, MAINE:

- 1. That the Project as proposed is in the public interest and will further the economic well-being of the City of Bath, will enhance the rentability of the building and the availability of the public education and medical services offered by tenants in the building as well as associated services provided by other tenants, and will also serve to preserve and enhance the building asset.
- 2. That the City of Bath, acting through its City Council, evidences its present intent to issue general obligation Bonds in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) upon such terms and conditions as may be determined, and the proceeds of which shall be used to fmance a portion of the Project costs through either direct use by the City of Bath or through the Midcoast Center for Higher Learning corporation.
- 3. That the City of Bath reasonably expects to reimburse its expenditures made on the Project with the proceeds of the Bonds, if issued, said Bonds to be issued in the maximum aggregate principal amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000).
