C. Public Hearings: 6:14 PM

1) CDBG Gagne Foods, Inc.

Chairman Wyman opened the Public Hearing.

Al Smith, CDBG Coordinator, explained to Council the need for this grant application on behalf of AMS, LLC dba Gagne Foods of Bath. Mr. Smith stated this grant would help Gagne Foods implement a marketing plan and to enable them to hire 3 more employees.

Michael Gagne, President and Owner of the company, spoke to Council regarding the company's plan to continue the employment of the "private label manager" who helps to attract business from national stores such as Hannaford to sell the product under the store's brand. Mr. Gagne stated the other two jobs to be created would be for a maintenance person and a food service sales person. These additions would help bring \$10,000,000 worth of sales to the company's bottom line.

CITY OF BATH COUNCIL RESOLUTION STATE OF MAINE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Bath wishes to apply to the Department of Economic and Community Development for a Community Development Block Grant to carry out a community development program; and

WHEREAS, the planning process required by Maine Law and the CDBG Program have been complied with, including participation in the planning process by low and moderate income families and individuals and the community has conducted at least one duly advertised public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bath is cognizant of the requirement that should the intended National Objective of the CDBG program not be met all CDBG funds must be repaid to the State of Maine CDBG program; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the Community of Bath, Maine that the City Manager:

- 1) Is authorized and directed to submit an application for the following program and dollar amount(s) within the State of Maine's CDBG Program:
 - Program: <u>Economic Development Program</u> Amount: <u>\$90,000.00</u>
 To the Department of Economic and Community Development on behalf of the Community of Bath, substantially in the form presented to this council;
- 2) Is authorized to make assurances on behalf of the Community of Bath required as part of such applications, and
- 3) Is authorized and directed, upon acceptance of said funds to carry out the duties and responsibilities for implementing the said program, consistent with the Charter of the Community of the City of Bath and the laws and regulations governing planning and implementation of community development programs in the State of Maine.

The Harvest Plan (*Conditions and Regulations*) will be submitted by the Commission setting forth in detail the exact conditions under which alewives may be taken, all in accordance with good conservation practices. This plan will be submitted to the Department of Marine Resources by the Commission with City of Bath approval.

7) Order: Contract Washington Street Sidewalks

Chairman Wyman read the following Order:

ORDER APPROVING BID AND CONTRACT

BE IT HEREBY ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BATH, THAT THE BIDS OF PRATT & SONS, INC. FOR THE LOWER WASHINGTON STREET SIDEWALK PROJECT IN THE COMBINED AMOUNT OF \$704,977.00 (BASE BID OF \$553,887.00: ALTERNATE BID OF \$151,090.00) IS ACCEPTED, THEY BEING THE LOWEST QUALIFIED BIDS SUBMITTED, AND A CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF BATH AND PRATT & SONS, INC. IS HEREBY APPROVED AND THE MANAGER IS AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE THE CONTRACT AND ANY OTHER DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO ITS IMPLEMENTATION ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF BATH. THE PROJECT HAS BEEN FUNDED BY A STATE OF MAINE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT GRANT WITH THE LOCAL MATCH PROVIDED IN CITY OF BATH PUBLIC WORKS CAPITAL FUND ACCOUNT PW05639.

Motion by Councilor Pagurko, second by Councilor Omo to put this Order on the floor for discussion.

Peter Owen, Public Works Director, explained that this project had been in the works since 2004 but the bids were too expensive to go forward. Now with the decline in the economy the bids have come in at reasonable costs making it possible to complete the sidewalk on the water side of Washington Street by BIW, past the Plant Home and up Webber Ave to High Street.

8) Resolution: Purchase of Service Maine Public Employees Retirement System

RESOLUTION PURCHASE OF SERVICE MAINE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the City of Bath participates in the Maine Public Employees Retirement System and offers retirement benefits to its employees based on plans administered by the Retirement System; and

WHEREAS, certain City of Bath employees are currently enrolled in a Maine Public Employees Retirement System (Maine PERS) 401(a) Defined Contribution Plan; and

WHEREAS, it appears to be advantageous to both the City and the employees to enroll in the Maine PERS Standard Defined Benefits Plan; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to purchase past service for eligible employees making the transfer; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bath will no longer need to fund contributions to the 401(a) Defined Contribution Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Bath that the enrollment of eligible employees in the Maine PERS Standard Defined Benefits Plan be and hereby is approved, and the City's liability for purchase of past service of the enrolling employees be authorized to be transferred from the IUUAL Surplus Funds. And be it further resolved that the City Manager be hereby authorized to take such other and further action, and sign any and all required documentation. And be it further resolved that the enrolling employees will contribute the amount of their "457" rollover toward the liability.

Motion by Councilor Omo, second by Councilor Pagurko to table this item until after the Executive Session.
