Kevin met with Abby King, Jim Tassy to coordinate about upcoming legislation with regards to bike safety. Kevin also spoke to Linda Buler and hopes to meet with Jennifer Dechant.

The complete streets policy is complete and has been accepted by the city manager and is posted on the city web-site.
