Dear Friends of Bath,

I'm pleased to share that we have released the City's Annual Report for the 2018 fiscal year. You can review the report online by <u>Clicking Here</u>. Inside you will find individual reports from City departments and community partners, as well as the City's audit report. I hope you find the content engaging and useful.

With April on the way, the City is approaching the one-year anniversary of the <u>Bath Bag Ban Ordinance</u>. By avoiding single-use bags (either paper or plastic), we are cutting down on our environmental impact, reducing litter, and saving landfill space.

Reusable bags are available inexpensively at several local retailers. Have some fun with it: if you're a Red Sox fan, get a Red Sox bag. If you're a coffee lover, get a bag made from used coffee bean sacks. (Plus, if you don't take that single-use bag, you save yourself a trip to the recycling or trash bin.) Reusable bags handle everything from groceries to books, tools, candy, sweaters – any and all items sold in Bath.

What's the hardest part about going reusable? Remembering to take the bags into the store! So get them into the car. Put a note on the dashboard or tell your kids to remind you. Whatever it takes, shop

smart and go reusable.

Meet Susie Hunt

Every week Susie Hunt prepares paychecks for the City's 120 employees (150 in the summer months, with the addition of seasonal employees), but that isn't the only reason she's popular around the office.

"Susie is nice to everyone," said Finance Director Juli Millett. "When people come into the office, they always ask for her. Sometimes they'll even leave and come back if she's not here."

Susie began her job with the City of Bath seventeen years ago working in the Treasurer's Office at City Hall. In 2004, she switched offices to become Payroll Supervisor of the Finance Department.
