The Commission took some time to review accomplishments: Senior Survey of 2011, Informational Booth at Founders Day 2010 and 2011, holding regular meetings at both Ray House and Callahan House, establishing relationships with Summerfield Gardens and Resident Service Coordinators at Seymour Housing Authority, presenting informational sessions on Medicare at Senior Housing Sites, establishing relationship with Shady Knoll, facilitating appointment of a state mandated Municipal Agent for the Elderly; being conduits and contacts for seniors in the community; facilitation and implementation fa free newsletter -among others. All Commission members agree that the Senior Center is often the first contact for

seniors needing assistance and should be a clearinghouse for info. As such, focus will be on a Senior Center and programs and funding.
