# The Regular Meeting of the Seymour WPCA Board for August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2013 -6pm- at the Sewer Facility.

Members attending; Jon Livolsi, Stephen Chucta, Tom Kuzia, Annmarie Drugonis and Patrick Lombardi.

**Others present**: Carey Strout, plant manager Veolia Water, Jon Marro, Atty. Ramon Sous, Jim Galligan, P.E. and other members of the public.

Chairman Jon Livolsi called meeting to order at 6:00pm

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

**Approval of the July 8<sup>th</sup> 2013 minutes-Stephen Chucta** made a motion, Patrick Lombardi 2<sup>nd</sup>, to accept the July 8<sup>th</sup> 2013 minutes. Motion passed 3-0-2 abstentions (Annmarie Drugonis and Tom Kuzia as they were absent from that meeting.)

First Selectman's report- None.

**Veolia Water Report-** Carey Strout reported on a chlorine exceedance that occurred, and how a technical expert will be looking at the chlorine analyzer.

Maintenance- Breaker for plant water system has been replaced and monitoring has been installed for the 3-phase system. A recirculation mixer was found to be broken, this has been sent to be rebuilt with parts we had on the shelf. Bar Screen parts have been obtained- this will be repaired in 2 weeks.

Carey Strout reported on Titus pump station- parts of the ataphase are failing. These will be replaced once the parts come in. The phone line was repaired to the Franklin Street pump station.

A discussion was had over the implementation and enforcement of FOG regulations.

**Income Report**- Jon Marro submitted this to the board.

Finance Report- this was submitted to the board.

Invoices- The following invoices (see attached) were submitted for authorization for payment.

**Annmarie Drugonis** made a motion, Tom Kuzia 2<sup>nd</sup>, to approve the invoices for payment. Motion passed 5-0.

**Legal Report**- Atty. Ramon Sous reported on the Budget. Atty. Sous talked to Tony Caserta about the depreciation expense and how the WPCA has handled this in the past; i.e. Capital Improvement fund instead of depreciation expense. Doug Thomas is supposed to get in touch with Atty. Sous as to how to handle this issue.

FOG: Atty. Sous did research the Shelton FOG regulations and will be working with Jim Galligan on this.

**Engineering Report**- Jim Galligan reported on the Broad Street Sewer repair- Discussion ensued about the work done, how the work was done, and the amount of time the Chairman Livolsi spent at the site.

FOG- Jim Galligan presented the New Haven FOG regulations; Get a listing of recent Class II and IV eating establishment, Registration (yearly), and how the program is paid for. Jim Galligan reported that he hasn't completed a "penalty" part of enforcement regulations. Discussion ensued as to the amount of the fines/registration for FOG. For Next month Atty. Sous and Jim Galligan can come up with some recommendations on setting up a compliance program.

Jim Galligan reported that Nash Construction wished to have a meeting to discuss costs.

Jim Galligan reported that Jim Weed will resume clearing of some ROW that was uncompleted.

**Annmarie Drugonis** made a motion, Patrick Lombardi 2<sup>nd</sup>, to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed 5-0. Meeting ended at 6:50pm.

#### **OPERATIONS**

The Seymour WPCF was in compliance in all of the monitoring parameters through the month of July, 2013. Here is some relevant data.

Total Nitrogen in the influent: 270 pounds per day
Total Nitrogen in the effluent: 87 pounds per day
Percent Removal 67%
2013 Nitrogen Permit Monthly Limit is 62 pounds per day

Total Phosphorous in the influent: 4.11 mg/l Total Phosphorous in the effluent 3.61 mg/l Percent Removal 23% Ortho Phosphorous in the effluent: 3.63 mg/l Proposed Permit limit 0.70 mg/l

Average Flow 1.12 MGD

#### SIGNIFICANT MAINTENANCE ACTIVITY

Plant repair and maintenance items include the following:

- Replaced the breaker for the plant water pumps
- Calibrated the D.O. meter
- Installed phase monitoring in the chemical building
- Took the #1 Aeration Basin off line and sent the recirculation pump out for repair
- Calibrated the Chlorine Analyzer
- Cleaned the East Chlorine Contact tank and put it in Service
- Changed the shocks on the bar screen

- Checked all pump stations
- Responded to several call before you dig
- Found the #1 pump tripped at Titus pump Station began repairs on the Add a Phase
- AT&T repaired the phone line at Stop & Shop pump station
