The Regular Meeting of the Seymour WPCA Board for August 6th, 2012 -6pm- at the Sewer Facility.

Members attending; John Fanotto, Jon Livolsi, and Annmarie Drugonis

Members not present: Tom Kuzia and Stephen Chucta

Others present: Carey Strout, Veolia water plant manager, Jim Galligan, Atty. Ramon Sous and other members of the public.

John Fanotto called meeting to order at 6:00pm

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

John Fanotto made a motion, Jon Livolsi 2nd, to accept the July 9th, 2012 minutes. Motion passed 2-0. Annmarie Drugonis abstained.

First Selectman- no report.

Asbuilts- Jim Galligan is working on this, tabled until next month.

Veolia Water reports- Carey Strout reported on a chlorine exceedence due to ORP sensor failing due to power outage. This was repaired. Also the nitrogen numbers are doing extremely well with an average of 32 pounds. Phosphorous removal was achieved.

Chemical pump, service water pump and the starter for forklift are being repaired.

With the power outages, two boards have to be replaced for North main and Titus pump stations; this is to regulate the incoming electrical power. Carey Strout reported on the technical details of what was involved with the two pump stations.

Carey Strout then reported on the gap in the covering over the Kalarides Village Siphon. Also, in the cleaning of the Siphon- Carey Strout needs a vac truck to clean this siphon and other (Clairifer and the Board Street Siphon) projects; the board directed Carey Strout to get other prices for the vac truck service.

Carey Strout also reported on the Chatfield School needing an inspection for the sewer; Jim Galligan was notified about this.

Income Report- this was submitted to the board.

Finance Report- this was submitted to the board.

Legal Report- The board had a discussion about the release for 7 Stoddard.

Engineering report- Jim Galligan reported on the Asbuilts release- the statement will have the person who takes a map copy be cognizant that the WPCA is not liable for any omissions on the Asbuilts.

Brook Street- Jim Galligan reported that the sewer plans are done and the estimates are done. Discussion ensued about the paving estimates and whether or not the bonding for the sewer installation exists.

Kalarides siphon- Jim Galligan investigated the exposed sewer pipe, and reported on the condition of the pipe. Discussion ensued about how to fix the exposed pipe without machinery in the river. Jim Galligan reported that this is a serious and urgent issue. A repair would be estimated to cost 5 to 10 thousand dollars and take 3-5 days; Jim Galligan talked to Komar Construction and was directed to get a price (in writing) from Sadick & Rich.

Discussion then ensued about the urgency of the problem and the possible fines that would be levied if this sewer pipe broke. Discussion also ensued about where the easement is located and how best to repair the exposed pipe. The board decided that this should be taken care of as soon as it is possible.

Annmarie Drugonis made a motion, Jon Livolsi 2nd, to add invoices to the agenda. Motion passed 3-0.

Invoices – the following were submitted (see attached) to the board for payment authorization.

Jon Livolsi made a motion, Annmarie Drugonis 2nd, to pay the bills. Motion passed 3-0.

A letter from the Atty. for Ansonia WPCA asking about the Seymour WPCA collections policy was given to the board; Atty. Sous was directed to talk to them about our policy.

Annmarie Drugonis made a motion, Jon Livolsi 2nd, to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed 3-0. Meeting ended 6:30pm

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MONTHLY OPERATING REPORT SEYMOUR, CONNECTICUT JULY, 2012

OPERATIONS

The Seymour WPCF experienced a higher than permitted chlorine sample on July 9th due to a failure of the ORP meter. The sodium bisufite pump was placed in the hand position immediately and the meter repaired the same day. Three more samples were taken that day and they were all within the permit parameters. Here is some relevant data.

Total Nitrogen in the influent: 230 pounds per day Total Nitrogen in the effluent: 32 pounds per day Percent Removal 87% 2012 Nitrogen Permit Monthly Limit is 64 pounds per day

Total Phosphorous in the influent: 5.7 mg/l Total Phosphorous in the effluent 0.4 mg/l Percent Removal 93% Ortho Phosphorous in the effluent: 0.2 mg/l Proposed Permit limit 0.70 mg/l

Average Flow 0.68 MGD

SIGNIFICANT MAINTENANCE ACTIVITY

Plant repair and maintenance items include the following:

- Repaired the sodium bisulfite ORP meter
- Calibrated the D.O. meter
- Repaired the influent flow chart
- Sent the plant water pump to B&J for repair
- Sent the chemical sample pump to B&J for repair
- Sent the fork lift starter to Chippies for rebuild
- · Began cleaning out the green house
- Rebuilt to sodium bisulfite mixer

COLLECTION SYSTEM

- Checked all pump stations
- Replaced Battery and charger at North Main Pump Station
- Tower Generator Service to replace control board at Titus and North Main
- Klarides siphon pipe found exposed in the river
- Partially cleaned Klarides siphon
- Conducted preventive maintenance on all pump stations
- · Responded to several call before you dig
