Minutes of the Seymour WPCA- Regular Meeting- February 6th, 2017-At the Sewer Plant, 6pm.

Board Members Present; Jon Livolsi, Tom Kuzia, Annmarie Drugonis, and Nick Teodosio

Members not present; John Uhelsky.

Others Present; Walter Royals Veolia Water, Jim Galligan, P.E., Atty. Ramon Sous and other members of the public.

Jon Livolsi called the meeting to order at 6:02pm

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Approval of the January 9th, 2017 Minutes- Annmarie Drugonis made a motion, Tom Kuzia 2nd, to approve the minutes. Motion passed 5-0.

First Selectman- Annmarie Drugonis spoke about the 18% interest rate per the State of CT; Annmarie approached Nichole Kalarides (State Representative) about this. In the near future there will be a public hearing about a proposed bill that allows towns to possibly charge less than 18% interest.

Veolia Water reports-

Walter Royals reported that the sewer plant met its permit requirements for the month of January 2017.

Maintenance- the Service water pump is now fully installed, the Spencer blower is now fully installed, new wet well Mixer was installed and William Jarvis (electrician) was able to program the VFD #2. The dump truck is now fully functional with battery replaced and transmission repaired. Walter Royals reported on other maintenance efforts for the month of January. There was a lateral that was blocked on 136 West Street, and operators went to the site and found that the main line was unplugged.

Derby pump station (north) – a car lost control and landed on the shrubs in front of pump station. Walter Royals will be picking up the police report.

Income report- this was submitted to the board

Financial report- this was submitted to the board.

Invoices - the following (see attached) was submitted to the board for authorization of payment.

Annmarie Drugonis made a motion, Tom Kuzia 2nd, to pay the invoices. Motion passed 4-0.

Tom Kuzia made a motion, Annmarie Drugonis 2nd, to hold off paying for Tower Generator invoice until Walter Royals gets more information and at that time authorizes Jon Livolsi to sign off on them. Motion passed 4-0.

Legal report- Atty. Sous reported on the collection efforts and the letters sent out to the customers who owe money to the WPCA.

Engineering report- Jim Galligan reported on the 38 Columbus Av. Manhole- this particular manhole took over a week to construct/complete. Discussion ensued about the various issues with safety, equipment, permitting, and other technical aspects of the project.

The repair bill for the Dump truck was discussed.

Public Comment- none.

Adjournment of meeting- Annmarie Drugonis made motion, Tom Kuzia 2nd, to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed 4-0. Meeting ended at 6:50pm
