5. Elderly Services Manager Report: Lucy mentioned Lucy presented a prepared April 2018 Aging Commission Report (attached). The Taxes program was successful completing 106 applications. The new Community Services Spring Summer Program flyers were mailed to 6,000 Seymour households and it was felt that there has been an increase in enrollees as a result.

Mary reported that they are working to put in a walking path around the entire field that should be available by the summer months and will be open until dusk, daily. Haines is donating the materials needed. There will be ample parking and a Couch to 5K program will be offered. She is also pleased to announce that Grow your Own, Neighborhood Garden Program in collaboration with the Valley United Way. neighborhood community gardens to help food insecure residents obtain fresh fruit and vegetables to supplement what they are currently getting from the food pantries. The Program called "Grow Your Own" started three years ago and at that time consisted of plants, soil and tools provided to Valley residents in need for backyard and container gardening. This free program offers not only the resources to create a garden but also training on nutrition, cooking, and canning. The hope is that Valley residents will be able to preserve the fresh food year-round.

There are exercises classes offered daily. Chair Volley Ball Program utilizing a beach ball has been added as an afternoon activity and a "Let's Jam" new group of musicians has been formed and meets on Thursday s at 2:30 pm.

Seniors get priority for the trips; however the Radio City Music Hall and baseball games are open to the public. And the Woodbury Commons shopping trips are usual attended by mothers and their daughters in December.
