15) Chief's Requisitions- Discussion and approval

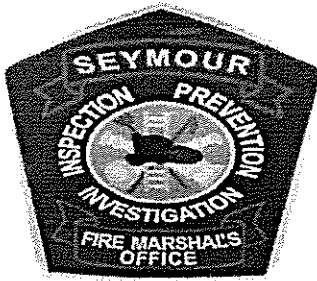
Todd Andrews/Dan Cooper made a motion to approve requisitions. Vote: 5/0
