

1. Mayor Vincent Festa Called the **Public Hearing On Proposed Resolution To Order at 6:30 p.m.** in the Assembly Room, Plymouth Town Hall **on Tuesday, May 6, 2008.**

Members in attendance: Councilwoman Jeannine Jandreau, Councilwoman DiAnna Schenkel, Councilwoman Jacqui Denski, Councilman Peter Ganesini, Mayor Vin Festa, Robin Gudeczauskas, Recording Secretary and Attorney Sal Vitrano, Town Attorney. Councilman Dave Sekorski was excused.

Fire Exits were noted.

Mayor Festa stated the purpose of the public hearing is to hear Public Comments on the Proposed Resolution (read into record) entitled “RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$385,000.00 FOR THE ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF A PREFABRICATED GARAGE AND ACQUISITION OF EQUIPMENT FOR THE WATER POLLUTION CONTROL AUTHORITY OF THE TOWN OF PLYMOUTH AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$385,000.00 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE”

Public Comment:

1. Melanie Church, 328 Main Street, stated her understanding is this is going to end up on debt service and if you check back into the minutes of Charter Revision when they made the change people will be voting; this is being done by a public hearing and the to vote. Mayor Festa noted this can come before the Town Council as WPCA is funding this through their fees as per new legislation they cannot go for bonding on their own. The issue is it has nothing to do with town taxes and why it is not going to referendum. It is the sole responsibility of Town Council to vote on the matter. Mrs. Church stated she still disagrees because it is on debt service and she checked with Dave Bertnagle. Mayor Festa stated it will be paid off by funds appropriated by WPCA and for clarification because appropriation is through WPCA funds there is no need to go forward through referendum to vote and has check with Bond Council. Mrs. Church stated the Charter reads anything bonded will be brought through referendum. Debt service was excluded because people vote on it.

Mayor Festa stated with no other public comments, this issue will be brought under an item at the Council meeting and voted at that time.
