Review of Proposed General Fund Budget for FY 2010-11 – Dave Bertnagel distributed and reviewed revenue projections; reviewed state budget stating they are hoping for economic recovery later this year. All ARRA funds (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act) and ECS for 11-12 will lose percentage of its' funding and next years' budget will be tighter than one currently working on. Grants off budget: Pilot, receive yearly but we cut back last year and next year it is reduced 7.8% (2010-2011). This year have a \$30,000 revenue surplus. Next year we also lose Iseli's. Next year projection recommends:

Manufacturers Pilot, \$90,000

Boat grant, \$3454 and this year we got only 10% which was \$340; next year the Governor will suspend program for 3 years

Outplacement Excess student cost, last year debate on covering expenditure, the state has not changed percentage but capped dollar amount; government is pro-rating this in the future and estimate it will go down 75% of what we are getting now. Money needs to be released by end of February. May be at \$400,000 for next year.

ECS will stay the same which is \$9,743,272

School transportation got cut by 10-11% and number should be \$367,966 for next year

PCS income will be \$420,000 for next year
