

Ocean View Police Department Monthly Report For the November 2015 Town Council Meeting

➤ Community Policing Initiatives:

- ✓ OVPD hosted a Halloween Party on October 24th from 5pm-8pm for local Special Olympic athletes and their families.
- ✓ The Inaugural Cops & Goblins event took place on Saturday, October 31st from 1-1pm in John West Park.
- ✓ In November 2015, OVPD will initiate a new program in conjunction with Special Olympics Delaware. *Champions on Tour of the Thin Blue Line* is a program partnership between Delaware Law Enforcement for Special Olympics and Special Olympics Delaware that provides interested adults with intellectual disabilities the opportunity to spend time with members of the police department in an effort to enrich the lives of both the athletes and police employees. ➤ Grants:

- ✓ OVPD submitted a special application to the State Law Enforcement Asset Seizure Fund (SLEAF) to purchase a new Portable Radio. The SLEAF Committee approved the grant and awarded OVPD \$2,625.75. The new radio will replace an outdated one.

➤ Speed Trailer Deployment

The police department's speed trailer was deployed for two weeks during the month of October. Targeted areas included West Avenue and Woodland Avenue.

➤ Police Volunteers

Police department volunteers logged **329** hours during the month of September.

➤ In-Service Training

- ✓ October 6th – Less-Lethal Impact Munitions (all officers).
- ✓ October 20th – CPR and AED refresher course (all officers).
- ✓ October 27th – Police baton instructor course (Bradshaw and Caselli).
- ✓ October 29th – Handcuff instructor course (all officers).

➤ Arrests

Officers filed a total of 1 criminal charge, 4 DUI charges, and issued 70 traffic citations during the month of October. Additionally, 17 written warnings were issued for traffic violations.

➤ **Police Reports**

During the month of October, officers prepared 38 crime reports, 101 field service reports, and 2 collision reports.

➤ **New Officer**

Recruit AnnMarie Dalton continues to perform well at the police academy. Graduation is scheduled for February 12, 2016.

Champions on Tour of the Thin Blue Line

OVERVIEW

Champions on Tour of the Thin Blue Line (COTTBL) is a program partnership between Delaware Law Enforcement for Special Olympics (DE LESO) and Special Olympics Delaware (SODE) that provides interested adults with intellectual disabilities the opportunity to spend time with members of participating law enforcement agencies in an effort to enrich the lives of both the athletes and police employees. In this document, the term “police officer” will refer to all law enforcement officers, including state troopers, officers, and agents. COTTBL is sponsored by DE LESO and the initial pilot program will be administered by the following agencies: Delaware State Police Troop 7, Ocean View PD, and University of Delaware PD.

PROGRAM

The purpose of the COTTBL program is to provide greater understanding for law enforcement employees about children and adults with intellectual disabilities, while offering an opportunity for those individuals to meet and spend time with police officers and civilian public safety employees. Information about the program opportunities is provided to SODE staff members and disseminated from the staff to athletes and their families in good standing who are actively enrolled and involved in SODE.

Interested police departments may contact, Captain Dan Hall of the Delaware State Police or Lisa Smith of Special Olympics Delaware, to register as a COTTBL participating agency. SODE will maintain a current list of participating law enforcement agencies in the state and their respective points of contact. This list will be updated as necessary and said information will be made available to program administrators as needed. Capt Hall may be reached at 302-672-5409, daniel.hall@state.de.us. Any SODE athlete, aged 18 or older, interested in arranging a visit to their local police department, troop, or agency should communicate their request, along with an appropriate phone number and email address to Lisa Smith at SODE. Athletes must be accompanied by a guardian or Class A volunteer during the tour. Class A volunteers are registered with SODE and represent someone who has regular, close physical contact with the athletes; for example, a coach falls into this category. Lisa Smith will forward the request and contact information directly to the contact person for a participating police department in closest proximity to the athlete’s address. Email is the preferred method of communication to ensure a record of the request and response is maintained.

The police department contact will forward the request to the appropriate personnel to arrange a visit and tour. The police department contact person or his/her designee, will contact the involved guardian

(or Class A volunteer) of the athlete and arrange a mutually agreeable date and time for the visit to occur.

- The athlete and their guardian/Class A volunteer will be given a troop/police department tour and then driven to the communication center in a police vehicle and given a tour of the communication center. The tours will last between one and two hours, due to other duties and assignments the police officer will have.
- The athlete as well as their guardian/Class A volunteer will be required to sign a waiver of liability form before the tour commences.
- Under no circumstances during the visit will a COTTBL athlete be permitted access to a firearm. No officer will be permitted to display his or her sidearm out of the holster or exhibit any other firearm in a way that would permit the athlete to gain access to the weapon.
- Officers want to ensure athletes enjoy their visit and will do everything possible to address special needs and avoid unsettling situations if so informed ahead of time.
- Champions on Tour of the Thin Blue Line are provided free of charge. Participating police departments reserve the right to postpone visits with little notice, due to unexpected incidents occurring that require personnel to respond who were originally assigned to host the COTTBL visit.
