- Chief McLaughlin attended the Law Enforcement WMD Sub-committee Meeting on September 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- OVPD hosted the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 16 monthly meeting on September 5<sup>th</sup>.
- New speed display signs were purchased and installed on Muddy Neck Road.
- Staff worked with consultant Jon Shane on the police staffing study. The study was presented to the Town Council on September 24<sup>th</sup>.
- Chief McLaughlin attended the monthly meeting of the Delaware Police Chief's Council on September 10<sup>th</sup>.
- Chief McLaughlin presented a grant application to the Fund to Combat Violent Crime on September 10<sup>th</sup>. OVPD received an award of \$30,054.05. Funds will be utilized to purchase new

audio-visual equipment for the police training room, two new firearms, a new portable radio, five new body cameras and overtime patrols.

- Bi-annual Delaware Infectious Control and Exposure Report was completed and submitted to DHSS.
- Chief McLaughlin and Officer Carter participated in a state-wide homeland security tabletop exercise on September 18<sup>th</sup> at Dover Downs.
- OVPD developed a Community-Based Naloxone Program in conjunction with the Delaware Department of Health and Social Services. All OVPD officer and several volunteers completed instructor-level Naloxone training. OVPD will provide the training to the public beginning December 12<sup>th</sup> at 5pm.
- OVPD hosted a Bike Regatta on September 19<sup>th</sup> for area Special Olympics athletes.
- Chief McLaughlin attended a meeting with representatives from the OV Church of Christ and the Ball 4 All Foundation. The OVPD is teaming up with the church and Ball 4 All to provide sports events for area youth on Friday evenings in January and February 2020.
- Chief McLaughlin attended the annual meeting of the Bear Trad Dunes HOA on September 21<sup>st</sup>.
- Chief McLaughlin, Captain Hall, and Officer Carter attended the annual Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERRT) Seminar in Aurora, Colorado.
- Upgrades to the video surveillance at 201 Central Ave and 32 West Avenue have been completed.
- Police staff (Carter) installed new audio/visual equipment at 32 West Avenue.
