12th Annual Delaware Lions Foundation Breakfast was held Saturday, March 6, 2010 at the Dover Sheraton Hotel at 9:30am.

Susan Jacobs was the speaker from the Charlton School where the Camden Wyoming Lions and the Delaware Lions Foundation sponsor a Hippotherapy (horse riding) program for about 50 children. This horse riding program is another way occupational, physical and speech therapists can treat children with physical, cognitive and emotional disabilities. therapist and teachers are amazed at the progress the children make while riding the horses. Carol Bryson talked about her son, Matthew, and his experiences while attending the program at the school and they were so pleased with his progress that they are now taking their son for additional session on their own. Melissa Gebhard and her son, Drew, were in attendance and Drew was quite shy and would not speak but Susan told us that Drew really likes his horse and his motor skills and speech have greatly improved. This program costs about \$10,000 and the Camden Wyoming Lions are very appreciative to DLF for their matching grant and to several Lions Clubs in Delaware that were very generous with donations to help them with this program.





Maggie Williamson and her mother, Pamela Salisbury, and her sister, Hannah, attended our breakfast and Maggie talked to us this Maggie is deaf and with her morning. determination, the help of a speech pathologist and an interpreter she leads a normal life as a middle school student. When she was 6 years old she wrote to Yale University letting them know she would be coming someday and they would need to find an interpreter for her when she started law school. This year she was in the Mariner Middle School Rock 'n Roll Revival and sang "These Boots are Made for Walking". Maggie is determined to go beyond the limits of her disabilities. in 2003 the clubs in Region 3, Zone 1 (Dewey Lewes, Midway, Milton Rehoboth Beach) and with a matching grant from the Delaware Lions Foundation purchased an FM Enhancement System for Maggie to use and she has excelled.

History of the Lions Foundation

Lion Delegates to the 2001 Convention approved the current mission statement and name change to the Delaware Lions Foundation, Inc. These organizational changes were made to provide more opportunities for local clubs to serve their communities in addition to their support of the traditional sight and hearing projects.

The Delaware Lions Foundation, Inc. was founded in 1973 as the Delaware Lions Sight and Hearing Conservation Foundation, Inc. The original purpose was to provide sight and hearing testing services and equipment to be used by the Lions of Delaware. Towards that end, a Sightmobile was built and traveled up and down the State for several years. When the trailer was abandoned, the equipment was loaned to Lions Clubs to be used to conduct sight and hearing screening programs for students and other Delawareans.
