New Business:

Coordinator's Report:

- B. Parker reported that things are going well with the Senior Meals. CRT is providing meals 3 days per week; 2 days per week from Moodus BBQ. More people are attending the Moodus BBQ days. Quality of the CRT meals seem to be better.
- Updated MOU for the new year. Funding level is the same. At the State level, funding has not increased since 2009. Generous community donations have helped make up the difference.
- Meals on Wheels: Numbers fluctuate, as clients go to convalescent homes, hospital, move or pass away.
- Community Lions and First Church contribute to the Senior Center with dry/canned foods to supplement Meals on Wheels clients. Any excess food is given to the Food Bank.
- B. Parker reported that he is still working on getting the AV equipment (speakers) upgraded in the large room.

- There are new dispensers in the bathrooms for toilet paper, soap and paper towels. The change is town-wide and money-saving.
- Health Care: Open enrollment is still going on until 12/7.
- AARP Safe driving class was presented on 11/20.
- Bingo will be held today.
- Reiki, by Candy Nero, is being offered 2x/month; Massages by Cora 2x/month
