Minutes

September 14, 2022

c. Discussion re: Effort that was needed to keep all of the shrubs and planters watered

Beautification Committee Member Pamela Wilson discussed how her and Beautification Committee Member Jean McMahan watered the planters every day due to the hot and dry summer. She suggested not having planters at the waterwheel and planting annuals by the fence.

“Perennials” can be purchased and planted by the waterwheel fence.

d. Discussion re: Creating a natural border of trees/shrubs at the Waterwheel

A discussion took place about having shrubs planted at the border of the waterwheel.

Board Member Comments


