ORDINANCE NO. 14-10

AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK PER (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14) FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2014

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 0.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Ocean City in the County of Cape May finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2014 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$1,785,773.75 excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby determines that any amount authorized herein above that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Ocean City, in the County of Cape May, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2014 budget year, the final appropriations of the City of Ocean City shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$1,785,773.75, and that the CY 2014 municipal budget for the City of Ocean City be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

This ordinance shall take effect in the time and manner prescribed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 14-11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER XXV, ZONING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY MINOR SITE PLAN

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1

Article 1500 Development Applications Procedures and Plat Details of Chapter XXV "Zoning and Land Development" of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City, New Jersey is hereby amended by adding the following new Section 25-1500.13 Minor Site Plans:

25-1500.13 Minor Site Plan.

25-1500.13.1 Required Documents.

Prior to issuance of a Certificate of Completeness or scheduling of a minor site plan for public hearing, the Administrative Officer (Planning Board or Board of Adjustment Secretary) shall determine that the following have been submitted in proper form:

- a. A Certificate of Title, which may be on the plat (signed by the owner and notarized) or in a letter form, signed by a member of the New Jersey Bar, by a title officer or authorized agent of a title insurance company licensed to do business in the State of New Jersey, which certificate shall confirm that the owner of the premises in question is the owner as shown on the plat.
 - b. Board Engineer's and Board Planner's reports.
 - c. Application for State wetlands approval, where required.
- d. Other submittals that may be required by the Board Planner, Board Engineer, Planning Board or Board of Adjustment, or by Federal, State, County or municipal law, including but not limited to a traffic report and EIS.
- e. The application for development for a minor site plan shall include a request for the granting of any variances required.
- f. Required application and escrow fees as set forth in Article 1300 of this Ordinance.
 - g. One (1) original and twenty-four (24) copies of a completed application form.
 - h. Proof of service of notice in conformance with Section 25-900.7.
- i. One (1) original and twenty-four (24) copies of a plat and attachments meeting the requirements set forth below.

25-1500.13.2 Plat Requirements.

a. General Requirements. The plan for a minor site plan shall be drawn at a scale of not less than fifty (50) feet to the inch nor larger than ten feet (10') to the inch, with

North oriented to the top of the page, on one of the four standard sheet sizes $(8.5" \times 14", 15" \times 21", 24" \times 36", 30" \times 42")$, shall conform to the provisions of the New Jersey Map Filing Law, N.J.S.A. 46:23-9.9 et seq., and shall include or be accompanied by the information specified below:

- 1. The minor site plan shall be based upon a current boundary survey prepared in accordance with N.J.A.C. 13:40-5.1, Preparation of Land Surveys, certified to the owner and prepared or recertified not more than twelve (12) months prior to the date of application. If more than 12 months has passed since the date of (or date of last recertification) of the survey, it shall be recertified and, if necessary, brought up-to-date.
- b. Title Block. A title block shall appear on all sheets and include:
 - 1. Title to read "Minor Site Plan."
 - 2. Name of development, if any.
 - 3. Tax map sheet, block and lot designation.
 - 4. Street address.
 - 5. Name of the applicant and owner.
 - 6. Date (of original and all revisions).
 - 7. Name, signature, address and license number of the professional who prepared the plan and their embossed seal.
 - 8. If the site plan contains more than one sheet, each sheet shall be numbered and titled.

c. Detailed Information.

- 1. A current aerial image (at a scale of not less than one inch (1") equals one thousand feet (1,000') with North oriented to top of the page, indicating the location of the subject parcel with reference to surrounding areas, existing streets which intersect or border the parcel, the names of all such streets and any zone district boundaries and City boundary which is within five hundred feet (500') of the subject parcel.
- 2. The names and addresses of all owners, and property classifications of all parcels within two hundred feet (200') of the subject parcel as shown by the most recent records of the City.
- 3. A portion of the current Ocean City Zoning Map showing the subject parcel and zone district boundaries, existing easements, watercourses, floodways and flood hazard areas within two hundred feet (200'), and the width of the right-of-way of each street within two hundred feet (200') of the subject parcel.
- 4. A portion of the current Ocean City Tax Map showing the subject parcel, zone district boundaries, existing easements and public rights-of-way within two hundred feet (200') of the subject parcel.
- 5. A schedule shall be placed on the site plan indicating:
 - a) The area of the tract and site (the portion of the tract involved in the site plan).

- b) The floor area (and floor area ratio where appropriate) of the existing and proposed building (listed separately).
- c) The proposed use or uses and the floor area devoted to each use.
- d) The zone in which the site is located.
- e) Proposed and required lot dimensions and front, rear and side setbacks.
- f) Proposed and required off-street parking spaces.
- g) Square footage and percentage of the site retained in unoccupied open space.
- h) Square footage and percentage of the site considered as Building Coverage. .
- i) Building height measured from the appropriate reference point.
- j) Applicant's compliance with the zoning requirements.
- 6. All existing structures, with an indication of those which are to be removed, and the front, rear and side yard dimensions of those to remain, referenced to existing lot lines.
- 7. All existing and proposed private and public easements or rights-of-way and the purposes thereof.
- 8. North arrow.
- 9. Written and graphic scales.
- 10. All required endorsements or certifications and space for the appropriate signatures.
- 11. A copy of any existing or proposed covenants or deed restrictions applying to the land being subdivided or certification that none exists. Such certification may be in letter form signed by a member of the New Jersey Bar, by a title officer or authorized agent of a title insurance company licensed to do business in New Jersey.
- 12. Spot elevations at all four (4) corners of the subject parcel (oceanfront parcels require two (2) additional spot elevations, one (1) at midpoint on each of the two (2) side lot lines).
- 13. Sufficient spot elevations (NAVD88 datum) and/or contour lines to indicate the proposed system of surface drainage and the relationship of proposed grading to the land surrounding the site.
- 14. FEMA flood zone, base flood elevation, Zoning Flood Elevation and such other information as may assist the Planning Board in the determination of floodway and flood hazard area limits.
- 15. The following shall also be required unless the administrative officer determines that they are not necessary to provide a full understanding of the application:
 - a) Existing at point of connection and all proposed manholes, sewer lines, waterlines, fire hydrants, utility poles and all other topographical features of a physical or engineering nature within the site and within fifty (50) feet thereof.

- b) All existing structures on the site and within fifty (50) feet thereof, including their use, thereof indicating those to be destroyed or removed and those to remain.
- c) Location, use, finished grade level, ground coverage, first floor and basement elevations, front, rear and side setbacks of all buildings and other pertinent improvements.
- d) The capacity of off-street parking areas including setbacks, location and dimensions of all access drives, aisles and parking stalls.
- e) The location, setback and size of proposed loading docks.
- f) Location of curbs, sidewalks, above-ground utilities including overhead electric transmission wires.
- g) Cross-section(s) showing the composition of pavement areas, curbs and sidewalks.
- h) Exterior lighting plan, including the location, direction of illumination, amount of illumination expressed in horizontal footcandles, wattage and drawn details of all outdoor lighting standards and fixtures.
- Landscaping and screening plan including planting note and plant guarantees, showing the size, location, type, spacing and number of each type of street tree, shrub and groundcover to be utilized.
- j) Location of signs and drawn details showing the size, nature of construction, height, lighting and content of all signs.
- k) Drawn details of the type of screening to be utilized for refuse storage areas, air conditioning units, outdoor equipment and bulk storage areas.
- I) Floor plans and building elevation drawings of any proposed structure or structures or existing structures to be renovated.
- m) Written description of the proposed operations in sufficient detail to indicate the effects of the use in producing traffic congestion, noise, glare, air pollution, fire hazards or safety hazards. The written description shall indicate the use, the number of shifts to be worked, the number of employees in each shift, the number of vehicles to be stored or parked on the site, and provisions to be made for site maintenance.
- n) Road dedication, where required.
- o) Proposed sight easements, where required.
- p) Proposed drainage easements, where required.
- q) Soil Erosion and Sediment Control plan, where required.
- 16. Such other information as the Board Engineer and/or Board Planner may require or request during their review of the application.

25-1500.13.3 Conditions of Approval.

Any approval of an application for development for a minor site plan granted by the Planning Board or Board of Adjustment shall be subjected to the following conditions being satisfied prior to signing of the plat or issuance of a Zoning Permit:

- a. Installation of or posting of performance guarantees for the installation of any improvements required by the Board.
 - b. Payment of any outstanding real estate taxes assessments and professional fees.
- c. Cape May County Planning Board approval if the site is located on the County road system.
 - d. New Jersey Water Company Water and sewerage service availability letters.
 - e. Granting of a CAFRA permit, where required.
- f. Submission of additional prints of the plat map and attachments for distribution (if required).
- g. Publication of a notice of the decision of the Board by the Administrative Officer (Planning Board Secretary or Board of Adjustment Secretary) within the time set forth in Section 25-900.8.
- h. Any other conditions which may be imposed by the Board or which may be required by Federal, State or municipal law.
- i. A condition setting forth the time within which all conditions must be satisfied as described in Section 25-900.10.

25-1500.13.4 Certification.

In the event that the application for development for a minor site plan is approved, a certification to that effect in the following form shall be endorsed on the plan or plat and three (3) paper copies thereof shall be provided to the Board by the applicant. Said copies shall be signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the Planning Board after they receive certification from the Administrative Officer (Planning Board or Board of Adjustment Secretary) that all conditions of approval have been satisfied. After signature, one (1) copy of the signed preliminary plat shall be returned to the applicant.

Re: Minor Site Plan Checklist support

Attached is the ordinance for amending and supplementing Chapter XXV, Zoning and Land Development of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City, "Minor Site Plan" checklist to be used as the official checklist for minor site plan within the City of Ocean City. Currently we do not have one and I noticed this several years ago while consulting. The checklist needs to be officially adopted by the City as the official "Minor Site Plan Checklist". In the past, a major site plan checklist was utilized which typically required extensive waiver requests from the applicant since it is not a major site plan. There is already a fee schedule in place for minor site plans with required escrow submissions and thus not requiring any modifications.

The checklist is also supported by New Jersey Municipal Land Use Law (M.L.U.L.) as part of a submission and/or review. By adopting this, the process will be streamlined by reducing the requirements of a major site plan and waiver requests to a more sensible and applicable checklist.

ORDINANCE NO. 14-04

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER XXV, ZONING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY 2014 (1) Residential Mechanical

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1

Section 25-107 Definitions of Chapter XXV "Zoning and Land Development" of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City, New Jersey is hereby amended as follows:

Architectural Projection shall mean an architectural feature that is differentiated from the main portion of a building by a minimum offset of five inches (5"). A cantilevered building section shall not be considered an architectural projection.

Attic shall mean the unfinished, nonhabitable space between the ceiling beams of the top story and the roof rafters, accessible only by pull-down stairs. An Attic shall be in compliance with Section 25-300.16.1.e.

Dwelling, One-Family shall mean a detached building which includes one (1) kitchen, internal stairs connecting all floors within the building, and is designed for and is occupied exclusively by one (1) or more persons living as a single, nonprofit housekeeping unit.

Garden Arbor shall mean an open structure with an open framed roof, often latticed, supported by latticework frame, posts or columns.

Kitchen shall mean a room or part of a room used primarily for cooking and food preparation typically equipped with a stove, a sink with hot and cold running water, a refrigerator, cabinets, a microwave oven, a dishwasher and other appliances.

Storage Room shall mean a non-habitable space where at least one-half (1/2) of the distance between the floor-to-eeiling height and ceiling joists is above the average grade of the adjoining ground, and where with a the distance between the floor-to-eeiling height of and the ceiling joists is not greater less than five seven-and-one-half-feet (\$ 7.5'). Where the vertical distance between the floor average level of the adjoining grade-and the storage room ceiling joists is more than five seven-and-one-half feet (\$ 7.5') or greater, the storage room shall be counted a story. Egress windows, egress doors, plumbing, telephone and cable connections shall not be permitted in storage rooms.

Story shall mean that portion of a building included between the ground, or the surface of any floor and the surface of the next floor above it, or if there be no floor above it, then the space between any floor and the ceiling above it, where the floor-to-floor joist or roof rafters height is greater than five feet (5'). If the top of the floor is below Base Flood Elevation (BFE), the room may not be used as habitable space unless the building was legally built prior to 1971. If the top of the floor is above BFE, the room must be considered as part of a story, except that an Attic is not a story. (Refer to definitions of Attic, Crawl Space, Garage (private residential), Half-Story).

Section 2

Section 25-204.19.5 Schedule of District Regulations (Ocean City Homes Neighborhood) of Chapter XXV "Zoning and Land Development" of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City, New Jersey is hereby amended as follows:

- (1) In all zone districts, the minimum front yard setback shall be as indicated on Schedule B, "Schedule of Front Yard Setback Depths by Street." Where development is proposed on lots adjacent to a street not listed on Schedule B, the front yard shall be the average setback of the adjacent buildings on the entire block, as determined from a certified survey provided by the applicant/owner.
- (2) For purposes of determining the front yard per Section 25-300, et seq. of this Ordinance, the boardwalk shall not be considered a street. The rear yard shall be opposite the front yard.
- (2c) The minimum required rear yard for existing platted lots shall be: 20% of lot depth for non-alley lots and for lots having less than 100 feet of depth, 25% of lot depth for alley lots and for lots having a depth of 100 feet or more. 20% of lot depth for lots without alley access; 25 feet or 25% of lot depth whichever is less, for lots with alley access. The rear yard setback required to the enclosed habitable portion of the building may be reduced a distance equal to the distance by which the required front yard setback to the building exceeds ten (10) feet. Nonhabitable building area, such as porches, decks and landings may extend not more than six
- (6) feet into the required rear yard. In no case shall this rear yard setback be less than seven and-one-half (7.5) feet.(3) On corner lots, the minimum side yard requirements shall be met for the interior side yard and the larger side yard
- dimension shall be provided for the side yard closest to the street.

 (4) The minimum required lot depth and lot frontage indicated shall be provided, except that lots with less than the required depth or frontage at the time of adoption of this Ordinance, shall be deemed to be conforming for purpose of lot depth
- (5) See Section 25-300.16 for design controls governing eaves, dormers, half-stories and porches.

Section 25-204.21.7 Reserved Eneroachments Permitted in Minimum Required Yards of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City is amended to delete the following sections:

1. Trash enclosures and HVAC equipment may extend into the largest side yard not more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the side yard dimension, provided the minimum side yard setback is maintained, and that such HVAC equipment does not exceed the minimum elevation necessary to comply with FEMA BFE requirements.

Section 25-204.22.7 Reserved Encroachments Permitted in Minimum Required Yards of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City is amended as follows:

b. Side Yard. These encroachments are not permitted on any lot that utilizes the side yard provisions contained in subsection 25-204.21.8.

1. Trash enclosures and HVAC equipment may extend into the largest side yard not more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the side yard dimension, provided the minimum side yard setback is maintained, and that such HVAC equipment does not exceed the minimum elevation necessary to comply with FEMA BFE requirements.

 - (2) Is not located within eight feet (8') of the main building;

- (3) Is not on a lot located on the bayfront, lagoon or oceanfront.
- (e) One (1) freestanding storage shed as permitted by the specific district regulations provided it is not larger than one hundred (100) square feet, does not exceed a height of ten feet (10') above grade, provided that it is not closer than four feet (4') from the rear or side lot lines, is not located on the oceanfront, does not displace or eliminate required parking spaces or create a nonconforming condition related to either building coverage or impervious surface coverage.
 - (f) thru (h) No Change
- (i) Except on oceanfront lots, p Private above-ground swimming pools on non-waterfront lots only, and in-ground swimming pools, above ground or in ground, as permitted by the specific district regulations, provided that the wall of the pool is not closer than six feet (6') to any property line, or four feet (4') to any building, bulkhead or property line. Pool equipment such as pumps and filters are not permitted in a front yard and shall be no closer than six feet (6') to any other property line. Pool lighting shall not project onto adjacent properties. Sound amplification systems are not permitted.
 - (j) thru (s) No Change
- 3. Side Yard. (Revise as follows)
 - (a) Roof eaves and gutters provided they do not exceed extend more than eighteen inches (18") in width from the main roof, or more than twelve inches (12") from an architectural projection.
 - (b) thru (g) No Change
 - (h) Shower enclosures, trash enclosures and HVAC equipment may extend not more than twenty-five percent (250%) into the required side yard setback, provided that the shower enclosures do not exceed a height of eight feet (8') above grade, the trash enclosure does not exceed a height of six feet (6') above grade, and HVAC equipment and associated screening does not exceed the minimum elevation necessary to comply with FEMA BFE requirements.
 - (i) One (1) detached garage as permitted by the specific district regulations provided the garage:
 - (1) Is not located within two feet (2') one foot (1') of the side property line;
 - (2) Is not located within eight feet (8') of the main building; and
 - (3) Is not located on a bayfront, lagoon or oceanfront lot.
 - (j) Architectural projections including bay windows (chimneys and the full length or depth of a garage wall are not considered architectural projections) such as bay windows may extend into the required side yard not more than eighteen inches (18"), and shall not exceed a total length of fifteen feet (15') or fifteen percent (15%) of the width of the side facade, whichever is less, except in the G-75/4500 Zone where the projection shall not exceed a total length that is one-third (1/3) of the width of the side facade. are permitted to encroach into the required side yard as follows:
 - (1) Where lot width is less than forty feet (40"), architectural projections may extend no closer than three feet (3") of the side property line, and shall not exceed a total length that is greater than fifteen percent (15%) of the lot depth.
 - (2) Where lot width is forty feet (40') or more, architectural projections may extend no closer than four feet (4') of the side property line, and shall not exceed a total length that is greater than fifteen percent (15%) of the lot depth.

- (k) Driveway and off-street parking areas on non-alley corner lots.
- On corner lots where the larger of two (2) side yards faces the street, steps may extend from an entry porch to the minimum side yard setback for the lot. line. From this point, a terraced walkway may encroach to within six inches (6") of the side property line provided:
 - (1) The terraced walkway is constructed of brick, stone or other maintenance-free material. Concrete and unfaced concrete block shall not be permitted.
 - (2) Not more than two (2) risers are constructed between landings.
 - (3) Landings shall extend at least three (3) feet in the direction of travel.
- (m) Retaining walls constructed in accordance with the requirements of Section 25-1700.8.9(e) and Section 25-1700.14.1.
- (n) One (1) freestanding storage shed as permitted by the specific district regulations provided it is not larger than one hundred (100) square feet, does not exceed a height of ten feet (10") above grade, provided that it is not closer than four feet (4") from the side lot lines, is not located on the oceanfront, does not displace or eliminate required parking spaces or create a nonconforming condition related to either building coverage or impervious surface coverage.
- (o) Platforms and steps providing access to elevated electrical meters.
- (p) Private above-ground swimming pools on non-waterfront lots only, and inground swimming pools as permitted by the specific district regulations, provided that the wall of the pool is not closer than six feet (6') to any property line or four feet (4') to any building or bulkhead. Pool equipment such as pumps and filters shall be no closer than six feet (6') to any other property line. Pool lighting shall not project onto adjacent properties. Sound amplification systems are not permitted.

Section 25-300.12.4 Off-Street Parking, Section 25-1700.11.5 Distance from Side Property Line, Section 25-1700.11.10 Access Drives for Single- and Two-Family Dwellings, and 25-1700.22.2 Standards of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City are amended as follows:

Section 25-300.12.4 Off-Street Parking.

a. General. Off-street parking spaces shall be provided as further specified in this Ordinance. All commercial off-street parking spaces, except for those accessed from an alley, including passageways, driveways and turning areas shall be provided in connection with a dustless, durable, all-weather pavement parking surface shall be clearly marked for parking spaces and adequately drained in accordance with Section 25-1700.22 of this Ordinance. Parking spaces accessed from an alley may utilize crushed stone, crushed shell, porous paving, paver blocks or other materials as may be found suitable by the City. Driveway aprons are required pursuant to Section 25-1700.11.9 and Section 25-1700.12 of this Ordinance.

Section 25-1700.22.2 Standards.

All p Parking areas, passageways, and driveways accessed from a street shall be surfaced with a properly designed, durable, all weather pavement of either bituminous concrete or Portland cement concrete and clearly marked for parking spaces. Parking areas accessed from an alley may utilize crushed stone, crushed shell, porous paving, paver blocks or other materials as may be found suitable by the City.

Section 25-300.15, Standards for Accessory Buildings of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City is amended as follows:

25-300.15 Standards for Accessory Buildings.*

- a. Maximum height above grade for a detached single bay garage shall be fifteen feet (15'), except the height of a 2-bay garage is limited to eighteen feet (18').
- Minimum exterior dimensions for a single-bay garage shall be ten feet by twenty feet (10' x 20').
- a.c. Street-facing garage doors shall be located at least eighteen feet (18') from the public right-of-way
- b.d. Detached garages where permitted shall be subject to the following:
 - 1. Not located within one foot (1') two feet (2') of the rear or side property lines
 - 1-2. Not located within two feet (2') of the rear property line on non-alley lots, or within four feet (4') of the rear property line on alley lots
 - 2.3. Not located within eight feet (8') of the main building
 - 3.4. Not located on a bayfront, lagoon or oceanfront lot
- e. No accessory building shall be closer to the street line than the street wall of the principal building.
- f. When an accessory structure is attached to the principal building, it must comply with the principal building zoning requirements.
- g. Roofed accessory structures such as garages and sheds are included as impervious coverage. Pergolas are not considered as Building Coverage, or Impervious Surface Coverage unless they are constructed over an Impervious Surface as defined herein.
- h. Sheds and detached Pergolas, where permitted, shall comply with the following standards:
 - 1. No shed shall be used for any purpose other than storage.
 - 2. No more than one (1) shed shall be permitted per lot.
 - 3. A building permit is not required for a shed, however, a zoning permit is required. Zoning and building permits are required for a Pergola.
 - 4. Sheds and Pergolas shall be anchored as required.
 - 5. Sheds shall not exceed one hundred (100) square feet in size, and ten feet (10') in height measured from the adjacent grade.
 - 6. Sheds and Pergolas shall not be closer than four feet (4') to the rear or side lot lines
 - 7. Sheds and Pergolas are not permitted on bayfront, lagoon or oceanfront lots
 - 8. Sheds shall not be located so as to displace or eliminate required parking spaces or create a nonconforming condition related to either building coverage or impervious surface coverage.
 - i. Garden Arbors, where permitted shall comply with the following requirements:
 - 1. Garden Arbors shall not exceed a height of ten (10) feet or a footprint greater than twenty (20) square feet.
 - 2. Garden Arbors shall be setback a minimum of four (4) feet from the front property line.

- Garden Arbors shall be anchored as required by code.
- 4. A building permit is not required for a Garden Arbor, however, a Zoning Permit is required.
- 5. Garden Arbors are not permitted in the rear yard of bayfront, lagoon or oceanfront lots.

Section 25-300.16.1.e Half Story of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City is amended as follows:

- e. Attic and Half-Story. Compliance with the entire criterion herein is required, otherwise the floor shall be considered a full story.
 - 1. The <u>attic or half-story</u> shall be integrated into a pitched roof so that the roof and the walls of the second floor intersect no higher than the floor level of the half-story.
 - 2. A minimum of ninety percent (90%) of the <u>attic or half-story roof shall have a pitch</u> of 4 in 12 or greater.
 - 3. The attie-or half-story shall include all floor area where the underside of the roof rafters is five feet (5') or more above the floor, including the area under dormers and the area encumbered by stairs. The floor area of the attie-or half-story shall be limited as a percentage of the floor below as indicated in the Schedule of District Regulations.*

Section 11

Section 25-300.17 Rear Yards on Waterfront Lots of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City is amended as follows:

- a. The following special requirements shall apply to all lots where the rear yard adjoins a lagoon, or Beach Thorofare (Great Egg Harbor Bay).
 - 1. An open patio shall be permitted and may extend from the house to the bulkhead. Steps, ramps, and landings, providing access from the first floor to the patio, from the patio over the bulkhead, and from the patio on the subject lot to a deck or patio on an adjoining lot are also permitted.
 - 2. In-ground swimming pools (subject to NJDEP approval and Section 25-300.1a.2(i) of this Ordinance) and associated fencing, circulating pumps and filters, tennis courts, air conditioners and heat pumps are permitted as per the applicable requirements of this Ordinance. Fences required around swimming pools shall be Open Fences and not greater than four (4) feet in height.
 - 3. Where the rear lot line is on the water side of the physical bulkhead(s) or bulkhead line, the rear yard setback shall be measured from the physical bulkhead. Where there is more than one (1) bulkhead on said property, the rear yard setback shall be measured from the most landward physical bulkhead.
 - 4. Where the rear lot line is landward of the physical bulkhead(s) or bulkhead line, the rear yard setback requirement shall be measured from the rear lot line.
- b. The following special requirements shall apply to all lots where the rear yard adjoins the Atlantic Ocean.
 - 1. No building shall be closer than twenty-five feet (25') from the seaward side of the physical bulkhead. If there is no physical bulkhead, no building shall be located along the oceanfront closer than twenty-five feet (25') from the established Ocean City bulkhead line unless the property line is landward of the established Ocean City bulkhead line, in which event no building shall be located closer than twenty-five feet (25') from the property line.

No porch, deck, or patio shall be closer than fifteen feet (15') from the seaward side of the physical bulkhead. If there is no physical bulkhead, no porch, deck, or patio shall be located along the oceanfront closer than fifteen feet (15') from the established Ocean City bulkhead line unless the property line is landward of the established Ocean City bulkhead line,

in which event no porch, deck, or patio, shall be located closer than fifteen feet (15') from the property line.

- 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1 above, no building located on the oceanfront shall be placed closer than a distance measured from the street right-of-way edge equal to the arithmetic mean distance of all rear walls of existing dwellings including porches, located on the City block face in which the new dwelling in question is to be constructed. The applicant shall obtain said arithmetic mean distance of all existing dwellings including porches, measured from the street right-of-way, from a New Jersey licensed surveyor. Vacant lots are to be excluded from this calculation. Said arithmetic mean distance calculations shall be made part of the application. Development in compliance with this section shall be considered conforming and shall not require variance approval.
- 3. Except as provided herein, there shall be no encroachments into the twenty-five foot (25') rear yard on lots located on the oceanfront except revetments which may be installed, provided the highest elevation (top) of the revetment is at least ten feet (10') from the main building line, and except over-the-bulkhead steps that meet the requirements of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City, (Volume I, Section 18-8), and except over-the-bulkhead ramps that meet the requirements of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City, (Volume I, Section 18-8), and except air conditioners and heat pumps as permitted by Article 300 of this chapter, and except for an open fence not greater than four feet (4') in height, located perpendicular to the rear property line, and except for in-ground swimming pools (subject to NJDEP approval and Section 25-300.1a.2(i)) and associated fencing, circulating pumps and filters. Fences required around swimming pools shall be Open Fences not greater than four (4) feet in height.

Section 12

Section 25-1700.12 Driveway Aprons of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City are amended as follows:

25-1700.12 Driveway Aprons.

- a. On non-alley lots Ddriveway aprons shall be required between the street curb to the rear edge of the sidewalk. They shall be in accordance with Section 17-2. Where sidewalks are not required, a five inch (5") thick bituminous concrete apron ten feet (10') wide between the curb and the right-of-way line which shall be two inches (2") thick of bituminous concrete type FABC and built over a quarry blend stone base six inches (6") thick, or six inches (6") of Bank Run Gravel.
- a-b.On alley lots, driveway aprons constructed to the standards cited in Section 25-1700.12.a shall be required between the edge of the alley pavement and the property line.

Section 13

Section 25-1700.14.1 Fences and Hedges of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City is amended as follows:

- a. Hedges, walls, and fences, which are not open fences as defined in this Ordinance, located in a front yard, or within fifty feet (50') of any marsh, bay, or other body of water, shall not exceed thirty six inches (36") in height.
 - Height of hedges, walls, and fences:
 - Front Yard Solid fences shall not exceed three (3) feet in height. Open
 Fences shall not exceed four (4) feet in height.
 - Side Yard Fences located between the front setback line and rear setback line shall not exceed four (4) feet in height, except as permitted by Section 25-1700.14.1.
 - 3. Rear Yard (waterfront lots) Solid fences shall not exceed three (3) feet in height. Open Fences shall not exceed four (4) feet in height.
 - 4. Rear yard fences on non-waterfront lots shall not exceed four (4) feet in height, except as permitted by Section 25-1700.14.1.

- b. thru d. No Change
- e. Fences specifically required by other provisions of this Ordinance and other municipal and State regulations. Notwithstanding fences required by other municipal or state regulations, fences located in the rear yard of oceanfront lots are required to be Open Fences not greater than four (4) feet in height.
- f. thru j. No Change

Section 25-1700.29.12 District Regulations of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City is amended as follows:

- a. No change
- b. No change
- c. Signs in Hospitality Zone Hotel Motel and Hotel Motel-1, and Off-Boardwalk Districts.
- 1. There shall be no more than three (3) signs per business. Undersized lots are permitted no more than two (2) signs. Sign types permitted in the <u>Hospitality Zone HM and HM-1 and Off Bd Districts</u> include:
 - (a) Awning signs, maximum area twenty-five percent (25%) of awning; maximum lettering eight inches (8");
 - (b) Canopy signs, maximum eight (8) square feet;
 - (c) Facade signs, maximum fifteen percent (15%) of commercial activity facade;
 - (d) Projecting signs, maximum six (6) square feet, projecting no more than four feet (4');
 - (e) Wall signs, maximum five percent (5%) of commercial activity wall;
 - (f) Window signs, maximum twenty-five percent (25%) of window.
 - (g) Freestanding signs, maximum eight (8) square feet per fifteen feet (15') of frontage, with a limit of forty-eight (48) square feet.
 - 2. In addition to the above, the following is permitted:
 - (a) One (1) six (6) square foot portable sign against the building or within the property line;
 - (b) One (1) changeable copy sign, such as a chalk menu board, limited to four (4) square feet for every twenty feet (20') of store frontage.
 - (c) Temporary signs as regulated in subsection 25-1700.29.7g. above.

CITY OF OCEAN CITY ORDINANCE NO. 14-04 Master Plan Consistency Report

<u>Introduction</u> - Ordinance 14-04 - "An ordinance amending and supplementing Chapter XXV Zoning and Land Development of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City - 2014(1) Residential Mechanical," was introduced and adopted on first reading by City Council on February 13, 2014. According to the February 14, 2014 referral from the City Clerk, Ordinance 14-04 will be advertised according to law and is scheduled to have second reading and public hearing at the March 27, 2014 City Council meeting.

The "Municipal Land Use Law" provides the Planning Board with thirty-five (35) days from the referral date to prepare, review, adopt and transmit their consistency report regarding Ordinance 14-04 to City Council. NIS 40:55D-26 describes the Planning Board's responsibility regarding the master plan consistency review as follows:

"... the planning board shall make and transmit to the governing body, within 35 days after referral, a report including identification of any provisions in the proposed development regulation, revision or amendment which are inconsistent with the master plan and recommendations concerning those inconsistencies and any other matters as the board deems appropriate."

While formerly only zoning ordinances and amendments thereto were required to be submitted to the planning board, it is now clear from the wording in NIS 40:55D-26 that all "development regulations" must be referred to the planning board for comment and report. The statute requires that every zoning ordinance must "either be substantially consistent with the land use plan and housing plan of the master plan, or designed to effectuate such plan elements." The "Master Plan" referred to herein is the City of Ocean City Master Plan adopted February 3, 1988, and as subsequently amended by the Planning Board.

<u>Ordinance Summary</u> - Ordinance 14-04 proposes revisions to the Zoning and Land Development Ordinances summarized as follows:

Section 1 -

Architectural Projection – revised definition permits cantilevered design.

Attic – revised definition requires space to be accessible only by pull-down stairs and in conformance with the design requirements contained in 25-300.16.

*Dwelling, One-*family – revised definition requires internal stairs connecting all floors. External stairs connecting decks and/or porches are not affected.

Ordinance No. 14-04 Master Plan Consistency Report

Garden Arbor - new definition

Kitchen – new definition for a space used primarily for cooking and food preparation.

Storage Room – revised definition requires space to be non-habitable; sets maximum height at less than 7.5 feet.

Story – revised definition specifically excludes Attic as a story.

Section 2 -

To provide safe and secure storage space, the Schedule of District Regulations is revised to permit an "Attic" in the Ocean City Homes Zone. This is the only single-family zone limited to two stories. At First Reading City Council limited attic height to six (6) feet above the main roof eave.

Section 3 -

The following revisions are proposed to Schedule B (front yard setbacks):

- Ten 10-foot front setback for 2300 block of Haven Avenue (east side);
- Ten 10-foot front setback for West 16th Street;
- Twenty 20-foot setback for Wesley Way (east side of alley between 29th and 39th Streets;
- Deletes front setbacks in the Off-Boardwalk and Hotel-Motel Zones.
- Adds front setbacks (from Off-Boardwalk and Hotel-Motel Zones) to the Hospitality Zone.

Section 4 -

Clarifies Corinthian R2 Zone rear yard setback requirement.

Section 5 -

Deletes side yard provisions from the Riviera and Bayou Zones. General encroachments as described in Section 25-300.1 will be available to these two zones.

Section 6 -

Revision to Hospitality Zone Schedule of District Regulations:

- Clarifies front setbacks;
- Corrects rear setback for 'Corinthian' development;
- Establishes appropriate impervious coverage allowances for triplex, quads and multi-family units.

Section 7 -

"Permitted yard encroachments" regulations are revised as follows:

- Front Yard Garden Arbors are permitted subject to area and setback requirements; elevated platforms necessary to access electrical meters are permitted.
- Rear Yard setbacks for detached garages are increased; above-ground pools permitted on non-waterfront lots only.
- Side Yard specifications for trash enclosures, etc. modified in terms of percentage and height; increases setback for garage; reduces roof eave/ architectural projection encroachment; clarifies setback for steps; sheds, electric meter platforms and pools are added as permissible encroachments subject to controls.

Section 8 -

Construction specifications for parking areas accessed from an alley are revised to permit crushed shell, porous paving and grass pavers – no additional coverage permitted. Concrete aprons remain a requirement.

Section 9 -

Minimum size for single-bay garage established as $10' \times 20'$ to differentiate these accessory structures from sheds; setbacks for detached garages modified and garden arbors permitted consistent with Section 25-300.1 (refer to Section 7 of ordinance).

Section 10 -

Half-story design standards applied to Attics.

Section 11 -

Waterfront rear yard requirements revised to permit in-ground pools and 4' open fence.

Section 12 -

Clarifies requirements for concrete driveway aprons.

Section 13 -

Revision regulates fence height based on type of fence (open or solid) and location. Maximum height in front yard and within 50' of water for a solid fence is 3 feet, an open fence may be 4 feet; side and rear yard fences may be increased from 4' to 6' with permission from adjoining owner.

Ordinance No. 14-04

<u>Master Plan Consistency Report</u>

Section 14 -

Revision changes references in sign ordinance in recognition of the Hospitality Zone.

<u>Summary</u> – As noted above the Planning Board's responsibility in terms of the master plan consistency review is to identify any provisions in Ordinance 14-04 which are inconsistent with the Master Plan, and make recommendations concerning those inconsistencies and any other matters as the Board deems appropriate.

In defining "substantial consistency" the Supreme Court in Manalapan Realty v. Township Committee made it clear that some inconsistency is permitted "provided it does not substantially or materially undermine or distort the basic provisions and objectives of the Master Plan." The "Municipal Land Use Law" does not define the term inconsistent.

Ordinance 14-04 advances the following objectives from the Ocean City Master Plan:

- > To encourage municipal action which will guide the long range appropriate use and development of lands within the City of Ocean City in a manner which will promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of present and future residents.
- > To support the upgrading of substandard housing
- > To encourage the coordination of regulations and activities which influence development with a goal of producing efficient uses of land with appropriate development types and scale.

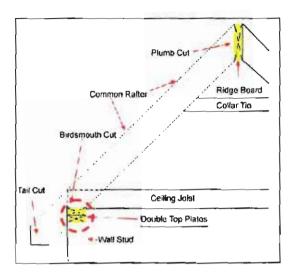
I have carefully reviewed and analyzed Ordinance 14-04 and the Master Plan. Based on this review and analysis, it is my professional opinion that Ordinance 14-04 is consistent with the Ocean City Master Plan.

As noted above, the statute pertaining to master plan consistency review enables the planning board to make recommendations regarding proposed ordinance revisions. The allowance for an attic in the Ocean City Homes Neighborhood (OCHN) Zone (Section 2 of Ordinance 14-04) is intended to provide a safe and secure area for homeowners to store household items.

The existing limit in the OCHN zone to two Total Stories requires that unobstructed headroom in attics be limited to less than five (5) feet. To comply with this requirement, headroom is typically restricted with scissor truss construction or collar ties. This regulation significantly limits use of attics in the Ocean City Homes Neighborhood.

The 6-foot attic height limit proposed by Ordinance 14-04 does not provide for usable attics in the Ocean City Homes Neighborhood Zone. Considering the components of wood frame

construction, minimum roof pitch requirements, typical lot dimensions and comfortable attic headroom, an attic height of nine (9) feet is recommended. The following exhibit illustrates the structural elements of an attic.



Accounting for the location of the roof eave, and dimensional aspects of the floor joists and roof rafters, the 9-foot attic will be reduced by at least 2½ feet. Collar ties will further reduce attic headroom. The pull-down stair required by the "attic" definition will discourage conversion of attics to habitable space. The nine (9) foot attic height control will reduce building height in the OCHN Zone by two (2) feet on lots up to 55 feet in width, and by three (3) on lots greater than 55 feet in width.

The Ocean City Master Plan seeks to 'increase year-round population' and 'maintain existing residential areas' as primary goals. The Planning Board has concluded that revision to the zoning ordinance to permit an attic in the Ocean City Homes Neighborhood Zone is consistent with and will promote these goals. To advance these Master Plan goals, the Planning Board recommends that the footnote in Section 2 of Ordinance 14-04 be revised to permit an attic "with a maximum height from the main roof eave to the roof peak of nine (9) feet."

Dear City Council Members,

At the City Council meeting of 3/27/14 the 2014 Local Municipal Budget will be on the agenda for first reading. The purpose of this memo is to list and explain the changes that have occurred since the presentation of the Mayor's proposed budget in February.

Like I stated in February, there are two categories of budgetary items which would change to a great degree between then and the introduction of the budget, but would have little to no effect on the amount to be raised by taxation. Those categories are grants and capital interfunds. When I presented these items in February I was using the 2013 amounts in order to provide a more realistic comparison of the actual budget growth from 2013 to 2014.

As far as the grants are concerned, a detail of the grants for 2014 that we know of at this moment in time can be found on pages 9 and 9a (revenue side of the budget), and pages 24-25 (appropriation side) of your State budget document. The grants so far for 2014 total \$393,770, as compared to \$284,603 which was the final figure from 2013. Additional grants that become known after the adoption of the budget are added through resolutions on a routine basis.

Relative to the capital interfunds for 2014, there were two amounts that were included in the 2013 budget that will not exist this year. First is the final installment of \$1.95 mil from the Ocean City Library towards paying down the debt service on the expansion project. Second is almost \$1.1 million in FEMA reimbursements to pay down temporary debt on the geotubes at Waverly Beach.

The Grant and Capital components listed above have virtually no effect on the tax levy, but represent a significant overall decrease to the bottom line total of the budget compared to 2013, as I indicated they would in the budget workshops. And although the grants are actually increasing compared to last year, the capital amounts are down. The net change that these areas represent is a reduction of over \$2.8 million to the budget, but again, no effect on taxation.

Now for the budget changes which represent a net decrease in the tax levy amount between the February proposed budget, and the totals for introduction.

On the appropriation side of the budget, the following are the adjustments that have been made as well as an explanation for each.

- \$25,000 in S&W has been added in total to six different divisions within the Community Operations Department due to the reliance on overtime as a result of the unusually high number of snow storms we have experienced so far this year.

- \$155,000 has been added to the Capital Improvement Fund to provide for the 5% down payment required by law on the almost \$14.4 million worth of capital improvements that our adopted capital plan calls for in 2014.
- \$134,090 decrease to the employer share due to the State for the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS).
- \$182,684 decrease to the employer share due to the State for the Police & Fire Retirement System (PFRS).

The total of all the changes outlined in this memo represent a net decrease of \$141,191.30 to the amount to be raised by taxation from the figures that were given out in February.

The total increase in the tax levy from 2013 to 2014 now stands at \$1,120,538.30, which translates to a tax rate increase of 1.46 cents. The Mayor's budget in February was at a 1.57 cent increase.

You'll notice on the cover summary sheet of the budget document that the City is \$1.8 mil under the appropriation cap, and \$423k under the tax levy cap for 2014.

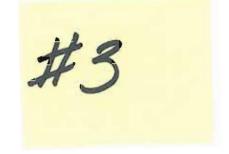
I have reviewed the qualifications and bid prices of Diehl Electrical Company Inc. and find them acceptable. The company completed the installation of traffic lights at 10th Street and Central Avenue as well as 14th Street and Central Avenue within the City of Ocean City. Their previous work has been generally acceptable and I have no objection with the contract being awarded to Diehl Electrical Company Inc.

This project includes the installation of a traffic signal (HAWK signal) at 9th Street and Aldrich Road. I have reviewed the qualifications and bid prices of F. Wayne Shawl and Sons and find them acceptable. I have personally worked with F. Wayne Shawl& Sons on several projects in Sea Isle City and elsewhere while I was employed with Maser Consulting. The company has recently worked on similar projects within the Boro of Avalon and I have reached out to Mayor Pagliughi who praised Shawl's work. I have also reached out Andrew Shawl, PE of F Wayne Shawl and Sons and he is confident that he will meet the City's expectations on this project. Their previous work has been generally acceptable and I have no objection with the contract being awarded to F. Wayne Shawl and Sons.

I have also attached a summary indicating that the bid prices are within line and deviate very little from the other bids. I have also compared the bids excluding highest and lowest to get an average bid more in line and this provided good data. The next lowest bidder was only 3.8% higher than the low bidder. F. Wayne Shawl & Sons was only 13.48% lower than the average bid, less high and low.

AUTHORIZING THE PREPARATION AND EXECUTION OF THE 2013 NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION RECYCLING TONNAGE GRANT
