ORDINANCE NO. 14-13

A BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,905,000.00 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,809,750.00 IN BONDS AND NOTES OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY FOR THE VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY, COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, (not less than two-thirds of members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by Ocean City, New Jersey for said several improvements or purposes stated in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sums being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefore and amounting in the aggregate to \$1,905,000.00 including the aggregate sum of \$95,250.00 from Capital Improvement Fund as the several down payments for said improvements for purposes required by law and more particularly described in Section 3 and now available therefore by virtue of a provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the City for down payment or for capital improvement or purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes and to meet the part of said \$1,905,000.00 appropriations not provided for by application hereunder of said down payments, negotiable bonds of the City of Ocean City are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,809,750.00 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the City in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,809,750.00 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said law.

<u>Section 3.</u> The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriations made for an estimated cost of each purpose (in each case, including all work or materials necessary therefore or incidental thereto, and as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefore on file in the Office of the City Clerk and hereby approved), and the estimated maximum amounts of bonds or notes to be issued for each such purpose, are respectively as follows:

SEE ATTACHED SECTION 3

The excess of the appropriations made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefore, as above stated, is the amount of the said down payment for said purpose.

- Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared and recited as stated:
- (a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance are not current expenses and are each a property or improvement which the City may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specifically assessed on property specifically benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the respective amounts of the said obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this Bond Ordinance is 9.79 years.
- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by the said law has been duly made and filed in the Office of the City Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statements who that the gross debt of the City as defined in said law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this Bond Ordinance by \$1,809,750.00 and the said obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said law.
- (d) Amounts not exceeding \$200,000.00 in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering cost and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Law, may be included as part of the cost of said improvements are included in the foregoing estimate therefore.

Section 5. The funds from time to time received by the City on account of any grant or monies referred to in Section 1 of this Bond Ordinance shall be used for financing the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance, by application thereof, either to direct payment of the costs of said improvements or purpose, or to payment or reduction of the amount of the obligations of the City authorized by this Bond Ordinance. Any such funds so received may, and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of such costs shall, be held and applied by the City as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the City authorized by this Bond Ordinance.

Section 6. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such time as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such terminations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1(a). The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Administrator and Council at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate, the maturity schedule of the notes sold, and price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 7. The City hereby declares the intent of the City to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

Section 8. The Chief Financial Officer of the City is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the City and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the City. The Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the City pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the City and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the City fails to comply with its undertaking, the City shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

<u>Section 9.</u> The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and the City shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the City for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitations of rate or amount.

Section 10. The Capital Budget of the City of Ocean City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistencies created hereby. To the extent of any inconsistencies, a revised budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 11. The Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

Authorization to Bid 14-27 - Boardwalk Reconstruction - 6th Street to Plaza Place

This project consists of the removal of the existing boardwalk (southern yellow pine deck with concrete substructure) from 6th Street to Plaza Place as well as the existing boardwalk ramp (wood deck and pilings) at 6th Street. This project also consists of reconstructing the boardwalk with wood pilings and utilizing previously purchased southern yellow pine for the decking.

In addition, the 6th Street boardwalk ramp and street end will be reconfigured to provide better traffic flow. The restroom building will be moved to face east. The building will also receive new siding to improve the exterior appearance and more closely align the design to the 11th Street and 12th Street restroom buildings. The boardwalk in front of the restroom will be 60 feet wide from the restroom to the main boardwalk. The north ramp 12 feet wide) from the street to the boardwalk will be eliminated and the south ramp will doubled in size to 24 feet wide. The new 6th Street ramp will be built to meet ADA standards. The ramp to the parking area on the north side will remain. The contractor will also remove and reinstall the aluminum railings, water fountain, foot wash stations, power box, lights and wiring. The removal and reinstallation of boardwalk appurtenances (benches, trash cans, etc.) will be completed by City personnel.

The base bid for the contract will consist of the first 420 linear feet of boardwalk from just north of 6th Street where the previous project ended (module 63) moving south toward 7th Street (module 57). Alternate bids for up to 3 additional 60 foot sections of boardwalk (modules 56, 55, and 54) shall be included so to guarantee that the project stays within budget and at least a portion of the boardwalk is replaced. All modules are marked on the east fascia of the boardwalk.

Floodplain and Program for Public Information Committee Meeting Minutes and Actions

The Floodplain Management Plan Committee and Program for Public Information Committee for Ocean City convened on Wednesday, April 2, 2014 to review flooding issues since February 2013 and implementation of the Action Plan items since then. In addition, the committee reviewed a draft of the program for public information and provided additions to the draft plan. The meeting was held in accordance with section 330, 332. And section 514(d) of the CRS manual, requiring an annual evaluation be made and a report be submitted to the governing body, the media, and be made available to the public. The plans are to be monitored for implementation and progress, and recommendations are to be made for revisions to the plans, if needed. The original plans may be reviewed at the City Clerk's Office, in City Hall, 861 Asbury Avenue in Ocean City.

Present at the meeting were the following committee members, Paul Anselm (Ocean City Resident), Joe Somerville (Ocean City Resident), Thomas H. Heist IV, (Ocean City Flood Insurance Agent and Resident, President Thomas H. Heist Insurance Agency), William McMahon, (Ocean City Flood Insurance Agent, President McMahon Insurance Agency), Joe Leonard, (Ocean City Banker and Lender, Account Executive Ocean City Home Bank), Michael G. Contino (Ocean City Realtor and Resident, Real Estate Agent Berkshire Hathaway Home Services), Ocean City Staff, Arthur Chew PE, PP, CFM (CRS Coordinator), Roger Rinck (Engineering), Patrick Newton CFM (Construction Code Official/Floodplain Manager), Frank Donato III, (CFO and Emergency Management Coordinator), Michael Rossbach (Engineering), Benny Tafoya, CFM (Engineering)

The Committee noted that the usual astronomical tides and northeasters continue to cause flooding in some areas. In particular, the City has seen an increase in tide heights since Hurricane Sandy. Our most recent City wide use of our outdoor "Federal" siren system was on October 28, 2012 the day before Super Storm Sandy hit landfall. Tests of the Siren System are advertised by local media to the Ocean City public prior to the test. The system also conducts its own diagnostics daily by poling each siren. Maintenance is also conducted year around and monitored constantly by a computer system located in the Ocean City Police Dispatch Center.

The importance of the Community Rating System (CRS) to the citizens of Ocean City lies in several areas, flood safety, hazard mitigation and the fact that every CRS Point the city attains is worth over one thousand dollars in savings on insurance premiums to the citizens of Ocean City. The Community of Ocean City pays the most flood insurance premiums out of all the communities in the state of New Jersey. The committee has made it a goal to not only regain the next level (CRS Level 5) from our current level of CRS Level 6, but to become the highest rated community in the state. It was noted in the meeting that other adjacent communities have better CRS ratings than Ocean City and Sea Isle went from being out of the program to a Class 5 community. On February 7, 2013 Ocean City submitted Recertification Documents which show the additional points that should be credited to Ocean City, the recertification and additional points should elevate the status of Ocean City to a level 5 and possibly beyond. A local meeting with the CFM/ISO/CRS Specialist has been requested at her earliest convenience. The city has also requested a Modification and we are awaiting follow-up from the CRS Coordinator as to when this will occur.

The City has worked with local community groups, citizens and the local office of Emergency Management by providing more public outreach programs for the year 2013. The City has updated its new website to www.ocni.us which also has become more users friendly. The new enhanced web site averages over one million hits during the peak summer season. The site also focuses on Flood Hazard information and links directly to FEMA's Flood Smart website. In 2009/2010/2011, 2012 and 2013 the City provided more information on its website to help inform residents of the dangers associated with flooding. This information included registration forms for electronic mail warnings and reverse 911 and the protocol for the new seven siren system, this information is also provided in Spanish. The site also includes the current Ocean City Zoning Map. With these new programs the City feels that they will be able to reach many more residents and vacationers. In addition, the city has added a great deal of information for residents under the banner Flood Smart Program once a citizen accesses the flood smart program by clicking on the banner the citizen will have access to a great deal of information relative to flooding in the city. There are links to current FIRM maps and Historical Maps, ABFE maps, Community Rating System (CRS), Elevation Certificates, Capital Projects, Benchmark Elevation Disc Locations, Flood Damage Questions, Ocean City Floodplain Map, Tide Reference Chart for Ocean City, Predicted Tide Elevations for Ocean City, List of Outreach projects at OEM webpage and the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

The following report is based on the consensus of the Committee. It contains recommendations for action and amendment to the Action Plan and is for consideration and adoption by resolution of City Council, as required. The amended Action Plan, report and resolution will be submitted to the CRS program as required.

- City Council established a Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) in 2004. The LEPC will continue to keep up to date on technology and procedures for flooding emergencies along with other duties.
- Floodplain Management Plan Committee will support efforts to identify uses of dredge materials. The City along with the NJDEP is researching this too. City and State draft report was issued in August 2009. Reuse of dredge materials should be studied as a flood mitigation technique.
- Engineering will continue to analyze all municipal projects for compliance with the Floodplain Management plan. Engineering has been and will continue to make every effort to reduce the amount of impervious surface coverage in existing or future Municipal projects.
- City Council will continue funding and support for beach replenishment and dune programs to prevent wave wash over and for laws preserving beach, dunes, and wetlands. The City has entered into an agreement with the State of New Jersey's department of Environmental Protection. Beach replenishment is planned to occur from Northern inlet to 18th Street in the 2012-13 offseason. Dune replenishment program will continue in needed areas. The City is in the process of getting easements for the south end beaches; for potential south end project from 40th Street to Southern inlet.
- City Council will support action to urge Army Corps of Engineers and DEP to participate in studies on beach erosion.
- The City will work with State and Federal elected officials to locate funding for future of beach replenishment project to help protect our local properties from flooding.
- City Administration worked with the NJDOT in the planning for Route 52 rebuilding to assure a dry access from 9th Street and intersecting avenues.
- Floodplain Management Plan Committee will support studies to identify areas that could be isolated by elevating rights of way to be used as emergency access/egress and then pumped if necessary.

By Blue Diamond Disposal, Inc. to Choice Environmental Services of New

Jersey, Inc.

Blue Diamond Disposal, Inc. ("Blue Diamond") currently provides trash disposal and recycling collection services to the City pursuant to a contract with a term from February 1, 2013 to January 31, 2018.

On November 5, 2013, Blue Diamond sold assets, including its contract with Ocean City, to Choice Environmental Services of New Jersey, Inc. ("Choice").

Blue Diamond and Choice seek the approval of City Council of this change in contractor, which would be effective immediately.

Choice has submitted documentation acceptable to Joseph S. Clark, QPA and myself, evidencing its experience and qualifications, and demonstrating that Choice would have been a qualified bidder under the Local Public Contracts Law. Choice has also provided correspondence from its surety bonding company confirming that it will provide a performance bond in the amount specified in the bid package. The Jersey Shore Partnership is moving forward with its campaign to enlist support for increasing the \$25 million annual dedicated fund that provides stable funding for shore protection projects and serves as a catalyst for the State to acquire federal matching dollars.

Coastal replenishment projects are an investment in the Garden State's economy. There has been a \$7 saving in direct costs for every dollar the state has invested in mitigation projects supported by the Shore Protection Fund.

As we noted in our recent correspondence, you, as a Shore Mayor, are the most important stakeholder in this effort. We ask for your commitment to participate in this campaign by drafting a Municipal resolution to the members of the New Jersey Legislature that details the urgency for increasing the Shore Protection Fund. We attach the resolution drafted by the Borough of Avalon as a reference in preparing your resolution.

At this time, we request that you confirm your municipality's intention to draft a resolution at an upcoming Council meeting, or if you have already done so. Please e-mail Lauraannebuhler@yahoo.com with a brief response.

We will continue to build support for this campaign through Chambers of Commerce, not-for-profits, and business organizations that benefit from the Shore Protection Fund's projects along the 137 mile Jersey Shore Coast.
