### CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2014 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Allegretto, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Guinosso, Mr. Madden, Mr. McClellan, and Mr. Wilson. Also present: Mayor Gillian, Mr. Dattilo, Business Administrator and Ms. McCrosson, City Solicitor. Mr. Hartzell arrived at 7:13 pm.

Council President Wilson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute. He announced the meeting had been advertised in accordance with P.L. 1975, Chapter 231.

#### CITIZEN COMMENT

<u>Michael Hinchman, 281 West Atlantic Boulevard</u> – commented on the recent discussion on artificial turf related to the initial cost, the warranty, the maintenance and requested council look into the possible health issues.

## **REPORTS – MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION**

Mr. Dattilo reported on the following: there was \$152,000,000 in new construction this year; the City's tax assessor reported for tax year 2015 the average ratio for the city is 97.12 which is low in comparison to the rest of the county; the Army Corp will be opening bids tomorrow on the south end beach project. He said an update on the north end pump station should be ready shortly and that he was waiting for information from the design engineer and FEMA. Mr. Dattilo announced the unveiling of a portrait and renaming of the Library Lecture Hall as the Chris Maloney Lecture Hall in memory of the former Library Director.

### **REPORTS – CITY COUNCIL**

Mr. McClellan announced the Environmental Commission is putting together a subcommittee to look at what is indigenous to the City that would be appropriate to plant in the curb strip area in front of residents' property.

Mr. Hartzell spoke briefly about the research he made regarding the use of artificial turf and said he reached out to several universities such as Penn State University who has a Department of Artificial Surface and said he has independent studies showing there are no affects of Mrsa or Staph infections and injuries were reduced using artificial turf.

## ORDINANCES: INTRODUCTION & FIRST READING

Mr. Wilson and Mr. Hartzell announced they would recuse themselves from voting on this ordinance and stepped away from the table. Mr. Allegretto, Vice President asked for a motion to introduce Ordinance #14-39 on first reading. Motion moved by Mr. McClellan; seconded by Mr. Madden. All ayes followed, except Mr. Wilson and Mr. Hartzell who recused from voting. The clerk read the ordinance by title: #14-39: An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Chapter XXV, Zoning and Land Development of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City Building Height (DB Zone). Ms. McCrosson explained the ordinance addresses height in the Drive-In Business Zone to permit building height of 32 feet for a flat roof and 38 feet for a pitched roof with height measured from BFE+1, rather than the center line of the street.

Mr. Guinosso addressed his concerns with three story structures.

Mr. Allegretto asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance #14-39 on first reading and publish according to law. Motion moved by Mr. McClellan; seconded by Mr. DeVlieger. All ayes followed. Mr. Allegretto announced Ordinance #14-39 will be sent to the Planning Board for Consistency Review with second reading and public hearing to be held on November 13, 2014.

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to introduce Ordinance #14-30 on first reading. Motion moved by Mr. Hartzell; seconded by Mr. Guinosso. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title: #14-40: An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Chapter XXV, Zoning and Land Development of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City Zoning Flood Elevation. Ms. McCrosson explained the Zoning Flood Elevation is currently taken as the elevation at the top of the lowest habitable floor (BFE+2), subject to exceptions where the base flood elevation is below grade, on non-alley lots less than 45' in width and in X zones. The revised definition changes the point from which building height is measured to be Zonign Flood Elevation plus 3 (ZFE+3).

Mr. Guinosso said he has concerns with the height of the buildings especially the attics which he feels will be used as additional living space.

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance #14-40 on first reading and publish according to law. Motion moved by Mr. Guinosso; seconded by Mr. Hartzell. All ayes followed. Mr. Wilson announced Ordinance #14-40 will be sent to the Planning Board for Consistency Review with second reading and public hearing to be held on November 13, 2014.

#### ORDINANCES: SECOND READING AND PUBLIC HEARING

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to take up Ordinance #14-35 on second reading and public hearing. Motion moved by Mr. Hartzell; seconded by Mr. Guinosso. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title: #14-35: A Refunding Bond Ordinance of the City of Ocean City, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey, Providing for the Advance Refunding of all or a portion of General Improvement Bonds, Appropriating \$6,020,000 Therefor and Authorizing the Issuance by the City of General Improvement Refunding Bonds in the Aggregate Principal Amount of Not Exceeding \$6,020,000 for Financing the Cost

Mr. Donato predicted a net saving of \$200,000 contingent upon the market rates are now around 2%. issued in 2006 at a lower interest rate. Mr. Donato said the bond is currently financed at an interest rate of 4%; Thereof. Mr. Donato explained the ordinance allows the City to refinance the remainder of a Serial bond
