CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, DECEMBER 18, 2014 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Allegretto, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Guinosso, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. Madden, Mr. McClellan, and Mr. Wilson. Also present: Mayor Gillian, Mr. Dattilo, Business Administrator and Ms. McCrosson, City Solicitor.

Council President Wilson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute. He announced the meeting had been advertised in accordance with P.L. 1975, Chapter 231.

CITIZEN COMMENT

<u>Maryann Vilotti, 108 Bartram Lane</u> – wanted a better understanding about the newly installed pumps in Merion Park which were intended to reduce flooding.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to adopt the Regular City Council Meeting Minutes of Thursday, December 4, 2014 (Mr. Wilson was absent). Motion moved by Mr. McClellan; seconded by Mr. Guinosso. All ayes followed.

REPORTS - MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION

Mr. Dattilo announced on January 17th the annual Martin Luther King ceremony would be held at the high school followed by a Day of Service on January 18th. Mr. Dattilo addressed the citizen comments of Mrs. Vilotti concerns regarding the pumps in Merion Park and provided an update on the boardwalk project, the south end beach project, various paving projects and spoke about new concept sketches for the 29th Street Fire House which was severely damaged by Super Storm Sandy.

Councilman Hartzell and Councilman McClellan said they will be sending out a flyer to every church and community organization requesting them to send 10 people to participate in the Day of Service.

Mr. Allegretto updated Council on a recent BAND Meeting and provided an update on the Tourist Development Commission stating a presentation was made on their marketing campaigns.

Mr. Hartzell spoke regarding a matter related to a prior vote of Mr. Guinosso on the skate park. Mr. Guinosso clarified his reasons regarding his vote on the skate park.

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to introduce Ordinance #14-45 on second reading. Motion moved by Mr. Allegretto; seconded by Mr. Madden. All ayes followed. *Immediately following role call, Mr. Wilson changed his aye vote and recused himself from voting on the ordinance and turned the meeting over to Council Vice President Allegretto. The clerk read the ordinance by title: #14-45: An Ordinance Authorizing the Execution of a Lease Between the City of Ocean City and Greater Ocean City Theatre Company, Inc. For the Lease of Municipal Lands (1501 West Avenue, Block 1504, Lot 15). Mr. Allegretto requested an explanation. Ms. McCrosson explained the ordinance permits the Administration to execute a lease with the Ocean City Theatre Company for the use of an empty city building. A State law permits the city to lease municipal land that is not in use to non-profits. The annual rental fee would be \$1.00.

PUBLIC COMMENT – There was no comment on Ordinance #14-45.

The consensus of Council members was positive in support of Ordinance #14-45.
