The demolition and disposal of docks and other marina structures located at 201-07 West 10<sup>th</sup> Street and 920-30 Palen Avenue, Block 911, Lots 1, 1.01, 2, 2.01, 3, 3.01, 4, & 4.01, including but not limited to any associated professional or ancillary costs or any items incidental thereto.

### Section 4.

The Capital Budget of the City of Ocean City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistencies created hereby.

The Capital Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

### Section 1.

Chapter VII, Traffic, is revised to include the following penalty for violation:

### 7-4.1 Route for Trucks Over Four (4) Tons

Pursuant to R.S. 40:67-16.1, the streets or parts of streets as described in Schedule VI attached to and made a part of this Chapter are hereby designated as Route for Trucks Over Four (4) Tons. All trucks having a total combined gross weight of vehicle plus load in excess of four (4) tons shall be excluded from all streets except from those streets which form a part of the system of truck routes. Fines for violation of this ordinance shall be as follows:

- a. For a first violation a fine of not less than \$50 or more than \$500; and
- b. For second or subsequent violations, a fine of not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000.

All ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

### Section 3.

If any portion of this ordinance is declared to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

There is an ongoing quality of life and infrastructure issue that the residents of town have been enduring on Ocean City streets and neighborhoods for quite some time. The issue at hand is the established "Truck Route" which is violated city-wide on a daily occurrence.

### 7-4.1 Route for Trucks Over Four (4) Tons.

Pursuant to R.S. 40:67-16.1, the streets or parts of streets as described in Schedule VI attached to and made a part of this Chapter are hereby designated as Route for Trucks Over Four (4) Tons. All trucks having a total combined gross weight of vehicle plus load in excess of four (4) tons shall be excluded from all streets except from those streets which form a part of the system of truck routes. (Ord. #85-25; Ord. #93-7)

### SCHEDULE VI ROUTE FOR TRUCKS OVER FOUR (4) TONS

In accordance with the provisions of subsection 7-4.1, the following streets or parts of streets are hereby designated as Route for Trucks Over Four (4) Tons; all trucks having a total combined gross weight of vehicle plus load in excess in excess of four (4) tons shall be excluded from all other streets:

The violation of this truck route causes several issues. The residents who call and complain normally comment about the inconvenient times of day and the "shaking" of their home as these trucks drive down their streets, with speed normally mentioned as well. Also, these commercial vehicles are crossing through neighborhoods not designed for this type activity that include a bike path, playgrounds, schools, day care facilities, residential zoning, and unsignalized intersections.

I write this letter as a formal request to increase the current scheduled payable court fine of \$29/\$21 (\$50.00 total) to Non-payable - Court Appearance Required and a range for the violations of \$50 - \$500.00 total fine including court costs. This requested fee increase would be consistent with other enforceable construction related ordinances currently issued by the Police Department in Chapter 17 of 87-17.

The Police Department is, and has been, spending a significant amount of time addressing this serious issue where construction vehicles, tractor trailers, delivery trucks, etc. weighing over 8,000 pounds have been utilizing non-truck route roadways in Ocean City for their own convenience and cut through. Posted Truck Route directional arrow signs are throughout town and at all Bridge entry points into the municipality. Unfortunately, these signs alone are not effective in detouring the truck drivers to navigate on the correctly established routes designated by City Ordinance. (See attached route)

This fee increase will assist the Police to effectively deter this violation and stay consistent with other related ordinances.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 13-23**

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING A PORTION OF ORDINANCE 87-17, CHAPTER II, "BOARDS, AUTHORITIES AND COMMISSIONS" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

### Section 1.

Chapter II, "Boards, Authorities and Commissions", Sub-section 2-18D, "Utility Advisory Commission, is hereby revised to read as follows:

### UTILITY ADVISORY COMMISSION

### 2-18D.1 Creation.

There is hereby created the Ocean City Utility Advisory Commission. (Ord. #93-24, § 1)

### 2-18D.2 Purpose.

The purpose of the Utility Advisory Commission is to interact and communicate with utility organizations including but not limited to electric, gas, water, sewer, and television telephone, internet, cable companies, and municipal utility authorities who provide service to the citizens and residents of the City of Ocean City for the purposes of advising the Council of the City of Ocean City of issues of public importance concerning rate schedules, service, and other related issues. (Ord. #93-24, § 2)

### 2-18D.3 Number of Members; Term.

The Utility Advisory Commission shall consist of eleven (11) nine (9) members appointed by the City Council for four (4) year terms. All present members heretofore appointed by resolution of the City Council shall continue to serve for the remainder of their respective terms.

A member of the City Council, to be selected annually by the full Council, shall act as liaison to the Advisory Commission and shall have a right to attend and participate in all meetings, but shall not have a right to vote.

Members of the Utility Advisory Commission shall serve without compensation. (Ord. #93-24, § 3)

### 2-18D.4 Duties and Responsibilities.

The Utility Advisory Commission shall monitor the requests for rate increases, changes, and changes in service by all public and municipal utilities, analyze their effect upon the property owners and residents of Ocean City and advise the Council accordingly with recommendations where appropriate. Additionally, the Commission shall advise the City Council of significant developments which may affect service provided by said utilities to the property owners of the City of Ocean City.

Following its advice and recommendations to City Council, the Commission shall take such actions as the Council directs concerning proposed rate hikes, or other actions of the utility which may adversely impact upon the City of Ocean City.

In the event that Utility Advisory Commission recommendations are not acted on by City Council or City Administration, the Commission will continue to monitor the situation and provide updates as necessary. If in the opinion of the Utility Advisory Commission the situation is deemed important and of considerable priority, a meeting of City Administration, Council and Commission Officers will be requested. (Ord. #93-24, § 4)

### 2-18D.5 Organization.

- a. The Utility Advisory Commission shall meet monthly six (6) times annually and at such other times as it deems necessary and advisable.
- b. The Commission shall be headed by a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson who shall be elected annually by the Commission membership. The Commission shall also elect from its membership a Secretary. The Commission shall approve minutes of its meetings and forward a copy to the City Clerk to be kept on file and shall report annually to the City Council on its work.

- c. In the performance of its duties, the Commission shall be authorized, through its Chairperson, to seek information and opinions from the City solicitor and other professional staff retained by the City of Ocean City as approved by the Mayor or Business Administrator. The Commission, however, shall not have the right to enter into intervention or employ any experts itself without the prior written approval of the City Council.
- d. In the performance of its duties, the Commission shall be entitled to reimbursement for reasonable incidental expenses as approved by the Business Administrator.

### Section 2.

All ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

### Section 3.

If any portion of this ordinance is declared to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

This firm represents L.R. Costanzo Co., Inc. ("LRC"). On July 23, 2013, LRC submitted a bid to perform work under the above-referenced Contract. LRC was the lowest bidder; however, its bid was based on an unintentional but significant error. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23.3 of the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law ("LPCL"), LRC hereby requests that its bid be withdrawn.

Under the LPCL, a mistake is defined as a "clerical error that is an unintentional and substantial computational error or an unintentional omission of a substantial quantity of labor, material, or both, from the final bid computation." In this instance, LRC's bid proposal unintentionally omitted all costs in connection with the pneumatic flood barrier specification section and the waterproofing sketch, which were attached as part of "Addendum #1" to the bid package.

Please see the attachment at Tab "A" to this correspondence, which is a complete copy of LRC's estimate. You will notice that the costs associated with the flood barrier specification and waterproofing are not listed on LRC's estimate. Since recognizing its mistake, LRC has

obtained pricing for the omitted work, which—without accounting for any overhead and markup—amounts to well in excess of \$200,000 in additional costs.

If not for this clerical oversight, LRC would <u>not</u> have been low bidder on the project. The added costs for the work omitted from the bid proposal would result in expenditures by LRC well in excess of the bid price and would force LRC to perform the contract at a financial loss—which would be an unconscionable result. The costs for the items omitted from LRC's bid constitute more than twenty percent of LRC's initial proposal. Because a material feature of the bid proposal (i.e., its scope and pricing) has been significantly impacted by the error, withdrawal of the bid is appropriate under the LPCL.

LRC takes great care in the preparation of its bids, but despite LRC's diligent efforts and internal controls, this mistake occurred as a result of accidental oversight and human error. Nonetheless, withdrawal of LRC's bid at this time would not prejudice the City of Ocean City, as several other firms have submitted bids in connection with the above-referenced Project. Accordingly, the work may be performed without any undue delay.

For the reasons expressed above, I respectfully request that the City of Ocean City grant LRC's bid withdrawal request, pursuant to the LPCL.

I thank you in advance for your consideration. L.R. Costanzo Co., Inc. looks forward to doing business with the City of Ocean City on another occasion. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions.

The City has been an entitlement community under the US Dept. of Housing and Urban Development since 2004. The City has undertaken the necessary steps in order to receive Community Development Block Grants totaling over \$2M during this time period. The majority of funds have been spent on ADA improvements to streets, traffic signals, buildings, and boardwalks.

US Dept. of Housing and Urban Development requires entitlement communities to establish an Annual Plan each year. The Annual Plan is based on the Consolidated Plan that runs for 5 years. Our current Consolidated Plan expires in 2013. Every three years the City solicits Proposals from qualified Professional Firms for technical assistance in meeting the necessary requirements of the grant process. Costs are secured for anticipated needs over the next three years. An annual contract is awarded.

The City has contracted in the past with the firm of Mullin & Lonergan, Associates, Inc., to provide technical assistance for the CDBG program. The firm has been outstanding in their service and economical in cost. All costs associated with their contract are chargeable to the grant. This type of administration cost cannot exceed twenty percent of the annual allotment.

We recommend award of Professional Service Contract RFP Q11-011 to Mullin & Lonergan, Associates, Inc., Northeast and Bucks Company, T/A Mullin & Lonergan Associates, 800 Vinial Street, Suite B414, Pittsburgh, PA 15212. They have an auxiliary office in Harrisburg, PA which serves our locale. The annual contract will cover the CDBG FY of September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014.

Michael Baker Jr., Inc. (Baker) is pleased to submit a revised Scope of Work and Fixed Price Cost Proposal for Conceptual Design and Final Design for the City's Merion Park Drainage and Roadway Improvement Project as discussed during a conference call on July 19, 2013. Per City's request, the proposed scope of work is reduced by excluding drainage system areas 1B, 6, 7 &8, (as shown on Figure 1), and eliminating the supplemental survey task. (Supplemental survey to be provided by others). The revised Scope of Work includes the following:

#### Part 1:

Analysis of the existing drainage system for the Merion Park area and development of a conceptual drainage design for the entire area, as requested by the City on January 10, 2013 following the meeting with the Merion Park residents.

#### Part 2:

Final Design and contract documents for a proposed drainage system and associated roadway improvements. Effort includes coordination with City's surveyor to obtain supplementary survey and preparing required permit application, as requested by the City on July 18, 2013.

As discussed previously, to expedite the development of conceptual design, Baker utilized the funding from the original proposal dated July 6, 2012 allocated for the Construction Management task to complete Part 1. The fee proposal included herein estimates the total fee required for Part 2 and provides a credit for remaining funding from the original proposal (as of the date of this letter). Once the design is completed and the extent of construction work to be performed is more clearly defined, a scope of work and fee proposal for the Construction Management task will be prepared for your consideration.

The fixed price cost for the above additional effort defined in Part 2, including the credit for remaining funds, is \$328,050. Accounting for the work performed using the original funds results in total fixed price for the entire project of \$395,950. A detailed breakdown of the effort is included for your review, along with the scope of work.

### INTRODUCTION

Merion Park is a small single family community located near the 34th Street Bridge in Ocean City, New Jersey. It is a quiet neighborhood that was built along the wetlands and marshlands surrounded by the bay. This area has recently undergone a transformation from 2 bedroom bungalows built in the 1950's to newly constructed estates. These homes sit on low lying areas that are prone to flooding during small storm events and intermittently at high tide. As requested by the City of Ocean City (City), Michael Baker, Jr., Inc. (Baker) has been tasked to review the existing drainage system and develop a conceptual drainage scheme to decrease the chance for recurring flooding in this area. The conceptual drainage improvements will rehabilitate the eight (8) individual drainage systems identified in the neighborhood. These eight drainage systems, some over sixty years old, were determined through field visits, township meetings, and available survey to be in many cases functionally obsolete. Based on the field observations and discussions with the City and the residents it is assumed that the system is not a closed system anymore and therefore it is allowing rising groundwater to enter the pipes causing daily flooding throughout the area. In order to correct the long-standing concerns of the residents, the drainage systems will be reconstructed with minor grading improvements where possible to address the frequent flooding issues, improve gutter spread along the roadway, increase pipe capacity through pipe size increases and slope where feasible, and improve safety and operational concerns of the roadways and driveways throughout the neighborhood.

A conceptual design to address flooding concerns was prepared by the City; however, Baker was requested to perform a detailed review and analysis of the existing drainage system for the Merion Park area and develop a Conceptual Drainage Design (see Figure 1) for the entire area (See Part 1). On Tuesday April 9, 2013, Baker presented the Conceptual Drainage Design to City Officials. The presentation included a review of the existing drainage analysis and the proposed concepts. The City understands the magnitude of the improvements have a preliminary cost of at \$3.9M. The City requested Baker to present the same information to the Merion Park Residents "Committee". This meeting was held the same day with approximately 15 residents in attendance. The residents were very receptive of the existing drainage analysis findings and proposed conceptual improvements. The proposed improvements presented to the City and the residents were conceptual and based on a number of assumptions due to limited information available (i.e. survey limitations, existing utilities information, etc.). The residents also understand the limitations of the proposed drainage system during high tide events due to the existing topography. Following the meeting, Baker was requested to provide a proposal to develop Final Design documents for the new drainage system and roadway improvements to reduce flooding. Through this improvement effort, the drainage system will be brought up to current design standards to improve the drainage of Merion Park where achievable (See Part 2). Baker will also replace an existing asphalt berm with a bulkhead due to the poor performance of the asphalt berm.

### SCOPE OF SERVICES

### PART 1: CONCEPTUAL DRAINAGE DESIGN (work performed under original Contract)

- A. Attend Preliminary Meeting with Merion Park Residents. Baker will attend a meeting with City officials and Merion Park residents to discuss drainage problems they are currently encountering.
- B. Perform Field investigation and evaluate existing storm sewer system. Baker will perform a field inventory of existing stormwater facilities throughout the entire Merion Park neighborhood area and field review problems described at the meeting with the residents.

### Conceptual Drainage Design and Final Design

- C. Review previous design, reports, and presentations from City. Baker will review previous design documents prepared by the City to improve the drainage issues within the Merion Park neighborhood.
- Delineate Existing Drainage Areas. Baker will evaluate the existing conditions and drainage areas using available topographic maps, aerials, design plans and survey information to determine the drainage patterns and inlet capture areas for the neighborhood. Existing ground cover will be noted within each drainage area.
- E. Input existing information and drainage areas into Storm and Sanitary Program. Baker will evaluate each drainage area to determine the peak flow and runoff volume generated for specific design storms. The existing drainage system will be input and evaluated through the use of Bentley's InRoads Storm and Sanitary Program. Inlet spread, pipe capacity and hydraulic grade lines for the existing system will be calculated and assessed to determine existing system deficiencies.
- F. Evaluate Existing System and Develop Proposed Improvements. Based on the results of the existing conditions entered in Storm and Sanitary, Baker will calibrate and adjust the system to mimic in-situ flooding conditions based on field observations and interviews with local residents. Baker will develop proposed alternatives to improve the drainage conditions where needed.
- G. Input Conceptual Drainage System into Storm and Sanitary. Baker will evaluate conceptual drainage alternatives using Bentley's InRoads Storm and Sanitary program to model the new drainage improvements.
- H. Evaluate Conceptual Drainage Design. Baker will finalize the best fit alternative to improve the drainage issues at Merion Park. A proposed improvement plan will be developed to show areas of disturbance and the new drainage system. Baker will develop a preliminary cost estimate for the conceptual improvements. The alternative drainage design analysis will be documented in a Summary of Findings Memo prepared by Baker.
- I. Prepare Presentation for the City. Baker will prepare a presentation to depict the existing conditions and conceptual drainage improvements to the city officials.
- J. Present Drainage Concept Development to Merion Park Residents. Baker will present findings discovered during the study and present alternative drainage designs to the City and residents of Merion Park.

### PART 2: FINAL DESIGN - DRAINAGE AND ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

- A. Review of Plans and Studies. Baker will hold a kick-off meeting and further review available information available from the City. This effort will include a review of the plans, specifications, existing survey, and as-built data provided by the City (including any information not previously supplied to Baker).
- **B.** Survey Activities. As discussed during a conference call on 7/18/13, supplemental survey will be provided by the City. Baker will coordinate with the City surveyor to obtain the required supplemental survey described below:

### Work to be performed by others:

City land surveyor to conduct survey services to collect additional field data and update existing mapping provided by the City. The survey will include, but is not limited to, the following:

- 1. Roadway cross sections at 50' intervals including top/bottom of curb, roadway crown, sidewalks, and driveways. Lateral limits to be approximately 15' beyond the sidewalk or 20-25' beyond the curb.
- 2. Drainage structure locations with inlets and manholes, rims, grates, pipe sizes, inverts and outlet structures.
- 3. Sanitary Sewer locations with manholes, pipe sizes, and inverts.
- 4. Locate existing above ground utility features.
- 5. Bulkhead elevations and locations of any other bulkhead, retaining walls, or levees surrounding the neighborhood.
- 6. Stream/channel cross sections 100' beyond the each outfall at 25' intervals. (Width to be determined based on channel topography)
- 7. Establish horizontal and vertical Control in New Jersey State Coordinate System (NAD 1983 and NAVD 1988).

Field notes will be provided in the Final Design Report to provide topographic and base mapping for the project. Additional supplemental survey will be available during the design phase to accommodate additional details not originally anticipated in the development of the base mapping. All survey base mapping will be completed in MicroStation. It is assumed existing mapping for the project area will be provided by the City.

- C. Geotechnical Services. Baker will conduct Geotechnical Borings for the proposed bulkhead construction activities. In addition, geotechnical borings and soils samples may be conducted to meet the NJDEP Stormwater Rules for water quantity, quality, and groundwater recharge. All geotechnical design and analysis will be summarized in a Geotechnical Memorandum.

- E. Drainage Analysis. The NJDEP Stormwater Management Rules indicate that projects with greater than an acre of new land disturbance, or with an increase in impervious area of greater than 0.25 acres, must comply with the NJDEP Stormwater Rules. Due to the limit of disturbance outlined in the Conceptual Design, the project is considered a major development and will need to comply with the NJ Stormwater Rules (NJAC 7:8), the NJ Flood Hazard Area Control Act (FHACA) Rules (NJAC 7:13) and the NJ Standards for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control. Baker will design measures to meet stormwater quantity, quality, recharge, and non-structural stormwater management strategies to the maximum extent practicable. The storm drainage design criteria will be based on the NJDOT Roadway Design Manual and the General Provisions of the City of Ocean City for proposed construction activities. All stormwater and drainage design calculations, plans, maps, and details will be prepared and submitted in the Stormwater Management and Drainage Design Report for review and approval.

The revised drainage plan will be designed to meet the City's local ordinances, but more importantly be designed to drain the area during low tide. Residents have expressed the need for nuisance flooding during dry periods to be alleviated. The new drainage system will remedy the more frequent nuisance storms and handle greater and less frequent storms when the tide is low. This will be achieved with efficiently sized and sloped pipes, concrete gutter systems, new inlets, and protected outfalls.

F. Permits. Based on the Conceptual Design, Baker anticipates permit applications will be required. Baker will prepare permit applications for a NJDEP Waterfront Development Act Permit, Coastal Area Facilities Review Act Permit, and Coastal Wetlands Act Permit in accordance with the Coastal Permit Program Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:7) and the Coastal Zone Management Rules (NJAC 7:7E). As described above, a Stormwater Management Plan will be prepared to comply with the NJDEP Stormwater Management Rules (NJAC 7:8) and submitted with the NJDEP permit applications for review and approval by the NJDEP. Baker will request and attend a pre-application meeting with the NJDEP to verify environmental permitting requirements. An application for USACE Nationwide Permit 3 for

maintenance will also be prepared to authorize removal of accumulated sediments from the vicinity of the existing outfalls. In addition, Baker will prepare Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Plan Certification and submit the required documents to the local Soil Conservation District. Construction activities associated with the reconstruction of outfalls may occur within NJDEP Green Acres encumbered property. Coordination with the NJDEP Green Acres Program will be required to obtain authorization to temporarily occupy the property during construction.

Baker will perform wetland delineation to establish the limits of jurisdictional wetlands regulated by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). A request for Jurisdictional Determination will be prepared and submitted to the USACE.

The effort to perform the required permits includes the following assumptions:

- Cultural resources surveys are not included. Based on available geospatial data, the proposed improvements are not located within the immediate vicinity of any architectural resource listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. Additionally, ground disturbance activities will be limits to areas already disturbed or tidal waters and as such, archaeological surveys are not included.
- 2. The project area does not contain habitat for federally listed threatened and endangered species. As such, coordination with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service or the National Marine Fisheries Service is not included.
- 3. The project will not result in adverse impacts to Essential Fish Habitat and as such, consultation with the National Marine Fisheries Service is not included.
- 4. Required Permit fees will be provided by the City.
- G. Riparian License Application. It is assumed that reconstruction of the drainage outfalls will require coordination with Tidelands Bureau. Baker will investigate the required limits of riparian license needed during construction and will prepare required Riparian License Maps and Application to be submitted to the Tidelands Bureau. City of Ocean City will submit the applications and required license fees.
- H. Utilities. Baker will begin utility engineering efforts immediately upon notice of award of contract by conducting data collection and identification and coordination with the utility owners. Any critical issues that would potentially impact design or construction scheduling including seasonal outage restrictions, clearance requirements, easement and/or ROW requirements, and possible future build plans will be discussed early on with the utility owners so that the impacts can be addressed in the design construction schedule. Only minor water, sanitary, and gas service utility impacts are anticipated at the new drainage pipe locations. In order to avoid or minimize utility company involvement and costs, utility service conflicts will be relocated by a Utility Company approved sub-contractor retained by the General Contractor. A Utility Company inspector will be on-site during construction to oversee conflict resolutions. Baker will obtain test pits to verify the location of the existing utilities in the potential conflict locations. It is assumed 12 test pits will be needed. It is assumed that utility agreements will not be needed for the minor utility relocations anticipated.
- I. Project Management and Meetings. Project Management will include coordination with the City, staff assignments, oversight of the technical work, Quality Assurance / Quality Control of the performed work for compliance with the contract scope of services, schedule and budget.
- J. Review bids. Baker will review all the bids and provide a letter of award or rejection of bids within

three (3) business days from receiving the bids.

K. Construction Engineering Services. Baker will review shop drawings, provide responses to RFI's and attend required meetings during the construction period. This scope of work does not include preparation of As-Builts, as these are assumed to be prepared by the Contractor.
