CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, APRIL 13, 2017 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Barr, Ms. Bergman, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. McClellan, Mr. Wilson and Mr. Madden. Present also was Mayor Jay A. Gillian, Director of Community Services, Michael Allegretto and Solicitor, Dorothy McCrosson.

Council President Peter Madden called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Ms. Bergman led the prayer. Mr. Madden announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

<u>Donna Baker-701 Moore Avenue</u> – Ms. Baker asked about the status of the north end pumping station.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to approve the Regular City Council Meeting Minutes of Thursday, March 23, 2017. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. Wilson. All ayes followed.

REPORTS - MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION:

Mayor Gillian replied in regard to the question about the north end pumping station. The design was triple the budget and the plan is to move forward with multiple pumping stations rather than just one. Baker Engineering is redesigning the pump stations with smaller pipes and the goal is to get more done while spending less money. There will be a town hall meeting to discuss options and the grant money is still in place. The city expects to go out to bid in the summer and award the project in the fall.

Mr. Allegretto spoke about several projects happening on 9th Street; all are moving forward and making good progress. Also, materials are being removed from the CDF site and dredging will start. Mr. Allegretto also spoke about the many events planned as spring is a busy and fun time; concert tickets are now on sale for shows that will be at the Music Pier and he encourages everyone to purchase tickets.

Ordinance No. 17-07 - An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Chapter XVII (Streets, Sidewalks and Sanitation) of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City As They Pertain To Concrete

Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson explained that this ordinance states that the owner shall be responsible to safeguard the site until the concrete is set and cured so as to prevent the concrete from being defaced, injured or damaged. In the event sidewalk, concrete flat work, curb or driveway is defaced, injured or damaged before it is set and cured, the owner shall replace the defaced, injured or damaged concrete within fourteen (14) days of the damage.

There was some discussion between the governing body and Ms. McCrosson.

Mr. Madden opened the meeting up for public comment on Ordinance No. 17-07. There was not anyone from the public who wished to speak. Mr. Madden closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 17-07 on second reading and public hearing. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Ms. Bergman. All ayes followed.
