ORIDNANCE NO. 17-15

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY TO CONVEY ITS INTEREST IN THE LAND KNOWN AS BLOCK 611.11, LOTS 122 and 131 TO NICHOLAS TALOTTA, SR. (50% OWNER) AND THE FAMILY TRUST CREATED BY THE VERONICA P. TALOTTA REVOCABLE TRUST AGREEMENT DATED NOVEMBER 13,2008 (50% OWNER) IN EXCHANGE FOR A DEED OF DEDICATION AND PERPETUAL STORM DAMAGE REDUCTION EASEMENT

BE IT ORDIAINED by the Mayor and council of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows: Section 1. Findings of Fact.

- A. Nicholas Talotta is a Plaintiff in the matter of Petrozzi, *el als* v. City of Ocean City *el als.*, pending in the Superior Court of New Jersey under Docket No. CPM-L-218-05 ("the Petrozzi suit"); and ,
- B. Daniel T. Hughes and Phyllis M. Hughes ("the Hughes") are also Plaintiffs in the Petrozzi suit; and,
- C. Nicholas Talotta, Sr., individually (50% owner) and the Family Trust created by the Veronica P. Talotta Revocable Trust Agreement dated November 13, 2008 (50% owner) (collectively, "the Talottas") are the owners of the real property shown on the current tax map of the City of Ocean City as Block 3401, Lot 15 commonly known as 3422-3424 Wesley Avenue ("the Talotta Home"); and,
- D. The City of Ocean City ("the City") owns a portion of vacated Wesley Avenue which is contiguous to the Talotta Home, comprised of two (2) 40' x 50' unimproved beach lots shown on the City's current tax map as Block 611.11, Lots 122 and 131 ("the Vacated Wesley Avenue Lots"); and,
- E. The City has a Perpetual Storm Damage Reduction Easement over the Vacated Wesley Avenue Lots but does not otherwise need them for public use; and,
- F. The Vacated Wesley Avenue Lots cannot be developed under the Ocean City Zoning Ordinances and have market nominal value; and,
- G. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13, the City has confirmed in writing that no owner of property contiguous to the Vacated Wesley Avenue Lots, other than the Talottas is interested in acquiring said Lots; and,
- H. The Talottas and the Hughes have agreed to settle the claims they asserted in the Petrozzi suit and dismiss all of their claims arising in and from the facts asserted therein in exchange for a conveyance of the Vacated Wesley Avenue Lots from the City to the Talottas; and,
- I. The City is authorized to transfer the Vacated Wesley Avenue Lots to the Talottas by N.J.S.A.40A:12-13(b)(5); and,
- J. The Talottas are the owners of that beach lot known as Block 3400, Lot 5 ("the Talotta Beach Lot"); and,
- K. The City is in need of a Perpetual Storm Damage Reduction Easement over the Talotta Beach Lot for future beach maintenance and nourishment; and,
- L. As pary of the settlement of the claims of Nicholas Talotta and the claims of the Hughes in the Petrozzi suit, and as consideration for the conveyance of the Vacated Wesley Avenue Lots to the Talottas, the Talottas have agreed to grant to the City a Perpetual Storm Damage Reduction Easement over the Talotta Beach Lot;
- M. It is in the best interests of the City of Ocean City to resolve the Petrozzi Suit and to obtain a Perpetual Storm Damage Reduction Easement over the Talotta Beach Lot; and, Section 2. Authorizing Sale of the Property.

The City of Ocean City is hereby authorized to convey to Nicholas Talotta, Sr., individually (50% owner) and the Family Trust created by the Veronica P. Talotta Revocable Trust Agreement dated November 13, 2008 (50% owner) all of its right, title of interest, if any, in and to the land shown on the current tax map of the City of Ocean City as Block 611.11, Lots 122 and 131. The descriptions of the property to be conveyed are set forth on the attached Exhibit A, and the property is depicted on the Exhibit B. The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to execute appropriate documents to effectuate the sale.

Section 3.

If any portion of this ordinance is declared to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

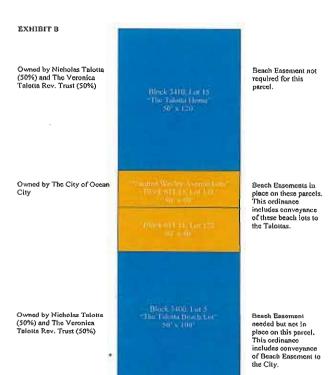

ORDINANCE #17-16

AN ORDINANCE REVISING CHAPTER XXI, FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION, OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY, NEW JERSEY (2017 Update)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1.

THE FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE

Required changes highlighted in BLUE Unique and to be revised data highlighted in YELLOW

SECTION 1.0 21-1 STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION, FINDINGS OF FACT, PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

21-1.1 STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION

The Legislature of the State of New Jersey has in N.J.S.A. 40:48-1, et seq., delegated the responsibility to local governmental units to adopt regulations designed to promote public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry. Therefore, the City Council of the City of Ocean City of Cape May County, New Jersey does ordain as follows:

21-1.2 FINDINGS OF FACT

- a) The flood hazard areas of the City of Ocean City are subject to periodic inundation which results in loss of life and property, health and safety hazards, disruption of commerce and governmental services, extraordinary public expenditures for flood protection and relief, and impairment of the tax base, all of which adversely affect the public health, safety, and general welfare.
- b) These flood losses are caused by the cumulative effect of obstructions in areas of special flood hazard which increase flood heights and velocities, and when inadequately anchored, causes damage in other areas. Uses that are inadequately floodproofed, elevated or otherwise protected from flood damage also contribute to the flood loss.

21-1.3 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

It is the purpose of this ordinance to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare, and to minimize public and private losses due to flood conditions in specific areas by provisions designed to:

- a) Protect human life and health:
- b) Minimize expenditure of public money for costly flood control projects;
- c) Minimize the need for rescue and relief efforts associated with flooding and generally undertaken at the expense of the general public;
- d) Minimize prolonged business interruptions;
- e) Minimize damage to public facilities and utilities such as water and gas mains, electric, telephone and sewer lines, streets, bridges located in areas of special flood hazard;
- f) Help maintain a stable tax base by providing for the sound use and development of areas of special flood hazard so as to minimize future flood blight areas;
- g) Ensure that potential buyers are notified that property is in an area of special flood hazard; and
- h) Ensure that those who occupy the areas of special flood hazard assume responsibility for their actions.

21-1.4 METHODS OF REDUCING FLOOD LOSSES

In order to accomplish its purposes, this ordinance includes methods and provisions for:

- a) Restricting or prohibiting uses which are dangerous to health, safety, and property due to water or erosion hazards, or which result in damaging increases in erosion or in flood heights or velocities;
- b) Requiring that uses vulnerable to floods including facilities which serve such uses, be protected against flood damage at the time of initial construction;
- c) Controlling the alteration of natural floodplains, stream channels, and natural protective barriers, which help accommodate or channel flood waters;

- d) Controlling filling, grading, dredging, and other development which may increase flood damage; and,
- e) Preventing or regulating the construction of flood barriers which will unnaturally divert flood waters or which may increase flood hazards in other areas.

SECTION 21-2.0 DEFINITIONS

Unless specifically defined below, words or phrases used in this ordinance shall be interpreted so as to give them the meaning they have in common usage and to give this ordinance its most reasonable application.

Advisory Base Flood Elevation (ABFE) - The elevation shown on a community's Advisory Flood Hazard Area Map that indicates the advisory stillwater elevation plus wave effect (ABFE = SWEL + wave effect) resulting from a flood that has a one percent (1 %) or greater chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year.

Advisory Flood Hazard Area (AFHA) - The land in the floodplain within a community subject to flooding from the one percent (1 %) annual chance event depicted on the Advisory Flood Hazard Area Map.

Advisory Flood Hazard Area Map - The official map on which the Federal Emergency Management Administration has delineated the areas of advisory flood hazards applicable to the community.

AO Zone- Areas subject to inundation by 1-percent-annual-chance shallow flooding (usually sheet flow on sloping terrain) where average depths are between one and three feet.

AH Zone- Areas subject to inundation by 1-percent-annual-chance shallow flooding (usually areas of ponding) where average depths are between one and three feet. Base Flood Elevations (BFEs) derived from detailed hydraulic analyses are shown in this zone

Appeal — A request for a review of the City's Construction Official's interpretation of any provision of this ordinance or a request for a variance.

Area of Shallow Flooding — A designated AO or AH zone on a community's Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (DFIRM) with a one percent annual or greater chance of flooding to an average depth of one to three feet where a clearly defined channel does not exist, where the path of flooding is unpredictable and where velocity flow may be evident. Such flooding is characterized by ponding or sheet flow.

Area of Special Flood Hazard — Land in the floodplain within a community subject to a one percent or greater chance of flooding in any given year. It is shown on the FIRM as Zone V, VE, VI-30, A, AO, AI-A30, AE, A99, or AH.

Base Flood — flood having a one percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year.

Base Flood Elevation (BFE) – The flood elevation shown on a published Flood Insurance Study (FIS) including the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM). For zones AE, AH, AO, and A1-30 the elevation represents the water surface elevation resulting from a flood that has a 1-percent or greater chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year. For zones VE and V1-30 the elevation represents the stillwater elevation (SWEL) plus wave effect (BFE = SWEL + wave effect) resulting from a flood that has a 1-percent or greater chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year.

Basement — Any area of the building having its floor subgrade (below ground level) on all sides.

Best Available Flood Hazard Data - The effective Flood Insurance Risk Maps or most recent Advisory Flood Hazard Area Maps FEMA has provided.

Best Available Flood Hazard Data Elevation - Is depicted on the effective FIRM or FIS, or an Advisory Flood Hazard Area Map or Advisory FIS.

Breakaway Wall — A wall that is not part of the structural support of the building and is intended through its design and construction to collapse under specific lateral loading forces without causing damage to the elevated portion of the building or supporting foundation system.

- Coastal A Zone The portion of the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) starting from a Velocity (V) Zone and extending up to the landward Limit of the Moderate Wave Action delineation. Where no V Zone is mapped the Coastal A Zone is the portion between the open coast and the landward Limit of the Moderate Wave Action delineation. Coastal A Zones may be subject to wave effects, velocity flows, erosion, scour, or a combination of these forces. Construction and development in Coastal A Zones is to be regulated the same as V Zones/Coastal High Hazard Areas.
- Coastal High Hazard Area An area of special flood hazard extending from offshore to the inland limit of a primary frontal dune along an open coast and any other area subject to high velocity wave action from storms or seismic sources.
- **Development** Any man made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or drilling operations, or storage of equipment or materials located within the area of special flood hazard.
- **Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (DFIRM)** The official map on which the Federal Insurance Administration has delineated both the areas of special flood hazards and the risk premium zones applicable to the community.
- Elevated Building A non-basement building (i) built, in the case of a building in an Area of Special Flood Hazard, to have the top of the elevated floor or, in the case of a building in a Coastal High-Hazard Area or Coastal A Zone, to have the bottom of the lowest horizontal structural member of the elevated floor, elevated above the base flood elevation plus freeboard by means of piling, columns (posts and piers), or shear walls parallel to the flow of the water, and (ii) adequately anchored so as not to impair the structural integrity of the building during a flood up to the magnitude of the base flood. In an Area of Special Flood Hazard "elevated building" also includes a building elevated by means of fill or solid foundation perimeter walls with openings sufficient to facilitate the unimpeded movement of flood waters. In Areas of Coastal High Hazard and Coastal A Zones "elevated buildings" also includes a building otherwise meeting the definition of "elevated building" even though the lower area is enclosed by means of breakaway walls.

Erosion — The process of gradual wearing away of land masses.

- Existing Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision A manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including, at a minimum, the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed before the effective date of the floodplain management regulations adopted by a community.
- **Flood or Flooding** A general and temporary condition of partial or complete inundation of normally dry land areas from:
 - a) The overflow of inland or tidal waters and/or
 - b) The unusual and rapid accumulation or runoff of surface waters from any source.
- Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) The official map on which the Federal Insurance Administration has delineated both the areas of special flood hazards and the risk premium zones applicable to the community.
- Flood Insurance Study (FIS) The official report in which the Federal Insurance Administration has provided flood profiles, as well as the Flood Insurance Rate Map(s) and the water surface elevation of the base flood.
- Floodplain Management Regulations Zoning ordinances, subdivision regulations, building codes, health regulations, special purpose ordinances (such as a floodplain ordinance, grading ordinance and erosion control ordinance) and other applications of police power. The term describes such State or local regulations, in any combination thereof, which provide standards for the purpose of flood damage prevention and reduction.
- Floodproofing Any combination of structural and nonstructural additions, changes, or adjustments to structures which reduce or eliminate flood damage to real estate or improved real property, water and sanitary facilities, structures and their contents.

Freeboard — A factor of safety usually expressed in feet above a flood level for purposes of flood plain management. "Freeboard" tends to compensate for the many unknown factors that could contribute to flood heights greater than the height calculated for a selected size flood conditions, such as wave action, bridge openings, and the hydrological effect of urbanization of the watershed.

Highest Adjacent Grade — The highest natural elevation of the ground surface prior to construction next to the proposed wexisting walls of a structure.

Historic Structure — Any structure that is:

- a) Listed individually in the National Register of Historic Places (a listing maintained by the Department of Interior) or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as meeting the requirements for individual listing on the National Register;
- b) Certified or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as contributing to the historical significance of a registered historic district or a district preliminarily determined by the Secretary to qualify as a registered historic district;
- c) Individually listed on a State inventory of historic places in States with historic preservation programs which have been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; or
- d) Individually listed on a local inventory of historic places in communities with historic preservation programs that have been certified either:
 - (1) By an approved State program as determined by the Secretary of the Interior; or
 - (2) Directly by the Secretary of the Interior in States without approved programs.

Limit of Moderate Wave Action (LiMWA) – Inland limit of the area affected by waves greater than 1.5 feet during the Base Flood. Base Flood conditions between the V Zone and the LiMWA will be similar to, but less severe than those in the V Zone.

- Lowest Floor The lowest floor of the lowest enclosed area [including basement]. An unfinished or flood resistant enclosure, useable solely for the parking of vehicles, building access or storage in an area other than a basement is not considered a building's lowest floor provided that such enclosure is not built so to render the structure in violation of other applicable non-elevation design requirements of 44 CFR Section 60.3.
- Manufactured Home A structure, transportable in one or more sections, which is built on a permanent chassis and is designed for use with or without a permanent foundation when attached to the required utilities. The term "manufactured home" does not include a "recreational vehicle".
- Manufactured Home Park or Manufactured Home Subdivision A parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two (2) or more manufactured home lots for rent or sale.
- New Construction Structures for which the start of construction commenced on or after the effective date of a floodplain regulation adopted by a community and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures.
- New Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision A manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including at a minimum, the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed on or after the effective date of the floodplain management regulations adopted by the municipality.
- Primary Frontal Dune A continuous or nearly continuous mound or ridge of sand with relatively steep seaward and landward slopes immediately landward and adjacent to the beach and subject to erosion and overtopping from high tides and waves from coastal storms. The inland limit of the primary frontal dune occurs at the point where there is a distinct change from the relatively steep slope to a relatively mild slope.
- Recreational Vehicle A vehicle which is [i] built on a single chassis; [ii] 400 square feet or less when measured at the longest horizontal projections; [iii] designed to be self-propelled or permanently towable by a light duty truck; and [iv] designed primarily not for use as a permanent dwelling but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel, or seasonal use
- Sand Dunes Naturally occurring or man-made accumulations of sand in ridges or mounds landward of the beach.

Start of Construction — For other than new construction or substantial improvements under the Coastal Barrier Resources Act (P.L. No. 97-348) includes substantial improvements and means the date the building permit was issued, provided the actual start of construction, repair, reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, placement, or other improvement was within 180 days of the permit date. The actual start means either the first placement of permanent construction of a structure on a site such as the pouring of a slab or footings, the installation of pilings, the construction of columns, or any work beyond the stage of excavation, or the placement of a manufactured home on a foundation.

Permanent construction does not include land preparation, such as clearing, grading and filling nor does it include the installation of streets and/or walkways, nor does it include excavation for a basement, footings or piers, or foundations or the erection of temporary forms, nor does it include the installation on the property of accessory buildings, such as garages or sheds not occupied as dwelling units or not part of the main structure. For a substantial improvement, the actual start of construction means the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of a building, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the building.

- **Structure** A walled and roofed building, a manufactured home, or a gas or liquid storage tank that is principally above ground.
- **Substantial Damage** Damage of any origin sustained by a structure whereby the cost of restoring the structure to its condition before damage would equal or exceed 50 percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.
- Substantial Improvement Any reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, or other improvement of a structure, the cost of which equals or exceeds 50 percent of the market value of the structure before the "start of construction" of the improvement. This term includes structures which have incurred "substantial damage", regardless of the actual repair work performed. The term does not, however, include either:
 - Any project for improvement of a structure to correct existing violations of State or local health, sanitary or safety code specifications which have been identified by the local code enforcement officer and which are the minimum necessary to assure safe living conditions; or
 - b) Any alteration of a "historic structure", provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a "historic structure".
- **Variance** A grant of relief from the requirements of this ordinance that permits construction in a manner that would otherwise be prohibited by this ordinance.

Violation — The failure of a structure or other development to be fully compliant with this ordinance. A new or substantially improved structure or other development without the elevation certificate, other certifications, or other evidence of compliance required in 44 CFR §60.3(b)(5), (c)(4), (c)(10), (e)(2), (e)(4), or (e)(5) is presumed to be in violation until such time as that documentation is provided.

SECTION 21-3.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

21-3.1 LANDS TO WHICH THIS ORDINANCE APPLIES

This ordinance shall apply to all areas of special flood hazards within the jurisdiction of the City of Ocean City, Cape May County, New Jersey.

21-3.2 BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD

The areas of special flood hazard for the City of Ocean City, Community No. 345310, are identified and defined on the following documents prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency:

- a) A scientific and engineering report "Flood Insurance Study, Cape May County, New Jersey (All Jurisdictions)" dated October 5, 2017.
- b) "Flood Insurance Rate Map for Cape May County, New Jersey (All Jurisdictions)" as shown on Index and panel(s) 34009C0069F, 34009C0088F, 34009C0086F 34009C0087F, 34009C0089F, 34009C0093F, 34009C0091F, 34009C0176F, 34009C0157F, 34009C0159F, whose effective date is October 5, 2017.
- c) Best Available Flood Hazard Data. These documents shall take precedence over effective panels and FIS in construction and development regulations only. Where the

effective mapping or Advisory Base Flood Elevation conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent requirement shall prevail.

The above documents are hereby adopted and declared to be a part of this ordinance. The Flood Insurance Study, maps and advisory documents are on file at 115 E 12th Street, Ocean City, New Jersey.

21-3.3 PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE

No structure or land shall hereafter be constructed re-located to, extended, converted, or altered without full compliance with the terms of this ordinance and other applicable regulations. Violation of the provisions of this ordinance by failure to comply with any of its requirements (including violations of conditions and safeguards established in connection with conditions) shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person who violates this ordinance or fails to comply with any of its requirements shall upon conviction thereof be fined not more than five hundred (\$500) or imprisoned for not more than ninety (90) days, or both, for each violation, and in addition shall pay all costs and expenses involved in the case. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the City of Ocean City from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation.

21-3.4 ABROGATION AND GREATER RESTRICTIONS

This ordinance is not intended to repeal, abrogate, or impair any existing easements, covenants, or deed restrictions. However, where this ordinance and other ordinance, easement, covenant, or deed restriction conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent restrictions shall prevail.

21-3.5 INTERPRETATION

In the interpretation and application of this ordinance, all provisions shall be:

- a) Considered as minimum requirements;
- b) Liberally construed in favor of the governing body; and,
- c) Deemed neither to limit nor repeal any other powers granted under State statutes.

21-3.6 WARNING AND DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

The degree of flood protection required by this ordinance is considered reasonable for regulatory purposes and is based on scientific and engineering considerations. Larger floods can and will occur on rare occasions. Flood heights may be increased by man-made or natural causes. This ordinance does not imply that land outside the area of special flood hazards or uses permitted within such areas will be free from flooding or flood damages.

This ordinance shall not create liability on the part of the City of Ocean City, any officer or employee thereof or the Federal Insurance Administration, for any flood damages that result from reliance on this ordinance or any administrative decision lawfully made thereunder.

21-3.7 CREATION AND MAINTENANCE OF A DUNE SYSTEM

In order to create and maintain a unified dune system, the City hereby adopts as its policy the report of Coastal and Marina Engineering Consultants, Inc. entitled "A Dune Establishment and Maintenance Program for the City of Ocean City, New Jersey" dated June 1, 1988. The creation and maintenance of sand dunes consistent with said report is hereby authorized, notwithstanding the provisions of any ordinance, including provisions of this Chapter to the contrary. The alteration of any existing sand dunes in order specifically to create and maintain other existing or new dunes is hereby authorized, provided the said alteration will not increase the flood potential of the property behind the sand dune so altered, and further provided that said action is undertaken by appropriate representatives of the City of Ocean City. (Ord. #13-31, § 21-3.7)

SECTION 21-4.0 ADMINISTRATION

21-4.1 ESTABLISHMENT OF DEVELOPMENT PERMIT

A Development Permit shall be obtained before construction or development begins, including placement of manufactured homes, within any area of special flood hazard established in section 21-3.2. Application for a Development Permit shall be made on forms furnished by the City's Construction Official and may include, but not be limited to; plans in duplicate drawn to scale showing the nature, location, dimensions, and elevations of the area in question; existing or proposed structures, fill, storage of materials, drainage facilities; and the location of the foregoing. Specifically, the following information is required:

- a) Elevation in relation to mean sea level, of the lowest floor (including basement) of all structures;
- b) Elevation in relation to mean sea level to which any structure has been floodproofed.
- c) Certification by a registered professional engineer or architect that the floodproofing methods for any nonresidential structure meet the floodproofing criteria in section 21-5.2-2; and.
- d) Description of the extent to which any watercourse will be altered or relocated as a result of proposed development.

21-4.2 DESIGNATION OF THE LOCAL ADMINISTRATOR

The City's Construction Official is hereby appointed to administer and implement this ordinance by granting or denying development permit applications in accordance with its provisions.

21-4.3 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ADMINISTRATOR

Duties of the City's Construction Official shall include, but not be limited to:

A. PERMIT REVIEW

- 1. Review all development permits to determine that the permit requirements of this ordinance have been satisfied.
- 2. Review all development permits to determine that all necessary permits have been obtained from those Federal, State or local governmental agencies from which prior approval is required.
- 3. Review all development permits in the coastal high hazard and Coastal A Zone area of the area of special flood hazard to determine if the proposed development alters sand dunes or other natural coastal protections so as to increase potential flood damage.
- 4. Review plans for walls to be used to enclose space below the base flood level in accordance with section 21-5.3-2 d).

B. USE OF OTHER BASE FLOOD DATA

When base flood elevation data has not been provided in accordance with section 21-3.2, BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD, the City's Construction Official shall obtain, review, and reasonably utilize any base flood elevation data available from a Federal, State or other source, in order to administer sections 21-5.2-1, SPECIFIC STANDARDS, RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION, and 21-5.2-2, SPECIFIC STANDARDS, NONRESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION.

C. INFORMATION TO BE OBTAINED AND MAINTAINED

- 1. Obtain and record the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures, and whether or not the structure contains a basement.
- 2. For all new or substantially improved floodproofed structures:
 - (a) Verify and record the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level); and
 - (b) Maintain the floodproofing certifications required in section 21-4.1c.
- 3. In coastal high hazard and Coastal A Zone areas, certification shall be obtained from a registered professional engineer or architect that the provisions of 21-5.3-2 a) and 21-5.3-2 b) a. and b. are met.
- 4. Maintain for public inspection all records pertaining to the provisions of this ordinance.

21-4.3-4 ALTERATION OF WATERCOURSES

- a) Notify adjacent communities and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Flood Control and the Land Use Regulation Program prior to any alteration or relocation of a watercourse, and submit evidence of such notification to the Federal Insurance Administration.
- b) Require that maintenance is provided within the altered or relocated portion of said watercourse so the flood carrying capacity is not diminished.

21-4.3-5 SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGE REVIEW

- After an event resulting in building damages, assess the damage to structures due to flood and non-flood causes.
- b) Record and maintain the flood and non-flood damage of substantial damage structures and provide a letter of Substantial Damage Determination to the owner and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Flood Control.

c) Ensure substantial improvements meet the requirements of sections 5.2-1, SPECIFIC STANDARDS, RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION, 5.2-2, SPECIFIC STANDARDS, NONRESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION and 5.2-3, SPECIFIC STANDARDS, MANUFACTURED HOMES:

21-4.3-6 INTERPRETATION OF FIRM BOUNDARIES

Make interpretations where needed, as to the exact location of the boundaries of the areas of special flood hazards (for example, where there appears to be a conflict between a mapped boundary and actual field conditions). The person contesting the location of the boundary shall be given a reasonable opportunity to appeal the interpretation as provided in section 4.4.

21-4.4 VARIANCE PROCEDURE

A. APPEAL BOARD

- 1. The Ocean City Planning Board shall serve as Ocean City's Flood Damage Prevention Appeal Board and as established by City Council shall hear and decide appeals and requests for variances from the requirements of this ordinance.
- (a) Notice of Applications.
- (1) Applications for appeal of decisions of the Construction Code Official, and applications for variances shall be filed with the Secretary to the Appeal Board. The application for appeal shall be filed on forms provided by the Appeal Board. When presenting the application, the applicant shall provide ten (10) copies of any plans, drawings, surveys, reports or other written documents upon which the applicant relied when seeking a development permit.
- (2) Notice of hearing for a variance pursuant to paragraph 21-4.4A(1)(2) shall be given to the owners of all real property as shown on the current tax duplicates, located within two hundred (200') feet in all directions of the property which is the subject of such hearing; provided that this requirement shall be deemed satisfied by notice to the (1) condominium association, in the case of any unit owner whose unit has a unit above or below it, or (2) horizontal property regime, in the case of any co-owner whose apartment has an apartment above or below it. Notice shall be given by: (1) serving a copy thereof on the property owner as shown on the said current tax duplicate, or his agent in charge of the property, or (2) mailing a copy thereof by certified mail to the property owner at his address as shown on the said current tax duplicate.

Notice to a partnership owner may be made by service upon any partner. Notice to a corporate owner may be made by service upon its president, a vice president, secretary or other person authorized by appointment or by law to accept service on behalf of the corporation. Notice to a condominium association, horizontal property regime, community trust or homeowners' association, because of its ownership of common elements or areas located within two hundred (200') feet of the property which is the subject of the hearing, may be made in the same manner as to a corporation without further notice to unit owners, co-owners, or homeowners on account of such common elements or areas.

- (3) Upon the written request of an applicant the Tax Assessor of Ocean City shall, within seven (7) days, make and certify a list from said current tax duplicates of names and addresses of owners to whom the applicant is required to give notice pursuant to paragraph a,1(a)(2) of this subsection. The applicant shall be entitled to rely upon the information contained in such list, and failure to give notice to any owner not on the list shall not invalidate any hearing or proceeding. A sum not to exceed twenty-five (\$.25) cents per name, or ten (\$10.00) dollars, whichever is greater, may be charged for such list.
- (4) The applicant shall file an affidavit of proof of service with the Appeal Board holding the hearing on a variance.
- (5) Following the receipt of a completed appeal application, the Appeal Board shall meet and consider the applicable within forty-five (45) days.

(b) Hearing.

(1) The Appeal Board shall make the rules governing hearings. Any applications, maps, surveys or other documents filed in connection with an application shall be available for public inspection at least ten (10) days before the date of the hearing, during normal business hours in the office of the Construction Code Official. The applicant may produce other documents, records, or testimony at the hearing to substantiate or clarify or supplement the previously filed maps and documents.

- (2) The officer presiding at the hearing or such person as he may designate shall have power to administer oaths.
- (3) The testimony of all witnesses relating to an application for development shall be taken under oath or affirmation by the presiding officer, and the right of cross-examination shall be permitted to all interested parties through their attorneys, if represented, or directly, if not represented, subject to the discretion of the presiding officer and to reasonable limitations as to time and number of witnesses.
- (4) Technical rules of evidence shall not be applicable to the hearing, but the Appeal Board may exclude irrelevant, immaterial or unduly repetitious evidence.
- (5) The Appeal Board shall provide for the verbatim recording of the proceedings by either stenographer, mechanical or electronic means. The Appeal Board shall furnish a transcript, or duplicate recording in lieu thereof, on request to any interested party at his expense.
- (6) The Appeal Board shall include findings of fact and conclusions based thereon, in each decision on any appeal or variance request. Said findings and conclusions shall be reduced to writing.
- [a] A memorializing resolution shall be adopted at a meeting held not later than forty-five (45) days after the date of the meeting at which the Appeal Board voted to grant or deny approval. Only members of the Appeal Board who voted for the action taken may vote on the memorializing resolution, and the vote of a majority of such members present at the meeting at which the resolution is presented for adoption shall be sufficient to adopt the resolution. If the Appeal Board fails to adopt a resolution or memorializing resolution as hereinabove specified, any interested party may apply to the Superior Court in a summary manner for an order compelling the Appeal Board to reduce its findings and conclusions to writing within a stated time.
- (7) A copy of the decision shall be mailed by the Appeal Board within ten (10) days of the date of decision to the applicant or, if represented, then to his attorney, without separate charge, and to all who request a copy of the decision, for a reasonable fee. A copy of the decision shall also be filed by the Appeal Board in the office of the Construction Code Official. The Construction Code Official shall make a copy of such filed decision available to any interested party for a reasonable fee and available for public inspection at his office during reasonable hours.
- (c) Scope of Review.
- (1) The scope of review of any appeal taken to the Appeal Board by an applicant shall be those set forth in the New Jersey Municipal Land Use Law, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-70. In hearing and deciding such appeals, the Appeal Board shall consider those factors set forth in subsection 21-4.3a. of this Chapter.
- 2. The Flood Damage Prevention Appeal Board shall hear and decide appeals when it is alleged there is an error in any requirement, decision, or determination made by the City's Construction Official in the enforcement or administration of this ordinance.
- 3. Those aggrieved by the decision of the Flood Damage Prevention Appeal Board, or any taxpayer, may appeal such decision to the Superior Court of New Jersey, as provided in statute.
- 4. In passing upon such applications, the Flood Damage Prevention Appeal Board, shall consider all technical evaluations, all relevant factors, standards specified in other sections of this ordinance, and:
 - (a) The danger that materials may be swept onto other lands to the injury of others;
 - (b) The danger to life and property due to flooding or erosion damage;
 - (c) The susceptibility of the proposed facility and its contents to flood damage and the effect of such damage on the individual owner;
 - (d) The importance of the services provided by the proposed facility to the community;
 - (e) The necessity to the facility of a waterfront location, where applicable;
 - (f) The availability of alternative locations for the proposed use which are not subject to flooding or erosion damage;
 - (g) The compatibility of the proposed use with existing and anticipated development;
 - (h) The relationship of the proposed use to the comprehensive plan and floodplain management program of that area;

- (i) The safety of access to the property in times of flood for ordinary and emergency vehicles;
- (j) The expected heights, velocity, duration, rate of rise, and sediment transport of the flood waters and the effects of wave action, if applicable, expected at the site; and,
- (k) The costs of providing governmental services during and after flood conditions, including maintenance and repair of public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems, and streets and bridges.
- 5. Upon consideration of the factors of section 21.4.4(a)4 and the purposes of this ordinance, the Flood Damage Prevention Appeal Board may attach such conditions to the granting of variances as it deems necessary to further the purposes of this ordinance.
- 6. The City's Construction Official shall maintain the records of all appeal actions, including technical information, and report any variances to the Federal Insurance Administration upon request.

B. CONDITIONS FOR VARIANCES

- 1. Generally, variances may be issued for new construction and substantial improvements to be erected on a lot of one-half acre or less in size contiguous to and surrounded by lots with existing structures constructed below the base flood level, providing items (a) (k) in section 21-4.4(a)4 have been fully considered. As the lot size increases beyond the one-half acre, the technical justification required for issuing the variance increases.
- 2. Variances may be issued for the repair or rehabilitation of historic structures upon a determination that the proposed repair or rehabilitation will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a historic structure and the variance is the minimum necessary to preserve the historic character and design of the structure.
- 3. Variances shall only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary, considering the flood hazard, to afford relief.
- 4. Variances shall only be issued upon:
 - a. A showing of good and sufficient cause;
 - b. A determination that failure to grant the variance would result in exceptional hardship to the applicant; and,
 - c. A determination that the granting of a variance will not result in increased flood heights, additional threats to public safety, extraordinary public expense, create nuisances, cause fraud on or victimization of the public as identified in section 21-4.4(a)4, or conflict with existing local laws or ordinances.
 - 5. Any applicant to whom a variance is granted shall be given written notice that the structure will be permitted to be built with a lowest floor elevation below the base flood elevation and that the cost of flood insurance will be commensurate with the increased risk resulting from the reduced lowest floor elevation.

SECTION 21-5.0 PROVISIONS FOR FLOOD HAZARD REDUCTION

21.5.1 GENERAL STANDARDS

In all areas of special flood hazards, compliance with the applicable requirements of the Uniform Construction Code (N.J.A.C. 5:23) and the following standards, whichever is more restrictive, is required.

21-5.1-1 ANCHORING

- a) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure.
- b) All manufactured homes to be placed or substantially improved shall be anchored to resist flotation, collapse or lateral movement. Methods of anchoring may include, but are not to be limited to, use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors. This requirement is in addition to applicable state and local anchoring requirements for resisting wind forces.

21-5.1-2 CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS AND METHODS

- a) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be constructed with materials and utility equipment resistant to flood damage.
- b) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be constructed using methods and practices that minimize flood damage.

21-5.1-3 UTILITIES

- a) All new and replacement water supply systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the system;
- b) New and replacement sanitary sewage systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharge from the systems into flood waters;
- c) On-site waste disposal systems shall be located to avoid impairment to them or contamination from them during flooding; and
- d) For all new construction and substantial improvements the electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing and air-conditioning equipment and other service facilities shall be designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding.

21-5.1-4 SUBDIVISION PROPOSALS

- a) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage;
- b) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems located and constructed to minimize flood damage;
- c) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have adequate drainage provided to reduce exposure to flood damage; and,
- d) Base flood elevation data shall be provided for subdivision proposals and other proposed new development which contain at least fifty (50) lots or five (5) acres (whichever is less).

21-5.1-5 ENCLOSURE OPENINGS

All new construction and substantial improvements having fully enclosed areas below the lowest floor that are usable solely for parking of vehicles, building access or storage in an area other than a basement and which are subject to flooding shall be designed to automatically equalize hydrostatic flood forces on exterior walls by allowing for the entry and exit of floodwaters. Designs for meeting this requirement must either be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect or must meet or exceed the following minimum criteria: A minimum of two (2) openings in at least two (2) exterior walls of each enclosed area, having a total net area of not less than one (1) square inch for every square foot of enclosed area subject to flooding shall be provided. The bottom of all openings shall be no higher than one (1) foot above grade. Openings may be equipped with screens, louvers, or other covering or devices provided that they permit the automatic entry and exit of floodwaters.

21-5.2 SPECIFIC STANDARDS

In all areas of special flood hazards where base flood elevation data have been provided as set forth in section 21-3.2, BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD or in section 21-4.3B, USE OF OTHER BASE FLOOD DATA, the following standards are required:

21-5.2-1 RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

For Coastal A Zone construction see section 21-5.3 COASTAL HIGH HAZARD AREA AND COASTAL A ZONE.

- b) New construction and substantial improvement of any residential structure located in an A or AE zone shall have the lowest floor, including basement together with the attendant utilities (including all electrical, heating, ventilating, air-conditioning and other service equipment) and sanitary facilities, elevated at or above the best available flood hazard data elevation plus one (1) foot or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14. Table 2-1, whichever is more restrictive;
- c) Require within any AO or AH zone on the municipality's FIRM that all new construction and substantial improvement of any residential structure shall have the lowest floor, including basement together with the attendant utilities and sanitary facilities, elevated above the depth number specified in feet plus one (1) foot, above the highest adjacent grade (at least three (3) feet if no depth number is specified). And, require adequate drainage paths around structures on slopes to guide floodwaters around and away from proposed structures.

21-5.2-2 NONRESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

In an Area of Special Flood Hazard, all new construction and substantial improvement of any commercial, industrial or other nonresidential structure located in an A or AF zone (for Coastal A Zone construction see section 5.3 COASTAL HIGH HAZARD ARFA AND COASTAL A ZONE) shall have the lowest floor, including basement, together with the attendant utilities and sanitary facilities as well as all electrical, heating, ventilating, urconditioning and other service equipment:

either

- Elevated to or above the best available flood hazard data elevation plus one (1) foot or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14, Table 2-1, whichever is more restrictive; and
- b) Require within any AO or AH zone on the municipality's DFIRM to elevate above the depth number specified in feet plus one (1) foot, above the highest adjacent grade (at least three (3) feet if no depth number is specified). And, require adequate drainage paths around structures on slopes to guide floodwaters around and away from proposed structures;

or

- c) Be floodproofed so that below the best available flood hazard data elevation plus one (1) foot or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14. Table 6-1, whichever is more restrictives the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water;
- d) Have structural components capable of resisting hydrostatic and hydrodynamic loads and effects of buoyancy; and,
- e) Be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect that the design and methods of construction are in accordance with accepted standards of practice for meeting the applicable provisions of this subsection. Such certification shall be provided to the official as set forth in section 21-4.3C2(b).

21-5.2-3 MANUFACTURED HOMES

- a) Manufactured homes shall be anchored in accordance with section 21-5.1-1 b).
- b) All manufactured homes to be placed or substantially improved within an area of special flood hazard shall:
 - Be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage,
 - Be constructed to minimize flood damage,
 - ii. Have adequate drainage provided to reduce exposure to flood damage; and
 - Be elevated on a permanent foundation such that the top of the lowest floor is at or above the best available flood hazard data elevation plus one (1) foot or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14. Table 2-1, whichever is more restrictive; and,
 - v. The manufactured home chassis is supported by reinforced piers or other foundation elements of at least equivalent strength that are no less than 36 inches in height above grade and be securely anchored to an adequately anchored foundation system to resist flotation, collapse and lateral movement.

21-5.3 COASTAL HIGH HAZARD AREA AND COASTAL A ZONE

Coastal high hazard areas (V or VE Zones) and coastal A Zones are located within the areas of special flood hazard established in section 21-3.2. These areas have special flood hazards associated with high velocity waters from tidal surges and hurricane wave wash; therefore, the following provisions shall apply:

21-5.3-1 LOCATION OF STRUCTURES

- a) All buildings or structures shall be located landward of the reach of the mean high tide.
- b) The placement of manufactured homes shall be prohibited, except in an existing manufactured home park or subdivision.

21-5.3-2 CONSTRUCTION METHODS

a) ELEVATION

All new construction and substantial improvements shall be elevated on piling or columns so that:

- i. The bottom of the lowest horizontal structural member of the lowest floor (excluding the piling or columns) is elevated to or above the best available flood hazard data elevation plus one (1) foot, or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14. Table 4-1, whichever is more restrictive, and
- All electrical, heating, ventilating, air-conditioning, mechanical equipment and other equipment servicing the building is elevated one (1) foot above base flood elevation; and.

iii. With all space below the lowest floor's supporting member open so as not to impede the flow of water, except for breakaway walls as provided or in section 21-5.3-2 d).

b) STRUCTURAL SUPPORT

- i. All new construction and substantial improvements shall be securely anchored on piling or columns.
- ii. The pile or column foundation and structure attached thereto shall be anchored to resist flotation, collapse or lateral movement due to the effects of wind and water loading values each of which shall have a one percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year (100-year mean recurrence interval).
- Prohibit the use of fill for structural support of buildings within Zones V1-30, VE,
 V, and Coastal A on the community's FIRM.

c) CERTIFICATION

A registered professional engineer or architect shall develop or review the structural design specifications and plans for the construction and shall certify that the design and methods of construction to be used are in accordance with accepted standards of practice for compliance with the provisions of section 21-5.3-2 a) and 21-5.3-2 b) i. and ii.

d) SPACE BELOW THE LOWEST FLOOR

- i. Any alteration, repair, reconstruction or improvement to a structure started after the enactment of this ordinance shall not enclose the space below the lowest floor unless breakaway walls, open wood lattice-work or insect screening are used as provided for in this section.
- Breakaway walls, open wood lattice-work or insect screening shall be allowed below the base flood elevation provided that they are intended to collapse under wind and water loads without causing collapse, displacement or other structural damage to the elevated portion of the building or supporting foundation system. Breakaway walls shall be designed for a safe loading resistance of not less than 10 and no more than 20 pounds per square foot. Use of breakaway walls which exceed a design safe loading of 20 pounds per square foot (either by design or when so required by local or State codes) may be permitted only if a registered professional engineer or architect certifies that the designs proposed meet the following conditions.
 - (i) breakaway wall collapse shall result from a water load less than that which would occur during the base flood and,
 - (ii) the elevated portion of the building and supporting foundation system shall not be subject to collapse, displacement or other structural damage due to the effects of wind and water load acting simultaneously on all building components (structural and non-structural). Water loading values used shall be those associated with the base flood. Wind loading values used shall be those required by applicable State or local building standards.
- iii. If breakaway walls are utilized, such enclosed space shall be used solely for parking of vehicles, building access, or storage and not for human habitation.
- iv. Prior to construction, plans for any breakaway wall must be submitted to the Construction Code Official or Building Sub-Code Official for approval.

21-5.3-3 SAND DUNES

Prohibit man-made alteration of sand dunes within Coastal A Zones. VE and V Zones on the community's DFIRM which would increase potential flood damage.



If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, such a decision shall not affect the remaining portions of the Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect, and for this purpose the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

SECTION 21-7.0

Any and all Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

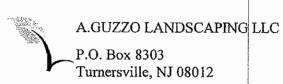

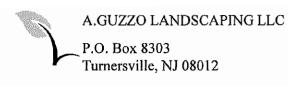

CITY OF OCEAN CITY AMERICA'S GREATEST FAMILY RESORT LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this 22nd day of August, 2017, between the City of Ocean City, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as "City" and the Ocean City Board of Education, a public entity of the State of New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as "Board of Education") as authorized by City Resolution No. 17-5 adopted on, August 22, 2017.

RECITALS

- 1. The City is the owner of the Ocean City Aquatic and Fitness Center located at 1735 Simpson Avenue, Ocean City, NJ 08226.
- 2. The primary City contact person for this agreement shall be Wendy Moyle, Manager of Recreation Programs.
- The Aquatic and Fitness Center contains an indoor swimming pool/natatorium and related locker room areas.
- 4. The Board of Education desires to utilize the indoor swimming pool/natatorium and related locker room areas at the Aquatic and Fitness Center for the period of Monday, September 11, 2017 through Thursday, June 7, 2018.

NOW THEREFORE, for a consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions and wishing to be bound, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Use of Facilities:</u> The City agrees to allow the Board of Education to have exclusive use of both the swimming pool/natatorium and the designated locker rooms at the Aquatic and Fitness Center pursuant to the terms of this agreement.
- 2. **Rent:** The City agrees to waive the fees so that the Board of Education can create and offset the expenses for the new Student Wellness Center, the development of a safe haven and STOPit programs for students.
- 3. <u>Use of Facilities for the Intermediate School Program:</u> The Board of Education shall have the right to utilize the swimming pool/natatorium and locker rooms for the Ocean City Intermediate School Program as follows:
 - a. From Monday, September 11, 2017 through Tuesday, November 7, 2017 8:00 a.m. to 8:45 a.m., Monday through Friday inclusive. School will be closed on Monday, October 9, 2017.
 - b. From Monday, April 9, 2018 through Thursday, June 7, 2018, 8:00 am to 8:45 am, Monday through Friday inclusive. School will have an early dismissal on Friday, May 18, 2018 and will be closed on Monday, May 28, 2018.

- 4. **Use of Facilities for High School Swim Team Program:** The Board of Education shall have the right to utilize the swimming pool and locker rooms for the Ocean City High School Program as follows:
 - a. Between Monday, November 6, 2017 through Friday, March 9, 2018, the use by the Ocean City High School Swim Team shall be from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday inclusive and 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m., Saturday.
 - b. Additionally, the times shall be extended by one-half (1/2) hour on weekdays when the Ocean City Swim Team meets are held at the Ocean City Aquatic and Fitness Center.
- 5. **Rules and Regulations:** The Board of Education and the participants in the Intermediate School Program and the High School Swim Team Program shall abide by all rules and regulations of the Aquatic and Fitness Center as adopted from time to time by the City.
- 6. **Exclusive Use:** During the dates and times as outlined in Sections 3, 4 & 5 above, the Board of Education shall have exclusive use of the swimming pool/natatorium. The Board of Education shall be granted the exclusive use of the front locker room facilities for the Intermediate School Program.
- 7. <u>Maintenance:</u> The City reserves the right to close the swimming pool and locker rooms from time to time, if necessary, to undertake repairs and required maintenance to the facilities. In the event, that it is necessary to perform said repairs or maintenance work, the City shall give advance notice to the Board of Education. Additionally, the City shall seek to undertake the repairs and maintenance in a manner, which will minimize interference with the programs offered by the Board of Education.
- 8. **Insurance:** The Board of Education shall furnish proof of insurance to the City at least seven (7) days prior to the date which the Board of Education plans to begin utilizing the Aquatic and Fitness Center in the minimum amounts of \$500,000.00 for property damage and \$1,000,000.00 for personal liability insurance. The insurance shall cover the period during which the Board of Education will be utilizing the Aquatic and Fitness Center. The City shall be named additional Insured on the policy that is provided. Additionally, the Board of Education shall be required to notify the City sixty (60) days prior to any cancellation, intention not to renew, or material change in the required coverage.
- 9. <u>Damage:</u> In the event the Aquatic and Fitness Center, its furnishings or any portion of the building is damaged by the act, negligence or default of the Board of Education and/or the Board of Education's employees or any person admitted to the Aquatic and Fitness Center by the Board of Education, the Board of Education shall be required to pay to the City, upon demand, such sum as shall be necessary to restore the said premises to the condition that they were on the date thereof.
- Indemnification: The Board of Education shall indemnify and hold harmless, the City, its agents, servants and employees for any injury to person, including death, or damage to property, arising out of the Board of Education's utilization of the Aquatic and Fitness Center pursuant to the terms and conditions hereof. The indemnification hereunder shall be construed to be the broadest possible permitted by the laws of the State of New Jersey. In the event of a claim, demand, presentation and/or suit against the City, the Board of Education shall save and hold harmless the City and shall at its own expense, defend the City. In connection therewith, the Board of Education shall name the City as an "additional insured" under the liability insurance policy as required in Section 8 above.
- 11. **Subletting:** The Board of Education shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of this Agreement nor any part thereof or its right, title or interest therein without first receiving the written consent of both the Business Administrator and/or Purchasing Manager of the City of Ocean City

- 12. **Default by the Board of Education:** In the event of any default in the terms and conditions of said Agreement and/or breach of any rules and regulations promulgated by the City from time to time for the Aquatic and Fitness Center, then the City may, at its option and in addition to any other remedy which it may have by law or in equity, terminate this Agreement and the Board of Education shall thereafter be prohibited from utilizing the Aquatic and Fitness Center's facilities.
- 13. **Supervision:** Adult supervision shall be provided by the Board of Education and shall be required in both the men's and women's locker room areas before and after indoor swimming pool use. The students shall not be permitted to congregate in the lobby area either before or after the use of the pool/natatorium.
- 14. <u>Lifequards:</u> The City shall be required to supply certified lifeguards at its own expense for the use of the facilities by the Intermediate School and the High School Swim Team Programs, as set forth in Sections 3 & 4 above.
- 15. **Default by the City of Ocean City:** In the event of any default in the terms and conditions of the Agreement, then the Board of Education may, at its option and in addition to any other remedy which it may have by law or in equity, terminate this Agreement and have no further obligation pursuant to this Agreement.

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY FOR DREDGE MATERIAL MANAGEMENT

WHEREAS, as set forth in N.J.S.A. 27:1A-78, the NJDOT Office of Maritime Resources shall serve as the lead on all maritime matters including but not limited to, dredging, dredging technologies and dredging related issues, as well as State and federal marine transportation systems; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in N.J.S.A. 27:1A-80, the NJDOT shall engage in waterborne, dredging, and related infrastructure development projects which enhance the economic, environmental, and efficient nature of maritime and marine trades services; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in N.J.S.A. 27:1A-82, the NJDOT, in consultation with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and New Jersey Department of Treasury, is authorized to operate lease, or license a dredging facility, or contract for the design, construction, use, management or operation of any State dredging processing facility in such a manner as to produce revenue in support of the maritime industry; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City has developed a comprehensive long range plan for the dredging and dredged material management; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City is the owner of a dredged material confined disposal facility (CDF) called Route 52 CDF located under the Route 52 bridge and shown on the official municipal Tax Map as being located in Block 850.01, Lot 6 and CDF 83, shown on the official municipal Tax Map as being located in Block 3350.01, Lot 17 both in the City of Ocean City and as outlined in red on the map attached hereto as **Exhibit A** entitled **Tax Map Sheets 1 and 2** and made a part hereof (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the navigation channels in the back bay adjacent to Ocean City, are in need of dredging and are depicted on Figures 1 through 16 entitled "Back Bay Dredging – Dredge Prism City of Ocean City, NJ" attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City is undertaking a Dredging Project in Cape May County on the Bay; and

WHEREAS, certain State-maintained channels located within Ocean City known as #181 USCG Lagoon, #182 USCG Lagoon Spur, #183 Krause's Cut, #184 Carnival Bayou, #185 Venetian Bayou, and #186 Ocean City Lagoon as depicted on a map entitled "Back Bay Dredging – Dredge Prism State Channel Dredging" attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit C require dredging; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City has agreed to dredge State Channels as a part of their 2017 dredging program, and to thereafter deposit the dredged material into the Property or other suitable permitted location approved by NJDOT; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City has agreed to dredge #184 Carnival Bayou as a part of their 2017 dredging program; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT has agreed to compensate Ocean City for the dredging of State Channels, subject to available funding; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City of Ocean City to coordinate with the NJDOT and to accept the NJDOT's offer of compensation for the dredging of channels adjacent to Ocean City;

DREDGE MATERIAL MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT – OCEAN CITY #184 Carnival Bayou

THIS AGREEMENT, is made this 22nd day of August, 2017, by Ocean City, located in Cape May County and the New Jersey Department of Transportation ("NJDOT or State");

WHEREAS, as set forth in N.J.S.A.27:1A-78, the NJDOT Office of Maritime Resources shall serve as the lead on all maritime matters including but not limited to, dredging, dredging technologies and dredging related issues, as well as State and federal marine transportation systems; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in N.J.S.A. 27:1A-80, the NJDOT shall engage in waterborne, dredging, and related infrastructure development projects which enhance the economic, environmental, and efficient nature of maritime and marine trades services; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in N.J.S.A. 27:1A-82, the NJDOT, in consultation with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and New Jersey Department of Treasury, is authorized to operate lease, or license a dredging facility, or contract for the design, construction, use, management or operation of any State dredging processing facility in such a manner as to produce revenue in support of the maritime industry; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City has developed a comprehensive long range plan for the dredging and dredged material management; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City is the owner of a dredged material Confined Disposal Facility (CDF) called Route 52 CDF (Exhibit B/C, Sheet 15) located under the Route 52 bridge and shown on the official municipal Tax Map as being located in Block 850.01, Lot 6 and Site 83 CDF (Exhibit B/C, Sheet 14), shown on the official municipal Tax Map as being located in Block 3350.01, Lot 17 both in the City of Ocean City and as outlined in red on the map attached hereto as **Exhibit A** entitled **Tax Map Sheets 1 and 2** and made a part hereof (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the navigation channels in the back bay adjacent to Ocean City, is in need of dredging and is depicted on a map entitled "Back Bay Dredging – Dredge Prism City of Ocean City, NJ" (Sheets 1-15) attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B/C; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City is undertaking a Dredging Project in Cape May County on the Bay; and

WHEREAS certain State maintained channels located within Ocean City known as #181 USCG Lagoon, #182 USCG Lagoon Spur, #183 Krause's Cut, #184 Carnival Bayou, #185 Venetian Bayou, and #186 Ocean City Lagoon as depicted on a map entitled "Back Bay Dredging – Dredge Prism State Channel Dredging" (Sheets 2, 5, 6, 7, 10 and 12) attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B/C require dredging; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City has agreed to dredge State Channels as a part of their overall dredging program, and to thereafter deposit the dredged material into the Property or other suitable permitted location approved by NJDOT; and

WHEREAS, Ocean City has agreed to dredge #184 Carnival Bayou as a part of their 2017 dredging program; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT has agreed to compensate Ocean City for the dredging of State Channels, subject to available funding; and

NOW THEREFORE, OCEAN CITY and NJDOT intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

1. PROJECT

- A. The volume of material to be removed from the State Channels is estimated at 90,578 Cubic Yards and from the Ocean City Channels is estimated at 609,547 Cubic Yards.
- B. The volume of material to be removed from State Channel #184 Carnival Bayou is estimated at 11,150 Cubic Yards and from the Ocean City Channels is estimated at 3,660 Cubic Yards.
- C. Ocean City shall arrange for financing sufficient to complete the 2017 dredging program, regardless of the NJDOT's payments due under this Agreement. Subsequent funding will be applied in future years for the future year program; additional State Channels will be considered by amendment to this Agreement.
- D. The Office of Maritime Resources will provide State inspection oversight for the State Navigational Channels for FEMA compliance only and/or as necessary.
- E. Eligible costs for this project include: Design, Construction, Permitting Services, Material Testing & Sampling, Material Management, Construction Inspection, and CDF Capacity.
- F. The estimated cost for the State portion of the total project cost for #184 Carnival Bayou is as follows:
 - i. Dredged Material Placement (Design, Construction, Permitting, Material Testing, and Inspection): \$631,725.88
 - ii. Dredging (Design, Construction, Permitting, Material Testing and Sampling, Inspection): \$682,469.70
- G. The estimated distribution of project costs between the State and Ocean City are attached hereto as **Exhibit D** entitled "Allocation of Project Costs Carnival Bayou."
- H. The estimated distribution of costs between the State and Ocean City based on the low-bid estimated are attached hereto as **Exhibit E** entitled "Allocation of Low-Bid Costs Carnival Bayou."

2. FUNDING AND PAYMENT

- A. The NJDOT will pay for all eligible costs attributable to dredging the State Channels ("State costs"). These costs are estimated to be \$1,314,195.58 of the \$1,445,615.14 total estimated cost of the combined #184 Carnival Bayou and Ocean City Project. This amount is based on Ocean City's engineering estimate plus 10%. This amount shall only be revised consistent with the terms of this Agreement.
- B. The State shall not participate in costs that the NJDOT determines to be outside the purposes listed in Paragraph 1(F), above, excessive or otherwise

unallowable. Ocean City shall be afforded an opportunity to challenge this determination at an informal hearing.

C. Payments shall be made as follows:

- i. Ocean City shall award a contract for the project, consistent with all State laws, regulations and orders which are applicable to the NJDOT and Ocean City. NJDOT shall review the award and either concur or reject the award, in its sole discretion. The estimate of the State costs shall be revised consistent with the contract award.
- ii. The State shall pay 75% of the State costs at the time NJDOT concurs in Ocean City's award of the contract. Actual costs exceeding 75% of the estimate shall be paid by the State on a reimbursement basis upon submission of a final voucher with supporting information as required by the Department.
- iii. The final voucher must be submitted to the NJDOT within six (6) months of project acceptance by NJDOT. Project acceptance will be based on the results of the After Dredge (AD) survey and as-built data.
- iv. If Ocean City requests, progress payments may be made on a reimbursement basis periodically, in the State's sole discretion. Ocean City shall request reimbursement from the State by submitting vouchers in a form supplied by the State with supporting information as required by the State. Progress payments shall be in increments of \$50,000 or greater.
- D. Ocean City hereby certifies that all funds shall be spent only on eligible costs attributable to dredging the State Channels, as described in this Agreement.
- E. In the event that the State determines that it has reimbursed Ocean City in an amount in excess of the funds actually due under this Agreement, Ocean City shall, upon notice from the State, make timely repayments to the State. If Ocean City fails to timely repay such funds, the State is hereby authorized by this Agreement to deduct those funds from any monies due to Ocean City under the terms of any agreement between the State, its Departments and Agencies and Ocean City or to gain reimbursement through any other remedies available at law or equity.
- F. Any change orders or claims presented by the selected contractor on the State Channel portion of this project are subject to NJDOT review and approval via an NJDOT change order.
- G. Ocean City shall provide cost certification in a form specified by the State and maintain financial records relating to all costs for the project, as applicable, and comply with State of New Jersey audit requirements specified therein.
- H. Ocean City shall maintain complete documentation of the project for a period of three (3) years after receiving final payment from the State.
- I. Ocean City shall maintain and supply all records which the NJDOT may require in order to successfully obtain federal reimbursement for this project, regardless

of whether those records are specified in this agreement or any materials referenced in this agreement.

3. DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

- A. In its agreements for professional and non-professional services, Ocean City shall require the provision of Public Liability, Comprehensive General Liability, Comprehensive Automobile Liability, Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability and Professional Liability Insurance, and every such policy shall include Ocean City and the State as additional named insureds.
- B. All work shall comply with all appropriate State and Federal Permits, laws, regulations and orders.
- C. Ocean City shall engage a Professional Engineer, registered in the State of New Jersey, for design services on the project. In its agreement for professional services, Ocean City shall require the provision of Errors and Omissions, Professional Liability Insurance and/or Professional Malpractice insurance sufficient to protect the professional services provider from any liability arising out of professional obligations performed pursuant to this Agreement. The insurance shall have a minimum liability of \$1,000,000 per occurrence. The NJDOT shall be named an additional insured on this policy.
- D. State Channel design shall conform to 2013 (or newer) baseline surveys provided by the NJDOT's Office of Maritime Resources. Funding provided is for the maintenance of the existing State Channels only. Centerline and channel limits, both aerial and min/max dredging depth for State Channels cannot be altered and/or exceeded without the written approval of the NJDOT.
- E. Ocean City shall provide all maps, reports, detailed plans, supplementary specifications and contract documents required by the NJDOT.
- To receive final payment Ocean City must provide a pre-dredge and post-dredge F. survey of the State's Channels that has been signed and sealed by a Professional Surveyor licensed in the State of New Jersey. These surveys are to be used to calculate the pay volumes for the contractor using the end area averaging method. Pre-dredge and post-dredge surveys shall be conducted on transect lines provided by NJDOT. Ocean City will do the survey and calculations. The predredge survey must be done no more than two (2) weeks before any dredging is performed. The post-dredge survey must be done within two (2) weeks of substantial completion of the project as reported by the contractor and before final acceptance is made. In some cases, additional post dredging surveys may be required if the survey reveals that less than 95% by volume of the sediment within the minimum dredging envelope, as specified in project plans, has been removed and that this failure significantly jeopardizes the navigable use of the channel. NJDOT will not reimburse for more than one (1) post dredging survey. Reimbursement will be made for all volume removed from within the maximum dredging envelope. In no case will reimbursement be made for volume removed outside of the maximum dredge limit as stated in the plans and specifications.
- G. Ocean City will provide construction inspection for all dredging related work outlined within this agreement.

4. TERM AND TERMINATION

- A. This Agreement shall be effective upon execution by both parties and shall be in effect until the Project is completed.
- B. This Agreement shall be terminable upon mutual consent of the parties in writing.
- C. This Agreement may be terminated for cause if either party fails to perform its obligations or materially breaches any obligation in the agreement and the failure or breach is not corrected within a mutually agreed upon time frame upon receiving written notice from the other party. This Agreement may further be terminated or suspended for Ocean City's failure to comply with all the provisions contained in this Agreement.

5. APPLICABLE LAW AND REGULATIONS

- A. The parties shall comply with all applicable Federal, state, county and municipal laws, ordinances and regulations wherein the Property is located.
- B. Ocean City shall represent to NJDOT through relevant documents and permits that its operation of the CDF is in compliance with all applicable Federal, state, county and municipal laws, ordinances and regulations within ten (10) days of execution of this Agreement.

6. PUBLIC ADVERTISEMENT

- A. The municipality shall award a construction contract for the grant project within six (6) months of approval of this Agreement by the NJDOT. The NJDOT may cancel the grant agreement if Ocean City does not award the construction contract by the specified time.
- B. Prior to advertising for bids, Ocean City shall notify the NJDOT if it intends to substantially change the scope of the project proposed in this Agreement. No substantial change shall be included in the project unless it has been approved by the NJDOT.
- C. Ocean City must get approval from the Office of Maritime Resources of the plans, specifications and engineers estimate before advertisement. The Office of Maritime Resources will expedite its review and response.
- D. Prior to advertisement, Ocean City shall submit the following to the Office of Maritime Resources:
 - i. One (1) copy of the contract plans, specifications, engineer's estimate and engineer's design certification.
 - ii. State and Federal Permits shall be provided immediately upon receipt by Ocean City.
 - iii. Other documents as required.
- E. Ocean City shall advertise and award the contract in accordance with the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40 A: 11-1 et. seq.

- F. Ocean City shall comply with all applicable Federal, State and Local laws, rules, ordinances and regulations.
- G. Within thirty (30) calendar days of construction bids, unless the NJDOT grants an extension of this time, Ocean City shall submit the following to the Office of Maritime Resources.
 - i. Two (2) copies of the summary of construction bids.
 - ii. A resolution awarding the contract to the lowest responsible bidder submitting a responsive bid, subject to the prompt approval of the NJDOT.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

- A. Ocean City hereby releases and will protect, defend, indemnify, and save NJDOT, the State, the Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Transportation, its officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims, liabilities, demands, actions at law, equity, judgments, settlements, losses, damages, and expenses of every character whatsoever for injury to or death of any person or persons whomsoever and for damage to or loss or destruction of Property of any kind by whomsoever owned, caused by, resulting from, arising out of, or occurring in connection with the construction, maintenance, alteration, repair, relocation, renewal, use or presence of the crossing on the Property, or incidental to or appertaining thereto, and regardless of whether or not such injury or death or such damage to or loss or destruction of Property are due to or chargeable to, in whole or in part, any alleged active or passive negligence or participation in the wrong or upon any alleged breach of any statutory duty or obligation by NJDOT.
- B. Ocean City shall cause its contractor(s) to indemnify, defend, and save harmless the NJDOT, the State, the Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Transportation, its officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all suits, claims, losses, demands, fees, costs of investigation, cost of defense, and damages of whatever kind or nature arising in connection with this Agreement or the contract between Ocean City and its contractor ("the contract"), regardless of the fault of the NJDOT. The obligations of this paragraph shall survive the expiration, rescission and termination of this Agreement. Ocean City's contractors must agree to provide a defense upon demand by the NJDOT, regardless of the merits of the claim, whether the claim has been filed in court, and if it has been filed, regardless of the stage of those proceedings. The purchase of insurance required by the Agreement or in the contract shall not relieve the contractor of its obligation to provide a defense for the NJDOT.
- C. Ocean City agrees that it shall purchase, and maintain a Comprehensive General Liability policy of insurance and cause its subcontractors to do same. The policy shall name the NJDOT, the Commissioner of Transportation, the State, its officials and employees as an additional insured against liability which arises from any occurrence on or about the Project or Property and or which arises from any of the claims indicated in Paragraph 7A-B above. The coverage limits

- shall be a minimum of liability in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence as a combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage.
- D. Ocean City agrees that it shall purchase, and maintain a Marine Liability Insurance policy with a minimum limit of liability that shall be not less than \$2,000,000 per person and \$2,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and Property damage. Coverage provided under this liability policy shall be on an occurrence basis and shall include, but not be limited to:
 - i. Personal injury
 - ii. Contractual liability
 - iii. Premises and operations
 - iv. Products and completed operations
 - v. Independent contractor
 - vi. Waiver of Subrogation for all claims and suits, including recovery of any applicable deductibles
 - vii. Severability of Interest/Separation of Insureds
 - viii. Automotive liability
- E. Ocean City agrees that it shall purchase, and maintain Worker's Compensation applicable to the laws of the State of New Jersey and include an all-states endorsement to extend coverage to any state that may be interpreted to have legal jurisdiction, and Employers Liability Insurance and cause its subcontractors to do same. The policy shall name the NJDOT, the Commissioner of Transportation, the State, its officials and employees as an additional insured. The coverage limits of the policy shall be not less than \$100,000 each accident, \$100,000 disease each employee, and \$500,000 disease aggregate limit. The policy should further be endorsed to include US Longshore and Harbor Workers coverage and Jones Act coverage.
- F. Ocean City shall furnish to the NJDOT a certificate of insurance prior to starting construction together with the declaration pages, showing that Ocean City or its contractors has complied with paragraph 7A 7E above. All of the certificates shall contain a provision or endorsement that the coverage afforded is not to be canceled, materially changed or renewal refused under this Agreement without NJDOT's prior written approval of such cancellation or change. All certificates, declaration pages and or notices shall be mailed to the New Jersey Department of Transportation as described in Section 20 Notices.
- G. Insurance coverage in the minimum amounts set forth herein shall not be construed to relieve Ocean City for liability in excess of such coverage, nor does it preclude the NJDOT from taking such other actions as are available to it under any other provisions of this Agreement or otherwise in law.

8. THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES

This Agreement shall not create in any individual or entity the status of a third-party beneficiary and nothing in the Agreement shall be construed to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained herein shall operate only between the parties and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties. The provisions of this Agreement are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing the obligations set forth herein and the parties expressly agree that only they shall have any legal or equitable right to seek enforcement of this Agreement, seek any remedy arising out of performance or failure to perform by one of the parties, or bring any action for breach of the Agreement.

9. ASSIGNMENT

This Agreement shall not be assigned without written consent of the NJDOT.

10. DISPUTE

If there are any disputes among the parties concerning this Agreement, the heads or their authorized representatives of each party shall confer to resolve the dispute. All claims made in relation to this Agreement are subject to the provisions of Title 59 of the New Jersey Statutes.

11. AMENDMENT

This Agreement may be amended, supplemented, changed, modified, or altered only by mutual agreement of the parties in writing that shall be effective as of the date stipulated therein.

12. SEVERABILITY/WAIVER

All agreements and covenants contained herein are severable, and in the event any of them shall be held to be invalid by any competent court, this Agreement shall be interpreted as if such invalid agreements or covenants were not contained herein. Should one or more covenants or conditions be waived by either party, such waiver shall not be deemed to waive or render unnecessary the consent or approval of the waiving party to or of any subsequent similar act by the other party.

13. CHOICE OF LAW

This Agreement is being executed and is intended to be performed in the State of New Jersey and shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

14. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties and supersedes all other negotiations, representations, and understandings of the parties, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement.

15. BINDING EFFECT

All of the terms, conditions, and covenants to be observed and performed by the parties shall be applicable to and binding upon their several successors and assigns.

16. POLICE POWER

All obligations and penalties are imposed pursuant to the police powers of the State of New Jersey for the enforcement of the law and the protection of public health, safety, welfare and the environment.

17. RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

NJDOT reserves all statutory and common law rights to require Ocean City to take additional action(s) if NJDOT determines that such actions are necessary to protect public health, safety, welfare and the environment. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of any statutory or common law right of NJDOT to require such additional measures should NJDOT determine that such measures are necessary.

18. SUBJECT TO FUND AVAILABILITY

A failure by the NJDOT to make any payment under this Agreement or to observe and perform any condition on its part to be performed under this Agreement as a result of the failure of the Legislature to appropriate shall not in any manner constitute a breach or default by the NJDOT and the NJDOT shall not be held liable in any manner whatsoever because of the absence of available funding.

19. AUTHORITY

By the signatures below, the parties execute this Agreement and confirm that they are mutually bound by and fully authorized and empowered to enter into and bind their organization by all provisions contained herein.

20. NOTICE

Every notice, approval, consent, or other communication desired or required under this permit should be effective only if the same shall be in writing and sent postage prepaid by overnight mail or United States Registered or certified mail (or a similar mail service available at the time), directed to the other party at its address as follows (or such other address as either party may designate by notice given from time to time in accordance with this section:

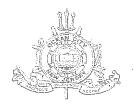

Recommendations for Award of Contract

The memorandum provides a summary of bids received for City of Ocean City Contract No. 17-36, which includes the dredging of material from Carnival Bayou into the Site 83 confined disposal facility (CDF). In accordance with the bid specifications, bids for City Contact No. 17-36 were opened on Tuesday, August 15, 2017 at 2:00 PM EST in City Hall, Room #301, 861 Asbury Avenue, Ocean City, New Jersey. Bids were received from:

- Mobile Dredging and Video Pipe Inc. (Mobile Dredging) of Chester, Pennsylvania
- Mount Construction Co., Inc. (Mount Construction) of Berlin, New Jersey
- Wickberg Marine Contracting, Inc. (Wickberg Marine) of Belford, New Jersey

BID COST COMPARISON

A bid comparison table has been included with this letter as Attachment 1. For the Base Bid (Line Items 1-5 of the Bid Form), Mobile Dredging was the low bidder by an amount of \$181,225.50 with a Base Bid total amount of \$732,514.50.

Wickberg Marine was the second low bidder with a Base Bid total amount of \$913,740.00. Mount Construction. Mount Construction submitted a Base Bid total amount of \$1,560,750.00.

NOTES ON RECEIVED BIDS

Upon review of the bids for City Contract 17-36, it was observed that Wickberg Marine's listed Unit Price and Total Amount for the Mobilization/Demobilization lump sum bid item were in disagreement. As noted on the bid form, in the event of a disagreement, the listed unit price

will govern, and the bid total was updated accordingly. The error and subsequent recalculation did not impact the bidder cost ranking order for the three bids received.

A copy of Mobile Dredging and Video Pipe's 2017 Public Works Registration Certification was provided following the bid opening via email, and is included as Attachment 2.

REFERENCE PROJECT REVIEW

In accordance with Article 45.5 of the City Contract 17-36 bid specifications, bidders were required to prove to the satisfaction of the City that they have successfully completed three (3) projects in the past five (5) years that are similar in nature and scope to City Contract 17-36 and were of an amount not less than fifty percent (50%) of the amount of the proposed work. The provided reference projects for the low bidder, Mobile Dredging and Video Pipe, are provided below and meet the established criteria.

BIDDER VIOLATION REVIEW

In accordance with Article 45.6 of the City Contract 17-36 bid specifications, bidders were required to list all projects performed by the bidder within the past 24 months. A total of 14 projects were listed by the low bidder, Mobile Dredging and Video Pipe. The contact provided for each listed reference project was contacted to determine whether any regulatory violations resulted from performance of the work. Of the contacts that were able to be reached during this check, none indicated receipt of a regulatory violation as a result of the work.

AWARD RECOMMENDATION

As the lowest bidder, it is recommended that Mobile Dredging be awarded the Base Bid contract in the amount of \$732,514.50.
