CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, APRIL 12, 2018 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Barr, Ms. Bergman, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. McClellan, Mr. Wilson and Mr. Madden. Present also was Mayor Jay A. Gillian, Solicitor, Dorothy McCrosson, and Director of Community Services, Michael Allegretto. Business Administrator, James Mallon was absent.

Council President Mr. Madden called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Ms. Bergman led the prayer. Mr. Madden announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

Mayor and Council presented a proclamation recognizing April 2018 as Parkinson Awareness Month. Mr. Madden read the proclamation aloud.

RESOLUTIONS – NON-CONSENT:

Mr. Madden announced that "A Resolution Remembering William John Meis, Jr." has been removed from the agenda this evening and will be presented at a later date.

Council and Administration presented "A Resolution Remembering Nancy Hughes." Mr. Hartzell read the resolution aloud. Mr. Hughes who was joined by his family, spoke about his wife, their love of Ocean City and he thanked the administration and council for recognizing her tonight.

Mr. Madden opened the meeting up to the public for comments on the resolution. No one wished to speak. Mr. Madden closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt the resolution. Motion moved by Mr. Hartzell, seconded by Mr. Wilson. All ayes followed.

CITIZEN COMMENT:

Ed O'Donnell – Port O' Call – Mr. O'Donnell spoke about what you can do for self-renewal to feel better and he also spoke about the news media being kinder, nicer and fair.

<u>Wayne Mozzo – 1333 Pleasure Avenue</u> – Mr. Mozzo spoke about the check valves at 14th and Pleasure. The most recent storm left no flooding and zero water under the houses. He thanked the Mayor, Mr. Hartzell and Mr. Bekier for following up over the winter months. He also suggested doing a post-moratorium on the experience to determine what worked and what had failed.

<u>Donna Moore – 21 Ocean Avenue</u> – Ms. Moore spoke about her concerns in regard to chemicals that are being put in the soil and she recommended an environmentally safe option for the city to consider.

Ed Price – 7 Marlin Court – Mr. Price respectfully asked council to cancel bond ordinances 17-18 and 17-19. He also wanted to know why the city is still storing salt at the Shelter Road facility.

<u>John Flood – 22 Arkansas Avenue</u> – Mr. Flood said it was very nice to recognize Ms. Hughes this evening. Also, he had questions about resolutions 9, 10 and 11 on the agenda for approval.

<u>Dave Breeden – 114 Victoria Lane</u> – Mr. Breeden asked about agenda items having to do with entertainers and performers being charged to the operating budget. He said that he supports the 6th Street bathrooms and asked that all aspects of the project be fully disclosed.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to approve the regular city council meeting minutes of Thursday, March 22, 2018. Motion moved by Mr. Hartzell, seconded by Mr. Wilson. All ayes followed.

REPORTS – MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION:

Mr. Allegretto provided an explanation on resolutions 9, 10 and 11 on the agenda for approval. Having the entertainers is an opportunity to offset the costs and the performers are also going to participate in Night and Venice and appear in the boat parade. Doing so helps to create the opportunity to promote Ocean City to reach an even larger market.

REPORTS – CITY COUNCIL:

Mr. Barr reported that the Utility Advisory Commission plans to bring forward revisions to their ordinance and hopes to adopt the new version in the fall.

Mr. Hartzell commented on Community Services and stated that it is designed to give back to the community and also to help put forth the effort to keep kids safe.

Mr. DeVlieger stated that he wants to continue to look at ways to draft an ordinance opposing the legalization of recreational marijuana in Ocean City. Also, Mr. DeVlieger commended the Police Department for the Share Your Keys program that they have done at the schools.

Ms. Bergman reported on the Tourism Commission meeting that was held today. They discussed their 2018 advertising campaign and the commission will utilize TV and social media as well as a contest which will track the advertising on the internet. Ms. Bergman reported that last year there was over 3 million views on the Facebook page. She encouraged everyone to download the new app on their phones which will include a calendar of events, rental information and Chamber of Commerce information. She also said that she is happy to see events being enhanced with celebrities.

Mr. Wilson addressed Ms. Moore's comments and he said he does understand the concern about toxins.

ORDINANCES: SECOND READING & PUBLIC HEARING

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 18-04 on second reading and public hearing. Motion made by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Ms. Bergman. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 18-04 – An Ordinance Amending Ordinance #87-17, Chapter XXX, "Municipal Fees" of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City (Electric Golf Cart Fees)

Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson explained this ordinance allows for a minor change to the fee for the Electric cart rental per person. The proposed fee will be \$10.00 per player, year round as opposed to \$20.00 per round.

Mr. Madden opened the meeting up for public comment on Ordinance No. 18-04. There was not anyone who wished to speak. Mr. Madden closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 18-04 on second reading. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, second by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 18-06 on second reading and public hearing. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. Wilson. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 18-06 - An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Chapter X, Personnel Policies, Section 10-3 "Background Checks for Employees and Volunteers" of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City

Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson explained that this ordinance will keep the city in compliance with statute changes in regard to EOC guidance requirements.

Mr. Madden opened the meeting up for public comment on Ordinance No. 18-06. There was not anyone who wished to speak. Mr. Madden closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 18-06 on second reading. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Mr. Barr. All ayes followed.

On Wednesday, April 18th the Ocean City Democratic Club will be hosting a non-partisan dinner at the Tuckahoe Inn honoring Mr. Grimes, Mr. Woods, Mr. Hughes and Mr. Salmon and the proceeds go to scholarships.

Mr. Wilson thanked the 7th Street Surf Shop for hosting the fashion show and said it was a great event and a lot of fun.
