CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, JUNE 28, 2018 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Barr, Ms. Bergman, Mr. DeVlieger (7:20 p.m.), Mr. Hartzell, Mr. McClellan, Mr. Wilson and Mr. Madden. Present also Mayor Jay A. Gillian, Solicitor, Dorothy McCrosson and Business Administrator, George Savastano.

Council President Mr. Madden called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Ms. Bergman led the prayer. Mr. Madden announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

CITIZEN COMMENT:

Ed Poletti- 3000 Haven Ave - expressed his displeasure about the flooding in his neighborhood.

<u>Bob Dobil – 2837 Haven Ave</u> – spoke about the flooding in his neighborhood and suggested the check valves be serviced.

<u>Brian McPeak – 2917 Simpson Ave</u> – spoke about the flooding in his neighborhood and said he thinks there is a lack of information regarding the current project to resolve the flooding. He also asked for resolution number 19 to be pulled from the agenda because he does not want the city to pay AE Stone.

<u>Suzanne Hornick – 2962 West Ave</u> – spoke about the flood remediation projects and said that they must continue. She wanted to know why the city currently has a part-time business administrator and she also had some questions about engineering studies that have been done.

<u>Tracie Driscoll - 2900 Haven Ave</u> - asked about code requirements for curbs.

<u>Paul Leonetti – 3121 Byland Dr</u> – said that he's happy about the paving getting done in his neighborhood and wants it to continue. He also spoke about being able to ride his bike to the beach and due to the new curb put in at 32nd Street, he cannot get across. He expressed his concerns about the flooding issues as well.

<u>Mary Anne Munning – 3118 Haven Ave</u> – said that the flooding in her neighborhood is getting worse and is hopeful for remediation.

<u>Jack Bolger -201 Haven Ave</u> - spoke about the importance of the project being complete in his neighborhood. <u>Donna Moore - 21 Ocean Ave</u> - expressed her concerns about the chemicals being used on the open space because it is harmful not only for the environment, but for humans and the aquatic life.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt the regular city council meeting minutes of June 14, 2018. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. DeVlieger. All ayes followed.

REPORTS - MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION:

There were not any reports.

REPORTS – CITY COUNCIL:

Mr. Hartzell reported that on Saturday he and Mr. Barr talked to residents who are happy with the progress of the work being done around 29th Street and that there were some who are not happy. He thinks it is a good idea to talk about a more comprehensive view of plans for moving forward. Also, he commented that pulling a bill from the bill list that is scheduled to be paid is not the right thing to do if the work has been done.

Mr. DeVlieger spoke about the north end project as far as a timeline and what can possibly be accomplished over the summer.

Ms. Bergman said that the summer concert series has begun and is in full swing. She asked that administration post weekly updated to keep residents informed.

Mr. Barr said the city is working hard to make sure the project in the fourth ward gets completed and if anyone has any questions or concerns to let him know.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 18-08 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Ms. Bergman, seconded by Mr. Wilson. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 18-08 - A Bond Ordinance Appropriating \$10,250,000.00 and Authorizing the Issuance of \$9,737,500.00 In Bonds and Notes of the City of Ocean City For the Various Improvements or Purposes Authorized To Be Undertaken By the City of Ocean City, New Jersey

CFO, Frank Donato explained section 3 of this ordinance in detail.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 18-08 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Mr. Barr. All ayes followed.

Mr. Madden announced that second reading and public hearing is scheduled for July 12, 2018 and will be published according to law.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 18-09 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by MS. Bergman. All ayes followed with the exception of Mr. Wilson who abstained. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 18-09 - An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Chapter XXV, Zoning and Land Development of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Ocean City <u>Drive-In Business (DB) Zone</u>

Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson explained that this ordinance permits detached single-family homes (R-1-30 standards) as a conditional use, though not on 9th Street nor West Avenue, nor north of 10th Street, in the Drive-in Business Zone on lots 115' deep.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 18-09 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Ms. Bergman, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed with the exception of Mr. Wilson who abstained.

Mr. Madden announced that second reading and public hearing is scheduled for July 26, 2018 and will be published according to law.
