## CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES TUESDAY, OCTOBER 23, 2018 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Barr, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. McClellan and Mr. Wilson. Ms. Bergman and Mr. Madden were absent. Present also was Mayor Gillian, Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano and Director of Human Resources, Ms. Woods, Esq. Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson was absent.

Council Vice President Mr. Wilson called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Mr. Hartzell led the prayer. Mr. Wilson announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

### CITIZEN COMMENT:

<u>Dave Breeden – 114 Victoria Lane</u> – commented on Resolution No. 12 on the agenda for approval. He also commented on the proposed Housing Authority Shared Services Agreement.

### APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to approve the regular city council meeting minutes of October 11, 2018. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed.

# REPORTS - MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION:

Mayor Gillian reported on the amended petitions that were submitted to the City Clerk's office on Monday, October 22, 2018 protesting Bond Ordinance No. 18-10. He recommended a repeal ordinance for first reading and introduction at the next regular city council meeting. Mayor Gillian also reported that the pumps at the airport are working.

### REPORTS - CITY COUNCIL:

Mr. DeVlieger mentioned that the north end pump station project is moving along nicely.

Mr. Hartzell commented that the Housing Authority Shared Services Agreement is a long term solution to COAH issues. Mr. Hartzell said he supports taking care of the residents in the Housing Authority and it is the city's duty to help the less fortunate.

## ORDINANCE: FIRST READING & INTRODUCTION:

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 18-13 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Hartzell, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 18-13: An Ordinance Authorizing the City of Ocean City to Convey to the County of Cape May, Block 811.01, Lot 4 for the Sum of \$650,000 and to Execute a Leasing and Management Agreement with the County of Cape May

Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano explained that this ordinance would authorize the Mayor or his designee to sign all documents required to sell the former Getty Station property, 1-7 9<sup>th</sup> Street, shown on the tax map as Block 811.01, Lot 4, to Cape May County for \$650,000, and to enter into a leasing and management contract regarding the said property.

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to approve Ordinance No. 18-13 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. McClellan, seconded by Mr. Hartzell. All ayes followed. Mr. Wilson announced that second reading and public hearing for Ordinance No. 18-13 is scheduled for Thursday, November 29, 2018 and will be published according to law.

## ORDINANCE: SECOND READING & PUBLIC HEARING:

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 18-12 on second reading and public hearing. Motion moved by Mr. Hartzell, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 18-12: An Ordinance Amending Ordinance #87-17, Chapter XX "Municipal Fees" of the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City, New Jersey (2018 Fee Ordinance – First Night Buttons)

Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano explained that this ordinance is being amended to include the fees for First Night Buttons.

Mr. Wilson opened the meeting up for public comment on Ordinance No. 18-12. There wasn't anyone from the public who wished to speak. Mr. Wilson closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 18-12 on second reading and public hearing. Motion moved by Mr. Hartzell, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed.
