CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2018 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

<u>Lee Ann Kampf – 42 W. 15th Street</u> – spoke about Ordinance No. 18-15 and said she supports the city purchasing the referenced property and is against the repeal ordinance.

<u>Pete Sokolowski – 240 Simpson Ave</u> – said that he is in favor of open space and also spoke about the bulkhead at 308 Bay Avenue.

<u>Linda Walsh – 200 Simpson Ave</u> – spoke about flooding in her neighborhood and she also spoke about the bulkhead at 308 Bay Avenue; money is wasted if the bulkhead is not addressed.

<u>Jane Abbott – 215 Simpson Ave</u> – spoke about remedying the problem with the bulkhead at 308 Bay Avenue. <u>Donna Moore – 21 Ocean Ave</u> – spoke about flooding issues and said the city needs to coordinate efforts to remediate regarding all four bridges.
