# CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, DECEMBER 27, 2018 – 1:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

**ATTENDANCE:** Mr. Barr, Ms. Bergman, Mr. DeVlieger, and Mr. Madden. Present also was Mayor Gillian, Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano and Elizabeth Woods, Esq. Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. McClellan and Mr. Wilson were absent.

Also, Ms. Moore expressed her concerns about the cost of entertainment. She wanted to know how the money is being compensated for the entertainers.
