ORDINANCE 19-01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER XXV, OCEAN CITY ZONING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY, SECTION 25-203.5, "PROHIBITED USES AND STRUCTURES IN ALL ZONES"

(Prohibiting businesses which cultivate, manufacture, test or sell marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia.)

WHEREAS, the Zoning and Land Use ordinances of the City of Ocean City do not include regulations related to the sale of medicinal marijuana, nor recreational marijuana, nor the paraphernalia which facilitates the use thereof; and,

WHEREAS, the unregulated location of establishments which sell marijuana of either type and/or the paraphernalia that facilitate the use thereof raises legitimate and substantial concerns about the impact of such establishments on the City, including questions about the compatibility of such establishments with existing uses and development in residential and commercial zones; the compatibility of such establishments with schools and recreational facilities which are frequented by minors, including, but not limited to, parks, playgrounds, basketball and tennis courts, the skateboard park, the sports fields and track, and the boardwalk; and the possible illicit sale and use of marijuana and marijuana products to minors and misuse of marijuana and marijuana products; and,

WHEREAS, the possible effect of the location and operation of retail marijuana establishments within the City has potentially serious implications for the health, safety and welfare of the City, its residents, its guests and its employees;

WHEREAS, the City desires to ensure that such facilities are not allowed within ¼ mile of a school, church, recreational/sports facility, the boardwalk or any residential zone; and,

WHEREAS, there is no area of the City which can safely house a business selling medicinal and recreational marijuana and/or the paraphernalia that facilitates the use of same;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1

The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth at length.

SECTION 2

Section 25-203.5, **Prohibited Uses and Structures in All Zones**, is hereby amended to include the following:

j. The operation of marijuana cultivation facilities, marijuana product manufacturing facilities, marijuana testing facilities and the sale of marijuana and/or paraphernalia that facilitates the use of marijuana.

SECTION 3

All ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4

If any portion of this Ordinance is declared to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remaining portions of the Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5

This Ordinance shall take effect in the time and manner prescribed by law.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the 2019 Budget for the Special Improvement District is hereby adopted.



In response to our recent on-site meeting, the following proposal has been prepared for the engineering and in-house State licensed site remediation professional (LSRP) to provide the services required for the pending storage tank project at the two referenced sites: the Ocean City Department of Public Works (DPW) and Fleet Maintenance facility, addressed at 1000 Haven Avenue; and the Ocean City Code Enforcement & Fire Headquarters addressed at 550 Asbury Avenue. Work at both sites will include removal of the existing underground storage tank (UST) systems (tanks, dispensers, etc.) and installation of new aboveground storage tank (AST) systems (tanks, dispensers, etc.).

ARH Associates will oversee the project as required, prepare the plans/ specifications needed for the public bid of the actual tank removal/ installation work, and complete all of the NJDEP permitting/ sampling/ reporting/ etc. outlined in the tasks below.

LSRP Retention & Oversight

With the passage of the State's Site Remediation Reform Act (SRRA) and implementation of the State's Administrative Requirements for the Remediation of Contaminated Sites (ARRCS) Rules, this work must now be performed by or with the oversight of a State licensed site remediation professional (LSRP). As such, the following administrative items will be needed for the project, based upon the assumptions made:

- Prepare/ submit electronically the State's LSRP Notification of Retention or Dismissal form for each site. This form will need to be submitted at the beginning of the 'project' for retention.

Note that the Client, as the remediating party, will be required to sign certain forms and pay any and all NJDEP fees, whether currently outstanding or estimated in future.

Engineering Design, Plans & Specifications

\$12,500

ARH will design a new aboveground storage tank (AST) fuel facility for each of the two sites; noting that conceptual details of the design were discussed in the November 29th memorandum. Site specific design considerations to be assessed include: tank pad foundation/ bearing capacity; floodplain/ buoyancy calculations; traffic flow/ circulation; lighting; drainage; pavement/ sidewalks; and landscaping. ARH will 'survey' the existing conditions and work with equipment manufacturers/ suppliers to specify the tanks and appurtenances needed to meet the City's criteria.

In connection with the design, ARH will prepare a technical set of plans & specifications that the City can then utilize to solicit bids from qualified contractors to conduct the tank removal/installation work deemed necessary. The currently envisioned scope will focus on the physical removal of the UST systems (tanks, piping, pumps, etc.), along with the installation of a new AST systems (tanks, piping, pumps, etc.). For the purpose of this proposal, it is assumed that no local approval (i.e., Site Plan, etc.), County permits/ approvals (i.e., SCD, etc.) or State (i.e., NJDEP, etc.) will be required other than those mentioned elsewhere herein; and that there is no need for specialized services (i.e., dewatering, structural engineering, utility re-routing, electrical/ plumbing design, etc.).

For the public bid 'package', it is assumed that the City will utilize their specification 'fronts' and 'backs' (i.e., administrative sections) and will be responsible for advertising the bid and conducting the bid opening. ARH staff will assist the City with the pre-bid meeting and/or site walk, if required, and will review the bids received after which a recommendation of award will be provided.

UST & AST Permitting

\$750

ARH has researched NJDEP's database to determine the registration status of the subject underground storage tanks (USTs); and has confirmed that the tanks are registered. As such, it is assumed that no back-registration fees are likely due to NJDEP.

With respect to the pending closure of the USTs, a 14-Day Notice of Intent to Close an Underground Storage Tank System will be prepared/ submitted electronically to initiate the administrative process with NJDEP. It is also understood that the City selected contractor(s) will be responsible for obtaining the local permits from the municipal code official for the work. After the tank closure work is complete, ARH will assist in revising the tank registration forms to document the closure of the tanks for the State's registration and billing purposes.



UST Soil Sampling & Analysis

\$4,650

Working closely with the tank removal contractor to be selected by the City, ARH personnel will complete an assessment of each UST area, as required by NJDEP, to determine if contamination is present. It is assumed that all USTs will be removed (in lieu of abandonment); and clear access will be provided for the purpose of sampling. The assessment will include the following steps:

- Preparation of equipment; travel to and from the project sites, testing lab, and home station; and cleaning, decontaminating, and recalibrating of sampling/testing equipment. This task includes all items to ensure that the quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) requirements for all samples have been satisfied and that all NJDEP guidelines for collection, preservation, and transport of samples for analysis are followed as outlined in NJDEP's Field Sampling Procedures Manual.
- In order to investigate the subsurface soil in the area of the two USTs to be closed at the 1000 Haven Avenue site, ARH will collect up to twelve (12) soil samples: five from within each of the two tank excavations, and one from under each dispenser. This number of samples assumes that groundwater will be encountered. However, the sampling locations and frequency may need to be adjusted in the field so as to comply with the NJDEP guidance.
- In order to investigate the subsurface soil in the area of the two USTs to be closed at the 550 Asbury Avenue site, ARH will collect up to twelve (12) soil samples: five from within each of the two tank excavations, and one from under each dispenser. This number of samples assumes that groundwater will be encountered. However, the sampling locations and frequency may need to be adjusted in the field so as to comply with the NJDEP guidance.
- It is assumed for the purpose of this proposal that the piping runs associated with the tanks are less than 15 linear feet and, therefore, no additional soil samples for the piping runs are included. However, the sampling locations and frequency (1 sample per 15 linear feet of piping) may need to be adjusted in the field so as to comply with NJDEP guidance.
- Based upon the contents of the tanks and the assumptions noted above, the soil samples will be collected and laboratory analyzed as follows:
 - All twelve (12) samples associated with the diesel fuel tank systems will be analyzed for extractable petroleum hydrocarbons (EPH) using the State's non-fractionized methodology. The laboratory fees, estimated to be \$960 for this item, are included in the proposal. If samples demonstrate EPH concentrations over the State's investigative action level of 1,000 ppm, then they will also need to be analyzed for 2-methylnaphthalene and naphthalene at an additional cost of approximately \$135 per sample.

Likewise, all twelve (12) samples associated with the gasoline tank systems will be analyzed for volatile organic compounds with a forward library search (VO+10), utilizing encore kits. The laboratory fees, estimated to be \$1,380 for this item, are included in the proposal. This proposal assumes a standard 10-day laboratory turn-around-time (TAT) for all sample analyses.

The engineering cost provided for this task assumes that all field sampling work will be completed over a 2-day period. Should other tanks be discovered and/or additional sampling be required that



necessitates ARH personnel to return to the site, such work would be considered an extra and invoiced on a time & materials basis at our current billing rates.

UST Closure Reporting

At the conclusion of the UST closure work, ARH will prepare a site investigation (SI) report for each of the two sites. These reports will in narrative form detail all work conducted in relation to this phase of the project, including the results of all laboratory analyses and field screenings. The reports will clearly and concisely display all pertinent data and information in tables and figures that will assist in the understanding of the investigative findings. Quality assurance and quality control documentation required by NJDEP will also be included.

As part of the reporting, an electronic data submission (EDS) will be prepared/submitted to NJDEP for the soil sampling data collected during the phase of the project. The EDS will include the X and Y coordinates (i.e., latitude and longitude) generated during the survey work and assigned to each of the samples reported by the laboratory and all of the associated analytical.

Assuming the sampling conducted during the UST removal work is 'clean', ARH will prepare a Response Action Outcome letter for the subject AOCs at each site at no additional cost. With this submission, an electronic copy of all case-related documents will also be prepared/ submitted to NJDEP.

Construction Management & Inspection

\$5,800

\$4,125

In connection with the work to be conducted by the contractor(s) selected by the City, ARH will provide periodic inspection services, assuming that City staff will provide daily inspections if needed. The periodic inspections (not to exceed 40 hours) to be conducted by ARH will be completed during the course of the on-site work; and construction management (not to exceed 16 hours) in the form of review/approval of change orders and payment requests will also be provided.

Meetings \$500

The cost associated with meetings, along with the preparation of graphics and other associated consulting related to such meetings, will be invoiced on a time & materials basis in accordance with our standard rate schedule. However, an allowance of \$500 is estimated for this task and is included in the proposal.

For budgetary purposes, the cost to perform the work as outlined above is estimated to be \$30,250; except for extra work requested by the client or mandated by NJDEP and/or revised as per the unit costs/ estimates provided. This dollar amount includes mileage, reproduction, and other reasonable out-of-pocket expenses and does not include work that is not specifically noted in the proposal. This proposal assumes our access to the site and all relevant existing data concerning the project.

The terms and conditions of this proposal constitute the entire agreement between the parties pertaining to the work and supersede all inquiries, proposals, agreements, negotiations and commitments, whether



written or oral, prior to the date of execution of this contract pertaining to the work on this contract. The provisions of this contract may be changed only by a writing executed by the parties to this contract.

We trust that you will find this proposal satisfactory. If so, please approve in the space provided below and return the original to our office.

This proposal is acceptable as stated, and I hereby authorize ARH Associates to proceed with the work as outlined above. Additionally, I agree to hold ARH harmless for any claims or penalties assessed by NJDEP or other agencies for my failure to comply with the regulatory and mandatory timeframes set forth in the applicable regulations or other recalcitrant actions including providing untrue, inaccurate or incomplete information.

RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING INTEREST RATES FOR DELINQUENT TAX PAYMENTS AND OTHER MUNICIPAL CHARGES

WHEREAS, New Jersey Statues Annotated 54:4-67, as revised by Assembly Bill 3170, permits the governing body of a municipality to affix the rate of interest to be charged for the non-payment of taxes or assessments on or before the date when they would come delinquent; and

WHEREAS, NJSA 54:7-67 has been amended to permit the fixing of said rate of 8% per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency and 18% per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00 and allows and additional penalty of 6% be collected against a delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 on properties that fail to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Ocean City desires to establish appropriate and just interest rates for delinquent taxes so as to ensure the prompt payment of City taxes and to therefore so properly and fairly legislate the fiscal affairs of the City of Ocean City for the benefit of all its citizens and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Ocean City authorizes a grace period of ten (10) days before the taxes become delinquent, however, if payment is made after the grace period, the delinquency reverts back to the original due date; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the governing body of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, does hereby resolve as follows

- 1. The City shall charge no interest if payment of any tax installment is made within ten (10) days after the date upon which the tax becomes payable.
- 2. The rate of interest charged upon the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency shall be set at eight per cent (8%) per annum and eighteen per cent (18%) per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00 and if the total delinquency is in excess of \$10,000.00 and remains in arrears beyond December 31st, an additional penalty of 6% shall be charged against the delinquency, said interest calculation reverts back to the date of the tax payment.
- 3. The effective date of said rates shall be January 1, 2019.
- 4. This resolution shall also apply to assessments within the Special Improvement District (SID). The February 2019 S.I.D. payment will be due (25) days from the date the Tax Collector certifies the mailing of the 2019 S.I.D. billing. All subsequent quarterly tax installments will be due and payable as stated on the S.I.D. bill.
- 5. This Resolution shall also apply to all municipal charges.
- 6. A copy of this resolution shall be available for inspection in the Ocean City Clerk's Office. A copy of this resolution shall be published on two occasions in the Ocean City Sentinel Ledger.

RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING A CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY

WHEREAS, Local Fiscal Affairs Law N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-15.1 as amended by Chapter 148 of the pamphlet laws of the State of New Jersey required municipalities to adopt a Cash Management Plan which is designed to assure, to extent practicable, investment of local funds in interest bearing accounts and other permitted investments, and

WHEREAS, this Act requires that the Cash Management Plan include:

- A. The designation of a public depository or depositories.
- B. The authorization for investments as permitted by various applicable laws.
- C. The submission annually of the Cash Management Plan to the governing body, which must approve it by a majority vote.
- D. An annual audit of the Cash Management Plan.
- E. When an investment is in bonds maturing more than one year, a determination that the maturity approximates the prospective time when such funds are needed.

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has modified a plan as provided to the municipality by its bond counsel, McManimon & Scotland.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Ocean City that the attached Cash Management Plan be adopted.

CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN CITY OF OCEAN CITY COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

This Cash Management Plan (the "Plan") is prepared pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-14 in order to set forth the basis for the deposits ("Deposits") and investment ("Permitted Investments") of certain public funds of the City of Ocean City, pending the use of such funds for the intended purposes. The Plan is intended to assure that all public funds identified herein are deposited in interest bearing Deposits or otherwise invested in Permitted Investments hereinafter referred to. The intent of the Plan is to provide that the decisions made with regard to the Deposits and the Permitted Investments will be done to insure the safety, the liquidity (regarding its availability for the intended purposes), and the maximum investment return within such limits. The Plan is intended to insure that any Deposit or Permitted Investment matures within the time period that approximates the prospective need for the funds deposited or invested so that there is not a risk to the market value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.

IDENTIFICATION OF FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS TO BE COVERED BY THE PLAN II.

The Plan is intended to cover the deposit and/or investment of the following funds and accounts of the A. City of Ocean City:

General/Grant Funds Capital Funds Trust Funds

DESIGNATION OF OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY AUTHORIZED TO MAKE III. DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS UNDER THE PLAN

The Chief Financial Officer of the City of Ocean City, {the "Designated Official"} or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to deposit and/or invest the funds referred to in the Plan. Prior to making any such Deposits or any Permitted Investments, such officials of the City of Ocean City are directed to supply to all depositories or any other parties with whom the Deposits or Permitted Investments are made a written copy of this Plan, which shall be acknowledged in writing by parties, and a copy of such acknowledgment kept on file with such officials.

DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORIES IV.

The following banks and financial institutions are hereby designated as official depositories for the Deposit of all public funds referred to in the Plan, including any certificates of Deposit, which are not otherwise invested in Permitted Investments as provided for in this Plan:

TD Bank

Ocean First Bank

New Jersey Cash Management Plan

PFM Asset Management, L.L.C. (formerly referred to as New Jersey ARM)

Santander Bank

Parke Bank

Sturdy Savings Bank

Other depositories so designated by the State of New Jersey

All such depositories shall acknowledge in writing receipt of this Plan by sending a copy of such acknowledgement to the Designated Official(s) referred to in Section III above.

DESIGNATION OF BROKERAGE FIRMS AND DEALERS WITH WHOM THE V. DESIGNATED OFFICIALS MAY DEAL - N/A

The following brokerage firms and/or dealers and other institutions are hereby designated as firms with whom the Designated Official(s) of the City of Ocean City referred to in this Plan may deal for purposes of buying and selling securities identified in this Plan as Permitted Investments or otherwise providing for in writing receipt of this Plan by sending a copy of such acknowledgement to the Designated Official (s) referred to in Section III above.

AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS VI.

- Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Designated Official is hereby authorized to A. invest the public funds covered by this Plan, to the extent not otherwise held in Deposits, in the following Permitted Investments:
- Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United (1) States of America;
- Government money market mutual funds; (2)

- Any obligation that a federal agency or a federal instrumentality has issued in accordance with an act of (3) Congress, which security has a maturity date not greater than 397 days from the date of purchase, provided that such obligation bears a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or other external
- Bonds or other obligations of the Local Unit or bonds or other obligations of school districts of which (4) the Local Unit is a part or within which the school district is located;
- Bonds or other obligations, having a maturity date not more than 397 days from the date of purchase, (5) approved by the Division of Investment of the Department of the Treasury for investment by Local Units;
- Local government investment pools:
- (6) Deposits with the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund established pursuant to Section 1 of P.L. (7) 1977, c.281 (C.52: 18A-90.4); or
- Agreements for the repurchase of fully collateralized securities if: (8)
 - the underlying securities are permitted investments pursuant to paragraphs (1) and 3) of this subsection a;
 - the custody of collateral is transferred to a third party. (b)
 - The maturity of the agreement is not more than 30 days; (c)
 - The underlying securities are purchased through a public depository as defined in Section 1 of (d) P.L. 1970, c .23 6 (C .17: 9-41); and
- A master repurchase agreement providing for the custody and security of collateral is executed.

For purposes of the above language, the terms "government money market mutual fund" and local government investment pool" shall have the following definitions:

Government Money Market Mutual Fund

An investment company or investments trust:

- Which is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission under the "Investment Company Act of 1940," 15 U.S.C. sec. 80a-1 et seq, and operated in accordance with 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7.
- the portfolio of which is limited to U.S. Government securities that meet the definition of and (b) eligible security pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such U.S. Government securities; and
- Which has: (c)
- retained the highest ranking or the highest letter and numerical rating of a nationally recognized (I) statistical rating organization; or
- Retained an investment advisor registered or exempt from registration with the Securities and (II)Exchange Commission pursuant to the "Investment Advisors Act of 1940," 15 U.S.C. sec. 80b-1 et seq., with experience investing in U.S. Government securities for at least the most recent past 60 months and with assets under management in excess of \$500 million.

Local Government Investment Pool

An investment pool:

- Which is managed in accordance with 1 7 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7; (a)
- Which is rated in the highest category by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization; (b)
- Which is limited to U.S. Government securities that meet the definition of an eligible security (c) pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such U.S. Government securities;
- which is in compliance with rules adopted pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L. d) 1968, c.410 (c.52: 14B-1 et seq.) by the Local which Finance Board of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, which rules shall provide for disclosure and reporting requirements, and other provisions deemed necessary by the Board to provide for the safety, liquidity and yield of the investments;
- which does not permit investments in instruments that: are subject to high price volatility with (e) changing market conditions; cannot reasonably be expected, at the time of interest rate adjustment, to have a market value that approximates their par value; or utilize an index that does not support a stable net asset value; and
- which purchases and redeems investments directly from the issuer, government money market (f) mutual fund, or the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, or through the use of a national or State bank located within this State, or through a broker-dealer which, at the time of purchase or redemption, has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to Section 9 of P.L. 1867 c9 (C.49: 3-56) and has at least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in U.S. Government securities and reports daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York its position in and borrowing on such U.S. Government securities.
- B. Notwithstanding the above authorization, the monies on hand in the following funds and accounts shall be further limited as to maturates, specific investments or otherwise as follows:

Consistent with State Statue/Rules & Regulations as promulgated by the Department of Community Affairs.

SAFEKEEPING CUSTODY PAYMENT AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RECEIPT OF

To the extent that any Deposit or Permitted Investment involves a document or security, which is not physically held by the City of Ocean City, then such instrument or security shall be covered by a custodial agreement with an independent third party, which shall be a bank or financial institution in the State of New Jersey. Such institution shall provide for the designation of such investments in the name of the City of Ocean City to assure that there is no unauthorized use of the funds or the Permitted Investments or Deposits. Purchase of any Permitted Investments that involve securities shall be executed by a "delivery versus payment" method to insure that such Permitted Investments are received either by the City of Ocean City or by a third, party custodian prior to or upon release of the City's funds.

To assure that all parties with whom the City of Ocean City deals either by way of Deposits or Permitted Investments are award of the authority and the limits set forth in this Plan, all such parties shall be supplied with a copy of this Plan in writing and all such parties shall acknowledge the receipt of that Plan in writing, a copy of

which shall be on file with the Designated Official(s).

VIII. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

On the first day of each month following the receipt of the monthly statements from the various financial institutions during which this Plan is in effect, the Designated Official(s) referred to in Section III hereof shall supply or make available to the City Clerk/governing body of the City of Ocean City a written report of any Deposits or Permitted Investments made pursuant to this Plan, which shall include, at a minimum, summary of bank reconciliations. The following information may be supplied if applicable:

The name of any institution holding funds of the City of Ocean City as a Deposit or Permitted Investment.

- The amount of securities or Deposits purchased or sold during the immediately preceding month. В.
- The class or type of securities purchased or Deposits made. C.

The book value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments. D.

The earned income on such Deposits or Permitted Investments. To the extent that such amounts E. are actually earned at maturity, this report shall provide an accrual of such earnings during the immediately preceding month.

The fees incurred to undertake such Deposits or Permitted Investments. F.

- The market value of all Deposits or Permitted Investments as of the end of the immediately G. preceding month.
- All other information, which may be deemed reasonable from time to time by the governing H. body of the City of Ocean City.

FASCIMILE SIGNATURES IX.

This plan hereby authorizes and directs TD Bank, N.A. to accept and pay out of the moneys on deposits with said bank to the credit of the City of Ocean City and any and all checks drawn upon said bank in the name of the City of Ocean City bearing the facsimile signature(s) of its officer(s) now or hereafter authorized to sign checks on behalf of the City of Ocean City, no matter by whom or how said facsimile signature(s) shall have been impressed thereon, the said facsimile signature(s) to be in the form of a specimen furnished to said bank.

TERM OF PLAN X.

This Plan shall be in effect from January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019. Attached to this Plan is a resolution of the governing body of the City of Ocean City approving this Plan for such period of time. The Plan may be amended from time to time. To the extent that any amendment is adopted by the Council, the Designated Official is directed to supply copies of the amendments to all of the parties who otherwise have received the copy of the originally approved Plan, which amendment shall be acknowledged in writing in the same manner as the original Plan was so acknowledged.
