CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, MARCH 14, 2019 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Barr, Ms. Bergman, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. McClellan, Mr. Wilson and Mr. Madden. Present also was Mayor Gillian, Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano and Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson. Mr. Hartzell was absent.

Council President Mr. Madden called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Ms. Bergman led the prayer. Mr. Madden announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

CITIZEN COMMENT:

<u>Bob Dubil – 2837 Haven Avenue</u> – distributed photos of his property on Haven Avenue, north of 29th Street and spoke about the drainage project that was done.

<u>Marty Mozzo – 3803 Westminster Lane</u> – commented on the capital plan and also on Resolution #2. Requested that the flooding mitigation Phase II for Merion Park be included in the capital plan.

<u>Bill Hartranft – 728 Battersea Road</u> – supports the ordinance pertaining to the ban of marijuana. Spoke about his concerns regarding the business administrator and his duties.

<u>Michael Hinchman – W. Atlantic Blvd</u> – commented on the capital plan. Spoke about change orders and gave his opinion about managerial skills.

<u>Dave Breeden – 114 Victoria Lane</u> – spoke about Resolution #2 and also about the housing authority resolution.

<u>Donna Moore – 21 Ocean Avenue</u> – spoke about chemical lawn pesticides being used in Ocean City and complied documents for council's review.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to approve the regular city council meeting minutes of Thursday, February 28, 2019. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. DeVlieger. All ayes followed.

REPORTS – MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION:

The 2019 Local Municipal Budget was presented by CFO, Frank Donato, III.

REPORTS – CITY COUNCIL:

There weren't any reports given.

ORDINANCES: FIRST READING & INTRODUCTION:

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 19-05 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. McClellan, seconded by Mr. DeVlieger. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 19-05 – An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City-Reorganization within Administrative Branch

Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson explained that this ordinance allows for Mr. Vince Beiker to be appointed to the Director of Community Development so that the city can maximize his talents. The Department of Community Development will manage engineering services, project construction, community planning and zoning administration, oversee construction code, enforce miscellaneous state and local codes and ordinances as well as oversee the Office of Licensing.

There as some discussion between the governing body.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 19-05 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Ms. Bergman. All ayes followed. Mr. Madden announced that second reading and public hearing on Ordinance No. 19-05 is scheduled for Thursday, March 28, 2019 and will be published according to law.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 19-06 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Ms. Bergman. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 19-06 – An Ordinance to Exceed the Municipal Budget Appropriation Limits and to Establish a Cap Bank per (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14) for Calendar Year 2019

CFO, Frank Donato explained that this ordinance allows the city the ability to bank funds if they are needed for the future.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 19-06 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed. Mr. Madden announced that second reading and public hearing on Ordinance No. 19-06 is scheduled for Thursday, April 11, 2019 and will be published according to law.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 19-07 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Ms. Bergman. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 19-07 – A Bond Ordinance Appropriating \$7,914,200.00 and Authorizing the Issuance of \$7,518,490.00 In Bonds and Notes of the City of Ocean City for the Various Improvements or Purposes Authorized to be Undertaken by the City of Ocean City, New Jersey

CFO, Frank Donato explained that this ordinance falls in line with the capital plan, is relative to Resolution No. 2 and he discussed the list of improvements in section 3 of the ordinance.

There was some discussion between the governing body members.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 19-07 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Ms. Bergman. All ayes followed. Mr. Madden announced that second reading and public hearing on Ordinance No. 19-07 is scheduled for Thursday, March 28, 2019 and will be published according to law.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 19-08 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 19-08 – A Bond Ordinance Providing Funds for the Purpose of Aiding the Ocean City Housing Authority with Respect to Housing Projects within Ocean City by the City of Ocean City, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey, Appropriating \$6,650,000 Therefor and Authorizing the Issuance of \$6,650,000 Bonds or Notes of the City to Finance the Cost Thereof

Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson explained that this ordinance will help the city to meet its affordable housing plan. This bond ordinance includes funds that will go towards building a structure on the parking lot adjacent to Bay View Manor which is on West Avenue. Once constructed, residents from Peck Beach Village North (which will be demolished) will move in. Bay View Manor will be rehabilitated. The Housing Authority will also contribute funds to the project.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 19-08 on first reading and introduction. Motion moved by Ms. Bergman, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed with the exception of Mr. Barr who abstained. Mr. Madden announced that second reading and public hearing on Ordinance No. 19-08 is scheduled for Thursday, March 28, 2019 and will be published according to law.

ORDINANCES: SECOND READING & PUBLIC READING:

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to take up Ordinance No. 19-02 on second reading and public hearing. Motion moved by Mr. DeVlieger, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 19-02 – An Ordinance Supplementing the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City (Boardwalk Entertainers)

Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson explained this ordinance prohibits electric amplified devices for performances.

Mr. Madden opened the meeting up for public comment on Ordinance No. 19-02.

<u>Brian Mulbert</u> – is a boardwalk entertainer and is concerned about playing his battery operated keyboard and asked for clarification regarding the wording in the ordinance

<u>Philip Mulbert</u> – concerns about electronic amplification

<u>Dave Hayes</u> – not in favor of the ordinance

Donna Moore – not in favor of the ordinance

There was discussion between the governing body and it was decided that the ordinance be tabled in an effort to clarify the wording.

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to table Ordinance No. 19-02. Motion moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Mr. DeVlieger. All ayes followed.

Mr. Wilson said he was very impressed with the young man who spoke to council about the boardwalk entertainer's ordinance.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Wilson informed everyone that he will not be attending the March 28th council meeting.

CITIZEN COMMENT:

<u>Marty Mozzo – 3803 Westminster Lane</u> – informed council that the NJDEP provides a list of what chemicals/pesticides are allowed to be used in New Jersey.

<u>Bill Hartranft – 728 Battersea Road</u> – commented on zoning issues relative to flooding. Also, he asked about the revenue from the charging station. Mr. Hartranft spoke about Ms. Moore's efforts regarding chemicals and pesticides.

<u>Dave Hayes – 641 Battersea Road</u> – said the budget presentation was excellent. He also stated that he is not in favor of Ordinance No. 19-08, but does support those who are less unfortunate. He commented on Resolution # 7

<u>Dave Breeden – 114 Victoria Lane</u> – spoke about ratable growth; construction taking place in town; the capital budget; roads and drainage; and spoke about the elimination of the engineer position in the city.

<u>Mary Crane – 103 Third Street</u> – thanked Mr. Beiker for all of his help and said that he went above and beyond for her.
