CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, APRIL 25, 2019 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Barr, Ms. Bergman, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. McClellan and Mr. Wilson. Present also was Mayor Gillian, Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano and Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson. Mr. Madden was absent.

Council Vice President Mr. Wilson called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Ms. Bergman led the prayer. Mr. Wilson announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

CITIZEN COMMENT:

<u>Chris Leibrandt – 1045 Asbury Ave</u> – expressed that he is not in favor of Ordinance No. 19-02 and said that the city would possibly be in violation of the American Disability Act if they pass the ordinance.

<u>Allen Shwartz – 1100 Central Ave</u> – said that Ordinance No. 19-02 enables discrimination of civil rights and that the city is putting themselves at risk.

Marty Mozzo - 3803 Westminster Lane - spoke about Merion Park Phase II and questioned why it is not included in the capital plan.

<u>Dave Hayes – 641 Battersea Road</u> – had questions and comments about Resolution No. 3 and Resolution No. 5 on the agenda for approval.

<u>Donna Moore – 21 Ocean Ave</u> – spoke about Resolution No. 3 and asked that it be pulled from the consent agenda. Also, Ms. Moore expressed her concerns about pesticides that were applied to Veteran's Park on April 5th

Georgina Shanley – 2117 Bay Ave – said that she is not in favor of the three minute time limit for citizen comment. Also, she said that it is the city's responsibility to protect the people from harmful chemicals and pesticides. She also commented on Resolution No. 2 on the agenda for approval.

<u>Dr. Steven Fenichel - 2117 Bay Ave</u> – commented on the dangers of chemicals and pesticides being applied on lawns.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to adopt the regular city council meeting minutes of Thursday, April 11, 2019. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed with the exception of Ms. Bergman who abstained.

REPORTS - MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION:

Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano provided an explanation on Resolution No. 3 and also on Resolution No. 5 both on the agenda for approval.

Mr. Wilson read a proclamation "Declaring April 26, 2019 Arbor Day in Ocean City, New Jersey"

ORDINANCE: SECOND READING & PUBLIC HEARING:

Mr. Wilson asked for a motion to take up Ordinance no. 19-02 on second reading and public hearing. Motion moved by Ms. Bergman, seconded by Mr. McClellan. All ayes followed. The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 19-02 – An Ordinance Supplementing the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Ocean City (Boardwalk Entertainers)

Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson explained that this ordinance prohibits electronic amplifiers for performances. However, an electronic instrument, such as a keyboard, is permitted provided that the music is not audible thirty feet from the Boardwalk railing adjacent to which the entertainer is performing.

Mr. Wilson opened the meeting up for public comment on Ordinance No. 19-02.
