## CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, JULY 11, 2019 – 7:00 PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Barr, Ms. Bergman, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. Wilson and Mr. Madden. Present also was Mayor Gillian Solicitor, Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano and Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson. Mr. McClellan was absent.

Council President Mr. Madden called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Ms. Bergman led the prayer. Mr. Madden announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

### **REPORTS – ADMINISTRATION:**

Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano spoke about the issues that the city is having with trash collection. The city is not 100% satisfied with their (Gold Medal) service and he spoke about some of the on-going issues that have occurred. Also, Mr. Savastano said that the city is considering assessing the damages and the city is doing what they can to compel compliance with the contract.

#### **CITIZEN COMMENT:**

<u>Susan Cracovaner – 156 Asbury Ave</u> – expressed concerns about vehicles, bikers and pedestrian safety. She gave suggestions about what can be done to keep everyone safe.

Wayne Mozzo – 1333 Pleasure Ave – said that the dunes need to be protected and also that the temporary air conditioner unit that is on the sand at the Music Pier needs a safety fence to keep children away from it.

<u>Dave Haves – 641 Battersea Road</u> — said that FIT supports the purchase of the property at 16<sup>th</sup> and Haven and thinks it is a great opportunity for the city, however he would like to know the purpose of the property and suggests negotiating hard for the benefit of the taxpayers.

<u>Marie Hayes – 641 Battersea Road</u> – thanked the Mayor for his successful negotiations with the owners of Frenchie's on the beach.

<u>Donna Moore – 21 Ocean Ave</u> – spoke about pesticides applied to the Ocean City athletic fields and she presented a fact sheet to council and administration.

<u>Dave Breeden – 114 Victoria Lane</u> – said that he is happy to see that the city is looking to acquire the property at 16<sup>th</sup> and Haven. He also spoke regarding the trash collection contract that the city has with Gold Medal.

### APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to adopt the regular city council meeting minutes of Thursday, June 27, 2019. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Mr. DeVlieger. All ayes followed.

Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano addressed the public comments regarding the dunes and he also addressed public comment about the trash collection.

The clerk read the ordinance by title. Ordinance No. 19-10 – A Bond Ordinance of the City of Ocean City, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey Amending the Project Descriptions, Useful Lives and Average Useful Life of Bond Ordinance #15-29, Finally Adopted December 17, 2015, Bond Ordinance #16-19, Finally Adopted August 11, 2016 and Bond Ordinance #17-09, Finally Adopted May 23, 2017

CFO, Mr. Donato provided an explanation and also informed council that there is a bond sale approaching in September.
