BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THEACQUISITION OF PROPERTY IN AND BY THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$6,545,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$6,217,750 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the City of Ocean City, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey (the "City") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$6,545,000, including the sum of \$327,250 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously-adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$6,217,750 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is the acquisition of property located at 1601-43 Simpson Avenue, 1620 Haven Avenue, 1628-38 Haven Avenue, 1640 Haven Avenue and 1644-46 Haven Avenue, more specifically known as Block 1606, Lots 2, 3.01, 4, 5 and 6 on the tax maps of the City, including all related costs and expenditures necessary therefor and incidental thereto.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or other applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

- Section 5. The City hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the City is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.
 - Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the City may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 40 years.

- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the City as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$6,217,750, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$654,500 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.
- Section 7. The City hereby declares the intent of the City to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of the Treasury Regulations.
- Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3(a) hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.
- Section 9. The chief financial officer of the City is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the City and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the City. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the City pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the City and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the City fails to comply with its undertaking, the City shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.
- Section 10. The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and the City shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the City for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.
- Section 11. The Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk and City Attorney, as the case may be, are authorized pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-1 et seq., and any other applicable law, to prepare and sign any and all necessary documentation to effectuate the acquisition as described herein, concerning the property located at 1601-43 Simpson Avenue, 1620 Haven Avenue, 1628-38 Haven Avenue, 1640 Haven Avenue and 1644-46 Haven Avenue, more specifically known as Block 1606, Lots 2, 3.01, 4, 5 and 6 on the tax maps of the City, including, but not limited to, any contracts and amendments thereto and all closing documents needed to complete the purchase.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-06

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER XVIII - BEACHES, BOARDWALKS AND RECREATIONAL AREAS

(Motor Vehicles on Beaches)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1.

Chapter XVIII, Beaches, Boardwalks and Recreational Areas, shall be revised as follows:

18-5 MOTOR VEHICLES ON BEACHES.

18-5.1 Prohibited on Beaches.

Except as permitted by the provisions of this section, it shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle (including an automobile, truck, motorcycle or any other vehicle of any nature driven by motor power) on the beaches of the City. (Ord. #21-78, § 1; Ord. #91-17, § 1)

18-5.2 Exceptions; Permits.

Permits may be issued by the Chief of Police of the City authorizing persons to operate motor vehicles on certain beaches of the City subject to the following conditions. Such vehicles must be able to transmit power to four (4) wheels and shall not have dual wheels. Such vehicles shall be legally registered and have passed the current inspection required in the State of Registration. A permit shall only be issued to a person licensed to drive a motor vehicle without conditions or restrictions on his or her driving privileges (except those that would not interfere with safe operation of the vehicle on the beaches). Such licensed vehicle shall be covered by at least the minimum personal injury and property damage liability insurance limits required by the State of New Jersey. A permit shall only be issued for the purposes of fishing in the surf adjacent to the beach. Permits shall not be issued for sightseeing on the beach or for any other reason. (Ord. #21-78, § 2; Ord. #91-17, § 1)

18-5.3 Fees.

The person to whom the permit is issued shall pay an annual fee as established in Chapter XXX, Schedule B. of these Revised General Ordinances at the time of the issuance of the permit and a copy of this section shall be delivered to such person. In addition thereto each licensed vehicle shall conspicuously display on the driver's side of the rear window of the vehicle such decal or other similar identification sticker or device as shall be provided by the City. (Ord. #21-78, § 3; Ord. #91-17, § 1; Ord. #92-15)

- 18-5.4 Application for Permit. a. Any person desiring to obtain a permit under this section to operate a motor vehicle on the beaches of the City shall make application giving his or her name, address, driver's license number, vehicle registration number and other information identifying the vehicle to be operated (including the type of vehicle, make, year, serial number, and color) to the Police Department.
- b. There shall normally be a limit of four hundred (400) permits issued in any one (1) year, however the Chief of Police may use discretion in issuing more permits if needed. Persons possessing permits in the preceding year shall have priority in obtaining a permit in the following year. If there are additional permits to be issued, not exceeding four hundred (400), they shall be done on the basis of the following priority:
- 1. Owners of real estate in Ocean City;
- 2. Residents of Ocean City;
- 3. Others.

- c. Applications are due on September 1st of each year. Any permittee not returning his or her completed application by the end of the business day (4:30pm) September 1st will automatically lose the opportunity for permit renewal. Thereafter, in order to obtain a permit such former permittee shall re-apply as if he or she never possessed a permit in the past. This may include being added to the bottom of an existing waiting list.
- 18-5.5 Limitation of Time and Place; Access to Beach Restrictions.

The operation of motor vehicles on the beaches of the City shall only be permitted during the period from September 15 of any year to May 15 of the following year. During the period of time from September 15 to September 30 and May 1 through May 15 vehicles shall not be permitted on the beach between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. When authorized to be on the beaches as specified herein, vehicles shall only be permitted between Seaview Road, within one hundred (100') feet of the terminal (northernmost) stone jetty or groin; Surf Road and North Street; and 23rd Street and 59th Street, with the following exceptions:

- a. Vehicles shall be permitted for special occasions (such as municipally sponsored fishing tournaments for which specific permission is granted) and for providing assistance in emergencies threatening life or property.
- b. Vehicles are not permitted from March 15th through September 30th.
- 1. In the area from the Longport Bridge to the terminal (northernmost) stone jetty or groin.
- 2. In the area between 23rd Street and 34th Street.

Access to the beach shall be provided at the following locations: Morningside Road; 23rd Street; 29th Street; 34th Street; 57th Street; 59th Street. The Chief of Police, upon consultation with the Mayor, City Administrator and City Engineer, may from time to time designate other or additional locations where access to the beach shall be permitted. All such locations shall be posted with appropriate signs. It shall be unlawful for any persons to enter upon or exit the beach from any other location.

Section 2.

All ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 3.

If any portion of this ordinance is declared to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A REVOCABLE LICENSE FOR FENCE ENCROACHMENT FOR PLACEMENT OF A FENCE WITHIN THE CITY RIGHTS-OF-WAY KNOWN AS WEST AVENUE AND 33RD STREET ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 301 33RD STREET, LOT 2, BLOCK 3203.

WHEREAS, Vincent and Karly De Meis (hereinafter, "Licensees") are the owners of the property shown as Lot 2, Block 3203 on the Official Tax Map of the City of Ocean City, also known as 301 33rd Street, and adjacent to which, within a portion of the City's rights-of-way known as West Avenue and 33rd Street, the Licensees wish to construct a fence in order to enhance the safety of their front and side yards for children and pets; and,

WHEREAS, City officials have inspected the property and determined that placement of the fence on both street sides of this corner lot, along the edge of the existing sidewalks as shown on the drawing provided for same, can be performed in a manner that does not diminish public use of the rights-of-way, nor impede pedestrian, bicycle or vehicular traffic, nor interfere with sight triangles or sight lines; and,

WHEREAS, City officials are of the opinion that in this particular location, it would be preferable for the proposed fence to be installed along the edge of the existing sidewalks than along the property line of Lot 2, Block 3203; and,

WHEREAS, Licensees seek permission from the governing body to place their fence within the public right-of-way with the understanding that such permission will be in the form of a revocable license, that the Licensees shall be solely responsible to maintain the fence in good repair in a neat, safe and orderly fashion at Licensees' sole expense; and that they will be required to indemnify and hold the City harmless from any liability of any kind, nature or description; and will be required to provide proof that the City has been named an additional insured on the Licensees' insurance policy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of the City of Ocean City hereby authorizes the execution of a Revocable License For Fence Encroachment allowing the fence proposed to be installed by the owners of Lot 2, Block 3203 to encroach onto the City rights-of-way under the terms and conditions as set forth in the Agreement attached hereto and made a part hereof.

The Business Administrator or his designee is hereby authorized to execute the Revocable License For Fence Encroachment.

REVOCABLE LICENSE FOR FENCE ENCROACHMENT

WITNESSETH:

- A. LICENSEES are the owners of Lot 2, Block 3203, situated in the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey (hereinafter, the "Property"), and City is the owner of the 100' wide right-of-way known as West Avenue adjacent to the northwesterly side of the Property and the 60' wide right-of-way comprising 33rd Street adjacent to the southwesterly side of the Property (see Survey No. 1010009 by Design Land Surveying P.A. dated 01/20/20, attached hereto as Exhibit A).
- B. LICENSEES propose to install a fence enclosing the Property in order to enhance the safety of the yard and would like to install the fence along the adjacent edge of the existing sidewalk, rather than on the property line of the Property.
- C. LICENSEES and City desire to create a revocable encroachment license over the area between the property line of the Property and the fence to be constructed by LICENSEES, and permit LICENSEES to install a conforming, open fence along the adjacent edge of the existing sidewalk for the benefit of the Property, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth. The fence to be constructed shall conform with site triangle requirements as determined by the Ocean City Zoning Official.


LICENSEES and City agree as follows:
