CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, APRIL 9, 2020 – 7:00PM CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Mr. Madden stated the following: The meeting will be muted to the public except during the citizen comment portion. At that time we will ask for names alphabetically and once we have the list of names we will individually call upon you to give your full name, address and comment. Due to the unique nature of this meeting under today's circumstances there will be one opportunity for citizen comment at the end of the meeting.

ATTENDANCE: Mr. Barr, Ms. Bergman, Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. Wilson, Mr. Madden. Present also was Mayor Gillian, Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano and Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson.

Council President Mr. Madden called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Ms. Bergman led the prayer. Mr. Madden announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Madden asked for a motion to approve the regular city council meeting minutes of Thursday, March 12, 2020. Motion moved by Mr. Barr, seconded by Ms. Bergman. All ayes followed with the exception of Mr. Wilson who abstained.

REPORTS – MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION:

Mayor Gillian spoke about the pandemic, thanked all of the public safety and essential workers and he also talked about what Ocean City has done so far to keep everyone safe.

Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano provided a brief report on government operations.

REPORTS - CITY COUNCIL:

Mr. Wilson spoke about the tough decisions that have been made during the pandemic. He has spoken with constituents, the Governor, members of the Senate, and members of the Assembly and reported that the city has no legal authority to close roads or bridges. The city will continue to follow the guidelines including social distancing and proper hand washing.

Mr. DeVlieger said that he would like to extend his thoughts and prayers to those who have been affected by the virus and also to those who are out there working and putting themselves at risk. He spoke about the volunteer group OCNJ Care that is available to those who need assistance.

Mr. Wilson reminded everyone to check in with their elderly folks and say hello.

Mr. Madden read a quote from Douglas Arthur and encouraged everyone to work together and stay safe without being led by fear.

CITIZEN COMMENT:

<u>Donna Moore – 21 Ocean Ave</u> – thanked the Mayor and Administrator for all that they are doing and she also spoke about organic land management. She referenced Resolution No. 2 and asked that council consider adding more parcels in the organic land management plan for next year. She also asked about Resolution No. 1 and she suggested that the city use sand for the fill material so that less chemicals wash into the wetlands. Ms. Moore had a question about Resolution No. 21 and wanted to know about the location.
