# CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES THURSDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2020 – 7:00PM HOWARD STAINTON SENIOR CENTER

**ATTENDANCE:** Ms. Bergman (7:03 p.m.), Mr. DeVlieger, Mr. Hartzell, Mr. Levchuk, Mr. Madden (absent), Mr. Rotondi and Mr. Barr. Present also was Mayor Gillian, Business Administrator, Mr. Savastano and Solicitor, Ms. McCrosson.

Council President Mr. Barr called the meeting to order and asked everyone to rise for the flag salute and prayer. Mr. Hartzell then led the prayer. Mr. Barr announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

#### **REPORTS - MAYOR & ADMINISTRATION:**

Mayor Gillian reminded everyone about the town hall meeting taking place on Saturday at 10 a.m. at the Tabernacle to talk about the proposed public safety building. Also, the Mayor invited everyone to come out and support and cheer on Jared Fenstermacher, a surviving cancer patient who will end his cross country cycling trip at 4:00 p.m. Saturday in Ocean City at the Music Pier.

#### CITIZEN COMMENT:

<u>Suzanne Hornick – 30<sup>th</sup> and West</u> – said that she would like to review the agenda sooner than 48 hours in advance and she expressed concerns she has about the consent agenda items. She spoke about ACT Engineers Inc., and transparency.

<u>Nelson Dice – 12<sup>th</sup> and Central</u> – submitted 4 pages of documents to city council and administration regarding the New Jersey Code of Criminal Justice; Title 2C; Chapter 30. He spoke about the machinery of government and the oath of allegiance for municipal prosecutors.

<u>Donna Moore – 21 Ocean Ave</u> – spoke about the harmful effects of pesticides on public lands and she also referenced an article in the newspaper that talked about toxic lawn pesticides and what the city council in Philadelphia is doing to be healthier.

Mr. Barr expressed his concerns about the upcoming election and urged everyone to vote.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Mr. DeVlieger responded to Ms. Moore's comments about the harmful effects of pesticides and suggested that the city take a look at the playing fields that the kids use because the children are out most valuable asset.

Ms. Bergman wished everyone a safe and happy Halloween.

Mr. Rotondi spoke about mental health and how the suicide rates have increased since 2010 with exposure to social media. He referenced the Netflix TV series Social Dilemma and suggested that there be a meeting/discussion with officials at the freeholder level or maybe even the federal level about mental health to have a plan in place to help address the seriousness of the issue.

### CITIZEN COMMENT:

<u>Suzanne Hornick – 30<sup>th</sup> and West</u> – asked that emails that are submitted to the city clerk due to not being able to attend a council meeting because of the health risk posed by COVID-19 should be read aloud during public comment at the council meeting.

<u>Donna Moore – 21 Ocean Ave</u> – thanked city council and administration for listening to her concerns about pesticides.

Nelson Dice – 12<sup>th</sup> and Central – recited John:16 from the Bible and also read a portion of the Declaration of Independence.

<u>Dave Breeden – 114 Victoria Lane</u> – spoke on behalf of FIT and commented on his meeting that took place with the Chief of Police and the Fire Chief regarding the proposed public safety building. He thanked the Mayyor and administration for taking the time to meet and discuss the project with him.
